Description	The project will help sustain the livelihood of smallholder farmers impacted by COVID-19 in Indonesia, Viet Nam, and PNG by providing working capital financing to Olam International Limited (OIL) and Olam Treasury Private Limited (OTPL) to increase its raw material procurement from these farmers.	
Objectives and Scope	The project will support smallholder farmers that OIL and its subsidiaries (Olam) directly sources from across the project countries. Disruptions to agricultural supply chains caused by the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic have impacted smallholder farmers as local markets close down and smaller traders cease buying. The COVID-19 impact on livelihoods of female farmers are disproportionately harsh given their limited access to land, credit, and inputs. In this context, Olam role as a sustainable buyer of agricultural products at scale will provide timely support to smallholder farmers livelihoods, in particular for female farmers.	
Linkage to Country/Regional Strategy	The project is aligned with ADB Strategy 2030, which calls for ADB to scale up its financing for agribusiness and promote gender equality in at least 75% of the number of ADB committed operations by 2030. The project is also aligned with Operational Plan for Private Sector Operations 2019 to 2024 which calls for working with Tier-1 agribusiness companies because of their potential to have widespread impact including as partners in TA. It is consistent with ADB country partnership strategies for Viet Nam, Indonesia, and PNG. The project is consistent with the Strategy 2030 Operational Plan for Priority 1 (OP1) by preserving the livelihoods of smallholder farmers during COVID-19, Operational Plan for Priority 2 (OP2) to protect women workers and farmers and Operational Plan for Priority 5 (OP5) which calls for (i) modern, sustainable, and responsible corporate farming models; (ii) the integration of farmers, agribusinesses, and consumers into efficient and sustainable value chains; and (iii) promote food security and increase agricultural productivity to provide sufficient, safe, and affordable food to the poor. As a regional project benefiting three DMCs, the project is consistent with Operational Plan for Priority 7 (OP7) as it supports nonsovereign lending for cross-border operations for agriculture value chains. The project is also part of ADB Comprehensive Response to COVID-19 Pandemic which proposed \$20 billion to address the needs of ADB developing member countries as they respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.
