The proposed TA will support conducting training needs assessment to assess judicial knowledge and skills gap; providing Training of Trainers program for selected Mongolian judges; and developing curriculum and training materials on economic crimes by the trained judges for sustainable training after TA completion.

Status of Implementation Progress (Outputs, Activities, and Issues)	Inception mission was fielded in September 2016 to discuss and agree on detailed implementation plan, including composition and selection criteria of training of trainers (TOT) participant, a follow-up training workshop for handbook development, and main training for Mongolian criminal court judges. TOT has been organized from 20-20 March with 20 judges and 5 prosecutors and 5 attorneys. 12 judges will be selected as trainers based on the performance and produce training hand book. The main training is scheduled to conducted in second week of November 2017.
