Description	The proposed cluster knowledge and support technical assistance (C-KSTA) will support a strategic mix of evaluations over the medium term. IED draws on resources from both its annual administrative budget and knowledge and support technical assistance (KSTA) resources to delive its work program of evaluations and knowledge work. By combining these resources, IED can plan and deliver timely, relevant, and high-qualit evaluations and knowledge activities. This C- KSTA for 2020-2024 follows an earlier cluster TA approved for IED in 2016 to support corporate, thematic, country, and sector evaluations and validations and related knowledge and outreach activities. Like the first one, this proposed cluster TA will support the delivery of a mix of evaluations and validations, including some complementary knowledge and outreach activities. The C KSTA will be divided into three subprojects. Subproject 1 will support the delivery of evaluations to be mobilized in 2020 and completed through 2022, as set out in the IED Work Program 2021-2022. Subproject 2 is structured along the same lines and will support the delivery of evaluations in 2022 2023, based on the next three-year work program for 2022 2023. Subproject 3 will support the delivery of evaluations in 2022 2023, based on the next three-year work program for 2022 2023. Subproject 3 will support the delivery of evaluations in 2023 2024, based on the work program cycle for 2023 2024.		
Project Rationale and Linkage to Country/Regional Strategy	 Evaluation is a central component of corporate governance in multilateral development banks. In the Asian Development Bank (ADB), the Independent Evaluation Department (IED) plays a critical role in supporting ADB deliver on its mandate by continually and objectively assessin its operations, policies, performance, and results. The independent evaluation function serves the unique and singular purpose of helping the Board of Directors, Management, and member countries determine whether resources have been well spent and planned outcomes have been achieved. This improves planning, design, and implementation of future ADB policies and operations and facilitates learning, accountability, an resource allocation. Independent evaluation aims to help improve the development effectiveness of ADB and countries in the Asia and Pacific region. Through evaluation, IED aims to help ADB and member countries achieve better development results. In line with Strategy 2030, evaluation intends to shed light on some critical issues and challenges facing the region, including strengthening resilience, tackling climate change and environmental degradation, sustaining inclusive growth and poverty reduction, and boosting private sector development. Evaluations combined with knowledge, outreach, and partnerships increase impact. In addition to the core business of conducting evaluations, IED has a knowledge management role. To raise the impacts of its evaluations, it conducts outreach, learning, and capacity development activities both within ADB and in member countries. It also actively engages with a wide range of partners on issues and initiatives of common interest. HED operates in line with internationally accepted principles. IED follows good practice standards for evaluation of development assistance and is guided by the principles of impartiality and independence, credibility, usefulness, and partnership.
