Description	COVID-19 has severe adverse health, social, and economic impact on Maldives. As of 28 April 2020, Maldives has 250 confirmed cases, with 17 recoveries and 0 deaths. While the first confirmed case was recorded on 7 March 2020, it saw a sudden spike since 14 April 2020, with confirmed cases doubling on 19 April 2020 and subsequently every 4 days until recently. The first local transmission was confirmed on 15 April 2020, which i alarming as Maldives might not be prepared if the communal spread of COVID cases escalate. Maldives faces serious challenge in terms of healthc facilities available in the country if the spike in number of cases continues and community spread intensifies. Apart from the ongoing health risk, Maldives faces the risk of severe economic downturn through decline in travel and tourism industry and disruption in domestic activities. ADB estimates that, in 2020, Maldives' gross domestic product (GDP) is expected to be negatively affected in the range of 8.2% to 17.2%. Similarly, the International Monetary Fund anticipates an -8.1% GDP growth rate in 2020, while the Maldivian government forecasts 2020 GDP growth in the rang of -7.7% and -11.5% depending on the severity of the crisis.
