2. INTRODUCTION

The State witnessed major cloud bursts, incessant rains and major floods in the upper valleys during 15-17 June 2013 that resulted in severe damages in several parts of Uttarakhand. The districts of Bageshwar, Chamoli, Pithoragarh, Rudraprayag and Uttarkashi were directly affected by this disaster. These regions are among the country's most important pilgrimage centers and the calamity occurred during the peak pilgrimage season. Several roads and bridges have been washed away by the unprecedented flash floods and landslides and a large number of houses, public buildings, roads and bridges, urban and rural infrastructure has been damaged. The Uttarakhand Emergency Assistance Project (the project) envisages rehabilitation and reconstruction of state roads and bridges, tourism infrastructure (including construction of helipads and trekking routes), urban water supply and urban roads. The expected impact of the project will be economic and social recovery from the disaster in Uttarakhand state.

Monitoring and Reporting are critical activities in involuntary resettlement activities in order to ameliorate problem faced by DPs and develop solutions immediately. Resettlement Monitoring means the collection, analysis reporting and use of information about the progress of resettlement activities based on RP.

As an external Monitor our main objective of this monitoring report is to supervise the subproject impact and to determine whether resettlement goals have been achieved and more importantly whether livelihood and living standard have restored, enhanced and suggest suitable recommendations for improvement.

The expected impact of the project will be economic and social recovery from the disaster in Uttarakhand state. In keeping with ADB's emergency loan procedures, the Resettlement Plan (RP) were prepared in accordance with approved Resettlement Framework (RF). These RPs are identify the broad scope of the subprojects and outline the policy, procedures for acquisition of land, compensation and other assistance measures for displaced persons and institutional requirements for this subproject under the loan.

Broadly, the works comprise restoration of the road to its original shape with the clearance of slip and construction of Retaining & Breast Wall, Drains, Crash Barriers and improvement of riding surface by resurfacing through Cement Concrete and BM/SDBC. These will be constructed as per MORD/MoRT&H Specifications. The Program will improve Road connectivity and will improve the quality of life of the poor in the project influenced areas. The strengthening and rehabilitation of road will be restricted to affected alignment.

The main objective of the project is avoiding involuntary resettlement wherever possible by means of adopting an appropriate technical design, which leads to minimization of the resettlement impact. In keeping with this objective, the technical design aims at minimization of the resettlement impact by means of best utilization of the available space by avoiding private and public assets and land acquisition as far as possible. For the purpose of RP preparation and to identify the land acquisition and resettlement impacts, census survey and consultations with the DPs were carried out in the Month of May –June 2014 for all sites/alignment of proposed sub-project components. These were conducted with the help of pre-designed tool and as per the final alignments given in the detailed project reports (DPRs), for estimating the

resettlement impact in these subprojects which are classified as Category B and Category C (Details in Annexure – 1). Based on the preliminary technical design and census survey for the sub projects, neither land acquisition nor any permanent impact was envisaged and during re-construction/ upgrading of the road only impact temporary in nature such as loss of income sources and means of livelihoods for the period of construction to 74movable Vendors/squatters was estimated.

3. VERIFICATION/ VALIDATION

It is been Verified and validated that out of 69 packages consisting of 87 roads, only 09 sub projects have been identified as having resettlement impact. In these packages there are no Indigenous People (IP), no land acquisition issues, and all impacts are temporary in nature. The livelihood of the people will be affected only during the construction activity for which they will be compensated as per the ADB guidelines and Entitlement Matrix.

The validation process was undertaken first by DSC's Resettlement Specialists in August-September, 2014 and then in April-June, 2015 the Implementing NGO engaged for the purpose of implementation of RPs carried out a detailed validation and identification of DPs vis-à-vis list of DPs identified and enlisted in the RPs. The verification survey of the affected persons was conducted with the help of:

- DPR drawings of all the reference towns
- RPs of all reference towns
- Actual site inspection accompanied by concerned PWD officials of UEAP, and DSC's team leader also was present in some of the towns where designs had undergone changes.

While verifying temporary resettlement impact in some packages changes in the number of affected persons were identified. However, no permanent impacts on structures, property were apprehended in any of these towns. Impacts are confined to squatters, vendors, and small shops on RoW in market areas. The majority of the small shopkeepers/fruit and vegetable vendors will have temporary impact on their livelihood during reconstruction of roads.

Summary of resettlement impact assessment shown in RP and verified are shown in table 1.

4. Impact Assessment Progress and RP Implementation

The Main task of RP implementation which is executed by EA with the help of NGO, is are as follows-

- Appointment and Mobilization of NGO.
- Identification and Verification of DPs and Common Property Resources.
- Translation and Distribution of RP in local Language.
- Consultation with DPs.
- Preparation of Micro-Plan
- The status of Land Acquisition process and declaration of award to affected families.
- Preparation and Distribution of ID Cards.
- Distribution of Compensation and assistance.
- Income restoration livelihood rehabilitation program.
- Grievance Redressal
- Appraisal of other R&R issues.
- Assessment of implementing agency.

In all of the 69 Packages that have been approved by ten subsequent High Power Committee (HPC) meetings there were only temporary Involuntary Resettlement (IR) impacts identified during impact assessment stage and later were verified during implementation. Moreover, during both of these surveys no permanent impacts on permanent structures, property was anticipated. Impacts are confined to squatters, vendors, and small shops on RoW in market/congested areas. The majorities of the small shopkeepers/vendors earn their livelihood by selling fruits, vegetables and other petty daily commodities and are mostly daily wage earners.

The Resettlement Plans were prepared to deal with impacts of land acquisition and resettlement issues resulting from the rehabilitation of the said road packages. The Plan provides an analysis of the impacts, identifies the nature and types of losses, and establishes an entitlement matrix as a guide to payments for compensation and resettlement benefits.

The Project has its objectives of avoiding involuntary resettlement wherever possible, by means of adopting an appropriate technical design, which leads to minimization of the resettlement impact. In keeping with this objective, the technical design aims at minimization of the resettlement impact by means of best utilization of the available space by avoiding private and public assets and land acquisition as far as possible. The social assessment was undertaken in April- May 2014. On this basis, the resettlement impact in these subprojects are classified as Category B and Category C. Based on the preliminary technical design

and census survey, no land acquisition is envisaged. As land belongs to the state PWD and the work only involves restoration of the washed away stretches within the existing ROW. During re-construction of the road loss of income sources and means of livelihoods to 74 movable Vendors and/or squatters may occur in nine packages.

Detailed verification and identification of DPs vis-à-vis DPR design drawing

Before start of civil work the Implementing NGO conducted a final identification and verification survey updating resettlement impact in all the subprojects with the help of final and updated DPR drawings to record affected persons, nature of impact, distinguish type of loss and, identify vulnerable households. This task required for determining final resettlement impact and compensation and assistance payable as per Entitlement Matrix (EM) provided in the Resettlement Framework (**Annexure-1**).

The Resettlement Plan was prepared in the month of April/May 2014 and the verification for updating the same took place from the month of April -May 2015 by the NGO, thus there were some change in the number of the displaced or affected persons. During the verification by the Social & Resettlement Expert of DSC and the NGO identified very few changes, which are confined to the duration of impact and/or number of affected structures are being observed a detail comparison of which is from the Resettlement Plan is depicted in Table 1 for ready reference and comparison. As in all the sub-projects till now there are only temporary impacts. Thus neither any structures is damaged or dislocated nor are any persons displaced permanently.

The census and socio-economic survey reveals a total of 74 households will be affected. All these 74 non-titleholders households, are roadside (movable) vendors and Kiosks who have encroached on the RoW. Among the total affected people, 37 are vulnerable (SCs,STs and WHH). Among these 37 Vulnerable DPs,33 are from SC and 5 are from ST category, 3are women headed DPs and are also Scheduled tribes and 01 is from SC category. To further minimize the temporary impacts and inconvenience to the adjoining establishments due to reconstruction of roads, IA/Contractor will be advised to undertake the work during early hours of the day/less rush hours and in night in the habitation area.

5. Institutional Arrangement

State Disaster Management Authority, Govt. of Uttarakhand is the Executing Agency (EA) of the UEAP while PIU R&B (UEAP) is the Project Implementing Agency (IA). The EA has already set up a state-level Program Management Unit (PMU) headed by Programme Director. The PMU has appointed a qualified and experienced Social & Community Development and Gender Specialist (SCDGS) to supervise, facilitate, and monitor resettlement activities, gender action plan and also to coordinate with DSC team engaged in RP

implementation. The SCDGS will guide the implementing NGO in carrying out RP as per principles laid down in the Resettlement Framework.

Centre for Rural and Ecological Development, (CREDA) the NGO has been mobilized in April, 2015 for implementation of RP. As per scope of work, the NGO will act as a link between the DPs, UEAP, District Administration and other stakeholders. The RP implementation activities undertaken by the NGO are incorporated in this semi -annual progress report of the period January-June, 2015.

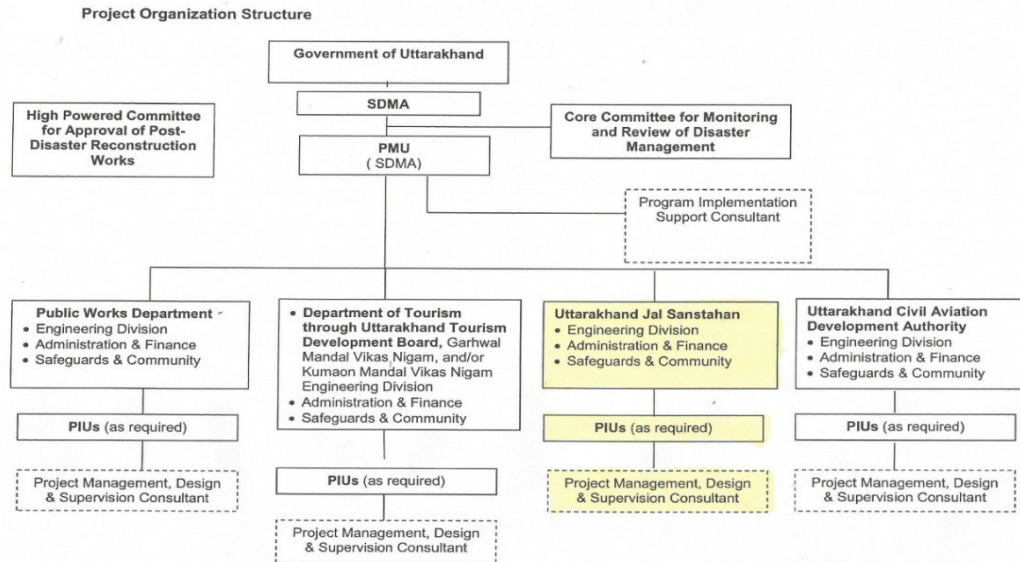
All the three DSC has mobilized Resettlement Specialists, on intermittent basis, since August, 2014 to periodically supervise and monitor RP implementation activities, provide guidance to DSC’s site engineers for construction supervision and prepare quarterly and half yearly social monitoring reports. If there is any change in design the Resettlement Expert will prepare updated RP and Due Diligence report where necessary. In all these activities DSC will work in close coordination with PMU, PIU, and NGO to resolve any issue pertaining to resettlement impact, in the likely event of changed design in alignment.

DSCs have mobilized Resettlement Specialists on intermittent basis since inception, except DSC 3 (Eurostudios JV Theme Engineering has mobilized services of Social Expert in the month of June 2015) to periodically supervise and monitor RP implementation activities (Table 3), provide guidance to DSC’s site engineers for construction supervision and prepare quarterly implementation and monitoring reports. In all these activities DSC will work in close coordination with PIU and NGO to resolve any issue pertaining to resettlement impact and also monitoring of social compliances at site.

Project organizational structure is appended to show all personnel/organizations involved in resettlement implementation. Besides, one field unit structure for all the positions of DSC has been proposed which will provide support, if necessary, for execution of RP activities at ground during construction phase.



6. Resettlement activities undertaken by Implementing NGO

The newly mobilized implementing NGO has started their identification and verification of DPs enlisted in the RPs as their priority activity. The NGO has established rapport with the DPs and started disseminating information on resettlement impact, entitlement packages as per ADB policy and other project information to the DPs as part of disclosure measure.

The quarterly report submitted by the implementing NGO also includes a socio economic profile of the DPs surveyed by the team. It contains economic status, educational achievement, social category and vulnerability status of the DPs. However, the report contains socioeconomic information of the DPs for both the Roads and Bridges and Water supply sectors together. It would be better to get a sector wise disaggregated profile of the DPs.

Scope of Work of Implementing NGO

- Verification and computerization of data base of DPs;
- Develop rapport with DPs;
- Updating data base of DPs for missing and additional DPs, if identified;
- Documentation of structures and properties affected;
- Listing and measurement of structures affected,
- Valuation of affected structures, land under acquisition, common property resources (CPRs), trees and other private properties; if affected.
- Preparation of micro plan for eligible THs and NTHs;
- Preparation and distribution of Identity Cards;

- Consultations with DPs to disseminate information and create awareness about RAP implementation;
- Inform and educate DPs about entitlements, grievance mechanism, alternate livelihood options under the RP; if required
- Training and assisting the DPs to establish linkages with government programmes;
- Disbursement of R&R assistance;
- Assess requirement of relocation site for DPs;
- Identify relocation site in consultation with DPs, PIU and co-ordinate with Revenue Department for the status of relocation site and finalization; if required
- Facilitate and establish good rapport between the PIU and DPs;
- Assist SCDGO conducting public information consultations; if required
- Conduct village level meetings and progress reporting to PRIs;
- Reporting the Status of DPs after shifting;
- Conduct HIV/AIDS and road safety awareness at suitable locations along the project corridor and to the children of schools and community; and
- Liaison with State AIDS Control Society (SACO) for conducting awareness about HIV/AIDS;
- Liaison with State Women and Child Development department and other related department including the police for conducting awareness about child labour and human trafficking related issues;
- Display hoardings at suitable locations related to HIV/AIDS;

In accordance with the principles of Resettlement Framework, the implementing NGO will verify the extent of impacts through a 100% survey of affected persons, determine assistance, verify and identify vulnerable households. All these activities will be completed before start of civil works. Resettlement impacts will be compensated in accordance with the entitlement matrix of the agreed Resettlement Framework. The NGO will prepare Micro Plans for each of the DPs based on the survey data and the policy outlined in the Resettlement Framework.

The Micro Plan will include but not limited to following information: details of family, type and extent of loss, average household income, vulnerability status, and other details which will be recorded prior to payment disbursement. Besides, photo identity cards will also be prepared for the eligible DPs who are entitled for resettlement assistances. These will be countersigned by the PIU official of respective subproject and will be shown at the time of disbursement.

7. GRIEVANCE REDRESS MECHANISM

The project (UEAP), funded by Asian Development Bank has established Centralized GRC for all Sectors at PMU Level and in five worst affected districts (Rudraprayag, Uttarkashi, Chamoli, Bageshwar and Pithoragarh) out of 13 districts of Uttarakhand. The DDMOs have been deputed in all the 13 districts as Nodal officers for Grievance Redress Mechanism, a dedicated toll free phone number for the grievances and complaints from any stakeholders or individuals. There is a well organized grievance Redressal mechanism. The toll free number is **0135-2708376** and email address is grievancepmu@gmail.com.

The project has a designated Grievance Officer in each district of the state. The PIU with the sub PIU also act as an instrument for receiving the grievances at grass root level.

As the project till now does not have any permanent impact for both physical and economical there is very little scope of grievance among the residents of the Project Impact Area. There are some temporary impacts on the livelihood of some movable vendors and/or squatters. Till now no grievances has been received from the DPs of the Project Impact Area.

8. CAPACITY BUILDING

Uttarakhand Emergency Assistance Project has appoint an exclusive support agency, social consultant, NGO for community awareness including implementation of Resettlement Plan (RP), and implementation of gender action plan (GAP) for UEAP. The appointed consultant and NGO had undertaken Community Awareness and Participation campaign with active support from PMU. The support organizations are working as an interface between displaced persons (DPs), General community, PIUs, Program Officials and Design Supervision Consultants.

The following jobs are undertaken by the implementing NGO and DSCs.

- Providing information, education and communication (IEC) campaigns in the project areas to inform about the project and proposed measures.
- Educating DPs regarding their likely losses due to the project, their entitlements as per the Resettlement Plan policy and the obligations of UEAP under the RP.
- Ensuring that DPs get the compensation for the loss of their land and other assets at the prevailing market value.
- Ensuring that DPs receive their full entitlements as per the RP and use them for economically productive activities. Where options are available, the NGO shall provide advice to DPs on the relative benefits of each option.
- Ensuring **social aspects** such as compliance with the labour laws, prohibition of child labour, HIV/AIDS and gender issues.
- Assist APs in **Redressal of their grievances**; inform them about the structure and functioning of GRCs.
- The perceived outcomes that may be reached are as follows:

- Increase in community awareness about project goals and their increased participation.
- Increased sense of ownership for services and facilities created and their proper use and management.
- Better health and hygiene conditions due to increased knowledge base.
- The DSC agencies/Social consultant/NGO are also participating in planning and delivering of gender mainstreaming activities of the project, and providing overall support in the implementation of Gender Action Plan (GAP), provide continuous dialogue, guidance, and supervision to the project team at PMU/EA and IAs for gender mainstreaming and assist them in regular implementation, monitoring and reporting of GAP activities. The following activities of the GAP are to undertaken.
- Assist in compliance of the gender action plan (GAP) for Uttarakhand Emergency Assistance Project, specific activities with respect to GAP for individual sub-projects.
- Assist in preparation of implementation schedule for gender action plan with quarter-wise indication of implementation of GAP activities.
- Assist PMU in monitoring GAP implementation progress on regular basis with field visits and quarterly reporting of progress and results.

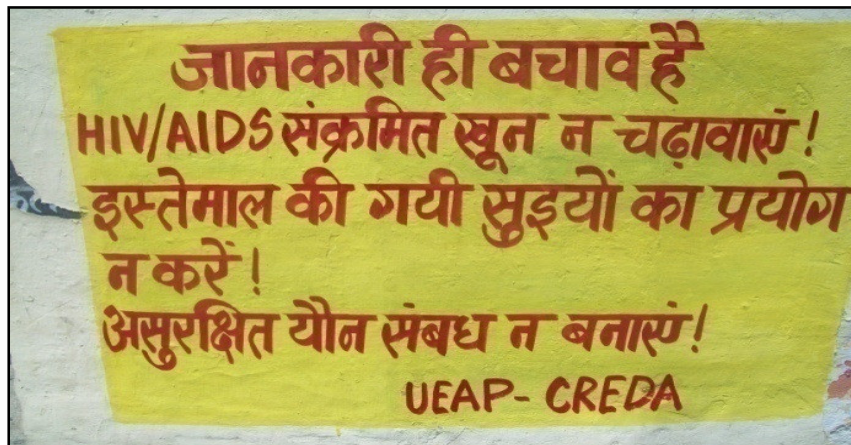

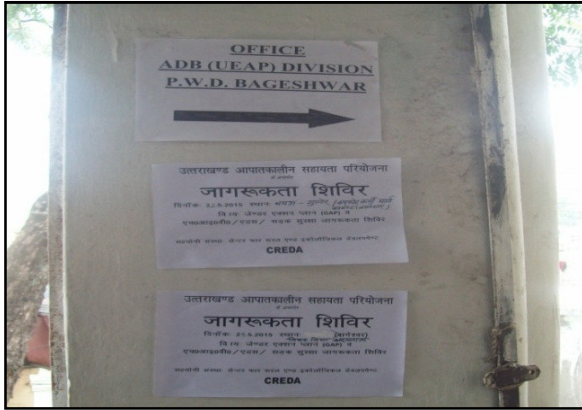
