Description	The proposed project will establish a National Single Window (NSW) in Maldives. The NSW will provide an efficient environment for streamlined international trade procedures between private sector stakeholders and border control agencies. The NSW will leverage information and communication technology to provide online access to carry out border control procedures. This will enable traders and other service providers to exchange electronic forms and documents, thereby eliminating the need for physical displacement. In addition, automated processing across stakeholder systems will be enabled by the exchange of harmonized data. The NSW environment will thus provide for a much more efficient set of standardized and transparent international trade procedures, enhanced border control, and more readily available data on trade flows.		
Project Rationale and Linkage to Country/Regional Strategy	The proposed NSW system is designed to interface with existing stakeholder systems and will address the key bottlenecks to international trade procedures at both the Male seaport and airport. It will support coordinated border management as the NSW system integrates the control requirements of government agencies from the initial application for permits through the processes of coordinated inspection and integrated release. The implementation will be phased to align with the changes in procedures and systems from the border control agencies. These will result in the reduction in time and cost of international trade.  The reduction in time and cost to import will allow the public to avail cheaper food, fuel, and capital goods through the reduction of transaction cost maximum by 25%. This will result in reduced living costs for households. Enterprises will benefit from lower input and transaction costs for exports, which will enhance the competitiveness of their products.
