PROJECT PREPARATORY TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

A. Justification

1. A project preparatory technical assistance (TA) will assist the government in improving sector policies, preparing feasibility studies, and proposing a project design for a sector investment, and developing eligibility and evaluation criteria for selected subprojects.

B. Major Outputs and Activities

2. The TA will assist the government update its sector policies, prepare two to three sample subprojects for a new water supply system and an expansion of an existing system), design a sector investment project, and develop eligibility and evaluation criteria for selected subprojects based on previous projects. The TA will explore new technologies, including energy efficient pumps and/or decentralized wastewater treatment. The TA will also support consultations with various stakeholders. The TA will be implemented over 12 months, from September 2012 to August 2013. The major outputs and activities are described and summarized in Table A4.1.

C. Cost Estimate and Proposed Financing Arrangement

3. The TA is estimated to cost \$800,000 equivalent, of which \$800,000 will be financed on a grant basis by ADB's Technical Assistance Special Fund (TASF-IV). TASF financing is being requested, as stated in the Country Operations Business Plan for the Lao PDR, 2012–2015. The government will provide counterpart support in the form of counterpart staff, provision of office space, and other in-kind contributions. Detailed cost estimate is presented in Table A4.2.

D. Consulting Services

4. A firm will be engaged in accordance with ADB *Guidelines on the Use of Consultants* (2010, as amended from time to time). A total of 11 positions and 40 person-months required (6 international specialists for 18 person-months and 5 national experts for 22 person-months). The firm will be recruited using quality and cost-based selection (90:10) using simplified technical proposal.¹⁵ Individual consultants may be hired during the TA to help complete unanticipated tasks and/or provide start-up support prior to loan effectiveness. The TA will adequately address the following aspects relating to the ensuing project: (i) detailed executing agency, and implementing agency capacity to minimize procurement and financial management risks; (ii) proposed or indicative loan related procurement plan with suggested level of priority or, if applicable, post review based on executing agency and implementing agency capacity implementation schedule with proposed sequencing of consultant recruitment and procurement bidding and awarding; (iv) a draft project performance management system; and (v) administration of seminars and workshops.

5. The terms of reference are summarized in Table A4.3. The consultant team will be required to prepare the following reports: (i) inception report, 1.5 months after mobilization; (ii) interim report, 5 months after mobilization; (iii) draft final report, 7.0 months after mobilization; and (iv) final report, within 2 weeks after receipt of comments. The reports shall be of high quality and in formats agreed to in advance with ADB and the government. The team shall review previous feasibility studies prepared in the sector in Lao PDR, shall have an excellent command of the English language, shall be required to provide their inputs to the team leader for timely consolidation, shall coordinate with other team members, and may be asked to complete additional tasks as assigned by the consultant team leader and ADB project officer.

The current project coordination unit in DHUP will provide guidance during TA implementation. The government will provide in-kind contributions to the TA, including office space and counterpart staff. The TA consultants will be based in the PCU office in Vientiane. Disbursements under the TA will be done in accordance with the ADB *Technical Assistance Disbursement Handbook* (2008, as amended from time to time) and procurement in accordance with ADB's *Procurement Guidelines* (2010, as amended from time to time). Equipment procured by the TA will be will transferred to the Government (project coordination unit) at the end of the TA.
