Description	Preparing and Implementing a Road Sector Development Strategy is a knowledge and support technical assistance (KSTA) that will help Uzbekistan's ongoing efforts to improve service delivery in transport and sustain the country's development momentum. The KSTA will provide advisory support to guide road sector governance reforms which will help strengthen professional government services, improv the countryfs road network, and make infrastructure assets more sustainable. These goals are aligned with the Asian Development Bani (ADB) Strategy 2030. The Technical Assistance (TA) is included in Central and West Asia Department 2020 TA commitment program.	
Project Rationale and Linka Country/Regional Strategy	Uzbekistan's trade competitiveness is impeded by high cost of transport. The underlying causes include the country's location being landlocked in the heart of Central Asia, deteriorating road infrastructure, and cumbersome logistics processes. These constraints combine to place Uzbekistan at rank 99 of the 2018 Logistics Performance Index out of 160 ranked countries. The Logistics Performance Index comprises several indicators. The low ranking for international shipments (rank 120) is attributable mainly to Uzbekistan's landlocked location and logistics facilities and processes, rather than infrastructure. In fact, Uzbekistan has improved its ranking for quality of infrastructure from rank 99 in 2016 to currently rank 77. There are indications, however, that this trend is reversing.  Strong economic growth and a concomitant surge in traffic have revealed the need to improve and expand the road network. Uzbekistan needs a prioritized road investment program along with a realistic financing plan. While a resource envelop has yet to be determined, government funds and financing from development partners will unlikely match future financing needs. The Government will therefore explore the potential of private sector involvement in road financing. To this end, public-private partnerships (PPP) will be introduced. Roa projects that meet PPP standards will be identified as part of the overall road investment and financing program.
