Project Rationale and Linkage to Country/Regional Strategy	The PRC has been experiencing rapid demographic and social change as a result of econor over the last three decades. The shift from a centrally-planned to market-based economy to rapid economic and social development with gross domestic product (GDP) growth aver nearly 10% every year, and pulling nearly 800 million people out of poverty. This rapid growth however, brought with it a set of challenges and new vulnerabilities, including increased in pockets of persistent poverty, and changing family structures driven in part by rapid urbar internal migration, and industrialization. One vulnerability due to economic growth, partice PRC, is as consequence of rural-urban migration and the hukou system, of children who are in rural areas by parents in search of better employment opportunities. Despite significant their numbers over the past few years, this is still a substantial number of children. Unbalanced economic growth has created a group of children who are vulnerable due to p disability, special needs, or failing parental care. In the PRC Thirteenth Five-Year Plan, the outlined plans to promote better care and protection for vulnerable children _living in difficis defined as children left behind by parents, those living in poverty, those living with disal orphans, and children without parental care. Most recently, in 2016, PRC State Council Orc Opinions on Strengthening the Guarantee for Destitute Children which outlined the need for the help rehabilitate and improve the lives of vulnerable children.
