Project Rationale and Linkage to Country/Regional Strategy	For Indonesia to achieve a growth rate of about 7%-8%, which is required to achieve high-income status by 2045 , labor productivity, as one of the key drivers of long-run growth, will need to increase from its current levels. Human capital development, combined with other long-run drivers of growth such as technology and innovation, is a critical determinant of labor productivity growth.
