Status of Implementation Progress (Outputs, Activities, and Issues)

A national (Technical Assistance Coordination) consultant and an international (Gender and Development) consultant were mobilized on 19 January 2016 and 1 April 2016 respectively. The national consultant based in HQ is supporting activities under output 1, particularly the review of Mid-Term Reviews (MTRs) and Project Completion Reports (PCRs) gender related documents (Aide Memoire, GAP implementation matrix, and gender appendix to PCR) and GAP implementation progress reports (regular reports/regular project review missions). The national consultant is also assisting on the maintenance of GAP implementation database that includes at present 119 ongoing gender mainstreamed (GEN/EGM) projects, and is updating the database on a regular basis. Updated versions of the database broken down by country have been shared in Q4 of 2016 and Q1 of 2017. The international consultant supports one specific activity under output 2, more particularly the preparation of 10 feature stories showcasing DMCs achievements in promoting gender equality and women's empowerment in Southeast Asia. A first draft of these feature stories has been prepared and is currently being reviewed.

Additional funding was approved to allow engagement of additional national gender consultants particularly to support output 1, particularly for Myanmar, Philippines and Indonesia and to support additional small-scale studies/research. The gender consultant for Myanmar was mobilized in February 2017 while engagement of the consultants for Philippines and Indonesia are ongoing. Implementation of other activities such as the in-country workshops under output 1 and development of gender-based knowledge products under output 2 are in the planning stage, and expected to take place in 2017.
