A. Links to the National Poverty Reduction Strategy and Country Partnership Strategy The proposed project is a \$10 million Asian Development Bank (ADB) loan to Pran Dairy Ltd. (PDL) that will be used to finance PDL's working capital requirements and emergency response operating expenses. The project is aligned with ADB's support to developing member countries and private sector companies' recovery from the corona virus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. The project is also consistent with ADB Strategy 2030's operational goal of scaling up private sector development and private sector operations. ^a

C. Poverty and Social Analysis 1. Key issues and potential beneficiaries. Aside from threat to public health and safety, Bangladesh's economy is significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. A decline in national and global demand for manufactured goods, risks of unemployment and deepened poverty are expected. The national shutdown impacts on private consumption. With continued production, the proposed emergency loan will help preserve farmers' and employee's livelihoods and ensure stable milk and milk product supply. Primary beneficiary of the project will be the dairy farmers supplying raw milk to PDL and PDL employees of which at least 6,000 are plant workers.				
 Impact channels and expected systemic changes. The project will provide funding to PDL for continuous production of milk and milk products sourced from local dairy farmers and ensure continued employment to its workers. About 75% of the population in Bangladesh and 85% of the poor live in rural areas. Almost half the labor force (47.5%) makes its living from agriculture and women account for a significant proportion of the agriculture labor force: 34% in 2005–2006. ^b Small-scale dairy farming in Bangladesh is considered one of the best ways for rural women to utilize their limited resources for economic and social empowerment. It is argued that in the course of small-scale dairy farming, rural women have the potential to increase their nutrition and household decision-making power, their self-esteem and self-respect, expand their social circles, and contribute to the transformation of traditional socio-cultural norms. ^c A UN Policy Brief on the impact of COVID-19 ^d outlines that the impacts of the COVID-19 crisis are made worse for women and girls simply by virtue of their sex. Compounded economic impacts are felt by women and girls who are generally earning less, saving less, and holding insecure jobs or living close to poverty. A quarter of all PDL staff are women with the majority in production and processing and a small proportion found in senior management, administration, and the field workforce.

Yes No The project has the potential to contribute to the promotion of gender equity and/or empowerment through the following measures: (i) maintaining the number of women factory workers and women contract farmers supplying PDL; (ii) developing a mentorship program for women staff to support their move into more senior management roles; (iii) annual training by a third-party expert for PDL's anti-sexual harassment committee on effective implementation of its anti-sexual harassment policy to ensure development of an effective reporting mechanism, investigative procedure and redress mechanism; (iv) tripling the proportion of female farmers trained by PRAN's academy; and (v) donating dairy products to a women's organization each month during the COVID-19 crisis which benefits at least 500 women and their families. 3.
