| Project Rationale and Linkage to<br>Country/Regional Strategy | Sri Lanka needs to maintain the growth momentum to advance its status as an upper middle-income country. The country faces many challenges as it approaches UMIC, with regard to sustaining economic growth and quality of growth. These challenges include a narrow export base, low productivity in agriculture, low female participation in the labor force, and an ageing population. To address these challenges, policies need to be pursued that facilitate manufacturing and export diversification, increase productivity, enable Sri Lankan firms to become part of global supply chains, create productive jobs, and establish efficient social protection networks. With limited fiscal space, the government expects the private sector to drive the transformation of the economy. However, private sector investment has remained constrained because the business environment has not been conducive and the public sector has played a dominant role in the past. Policies to improve investment climate, complemented by upgrades in the quality of infrastructure and human resources, need urgent attention to catalyze domestic investment and attract foreign direct investment (FDI). Projects that address infrastructure and resource gaps need to be identified and their implementation prioritized. |  |                          |

## **Business Opportunities**

Consulting Services Consultancy services will be used to conduct the studies identified at the time of processing the TA and other studies that maybe identified during implementation. Three international consultants will be engaged to carry out studies in the following areas; (i) private sector participation in industrial parks, (ii) social protection, focusing on pensions and ageing population and (iii) macroeconomic modelling. Three national consultants will be recruited to conduct the following studies; (i) developing agriculture value chains, (ii) private sector participation in industrial parks and (iii) macroeconomic modelling. The consultants will be selected individually through a competitive process and recruited under lumpsum, output-based, and input-based contracts. Individual consultants will be used, rather than recruiting a firm as the required expertise are diverse and it will be difficult to find all the required experts in one firm. However, individuals maybe recruited through firms where necessary. ADB will engage the consultants following the ADB Procurement Policy (2017, as amended from time to time) and its associated project administration instructions and/or staff instructions.
