Implementation Arrangements

The Ministry of Finance and Economic Management will be the executing agency. The implementing agency will be the MOET. A PMU for the final design and implementation of the project, will be established within the Facilities Unit at MOET to oversight day to day implementation and progress of the project. The PMU will comprise government counterpart staff, a project accountant and DSCs. The DSC will ensure that one member of the project team has gender expertise to oversee GAP implementation. The DSC will be responsible for ensuring the implementation of gender features in all relevant project outputs; consulting with female beneficiaries and stakeholders; monitoring and reporting on GAP implementation progress; and coordinating with the MOET Gender Focal Point to ensure alignment with the Gender Equity in Education Policy. The PMU will include reporting on progress of GAP activities in regular progress reports on overall project activities to the ADB and the Government. Output 2 will be primarily implemented by local NGOs or other appropriate agencies, who may also be hired to implement different GAP activities, and other community awareness workshops under the guidance of the PMU.
