Description	To address the core problem of disrupted income, livelihoods and education in Marawi and surrounding areas, the project proposes three solutions: (i) emergency employment provided; (ii) sustainable livelihoods restored; and (iii) conflict-sensitive education initiatives supported.
Project Rationale and Linkage to Country/Regional Strategy	Maute Group, the Abu Sayyaf Group, and foreign jihadists occupied the Islamic City of Marawi in the province of Lanao del Sur. Government security forces responded, and the ensuing armed conflict with heavy artillery fire and air bombing continued for 5 months. The conflict destroyed infrastructure and resulted in the displacement of an estimated 350,000 people. The government estimates the damage to and loss of property and infrastructure at about 18.1 billion. The government has coordinated with its departments and agencies to conduct a needs assessment and develop the Comprehensive Rehabilitation and Recovery Program, which comprises the varied needs to support Marawi and surrounding affected areas. The Asian Development Bank is preparing a package of coordinated loan and grant assistance to support the government's efforts to accelerate economic recovery in the aftermath of the violent conflict. This proposed grant addresses needs identified in the Comprehensive Rehabilitation and Recovery Program by the Department of Labor and Employment and Department of Education. It will complement infrastructure investments by promoting poverty reduction and social inclusion through support for (i) short-term emergency employment and longer-term livelihood development for working-age men and women, and (ii) support for culturally appropriate, conflict-sensitive learning opportunities and psycho-social support for boys and girls.
