The Inception Workshop was coordinated with AZE SCC and WCO. Country-specific Action Plans for RETA implementation were formulated. Mongolia Time Release Study (TRS) National Planning Workshop, 29 July to 1 August, 2014, Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia. The National TRS Planning Workshop was coordinated closely with WCO and Mongolia Customs. A TRS action plan was prepared and was discussed with top management of MON customs.
