ADB has undertaken due diligence and reviewed the potential environmental and social impacts of the project and the measures to avoid, minimize, mitigate, and compensate for the adverse impacts in the safeguard reports and plans. The environmental and social measures and the institutional capacity and commitment of SAL to manage the project's social and environmental impacts are deemed adequate. Key environment safeguard issues during construction include solid and liquid waste disposal, noise and vibration, and occupational health and safety. During operation, relevant areas of concern include air emissions, wastewater discharge, solid waste disposal, workers' health and safety, food quality assurance, and resource efficiency and conservation. An external expert prepared an initial environmental examination, which includes an environmental and social management and monitoring plan. The external expert conducted an environmental and social compliance audit, with a corresponding corrective action plan, for the potato chips component. SAL has established a grievance redress mechanism to handle project-related grievances. SAL's institutional capacity and commitment to manage the project's social and environmental impacts are deemed adequate.
