Description	There is a high potential for Pacific island countries to take full advantage of information and communication technology (ICT) in addressing their unique development challenges. Their geographic isolation and associated high transport and communication costs have left most Pacific island countries economically isolated from regional and international markets. These factors also limit the provision of basic services to remote areas and outer islands. Recognizing the potential of ICT, there is growing interest among the Pacific island countries to invest in ICT infrastructure. Several fiber optic submarine cable backbones have been installed in the region and more opportunities are being explored. Regional initiatives have been created to strengthen national capacity and promote regional cooperation on ICT growth. In 2010, the Framework for Action on ICT for Development in the Pacific was formulated to guide future actions in key areas such as policy, legislation, and regulatory frameworks; human capacity building; and infrastructure and access.
