Description	The coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic is causing significant health, social, and economic impacts on Mongolia. The project will help the country respond to the ongoing outbreak of COVID-19 by providing resources and training support that will help strengthen its capacity for (i) conducting reverse transcription polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR) tests, (ii) administering COVID-19 vaccines to target populations in compliance with infection prevention and control (IPC) protocols, (iii) ensuring the complete uptake of immunization services by target groups, and (iv) undertaking post-immunization surveillance. The project is closely linked to the Support for COVID-19 Vaccine Delivery in Mongolia unde the Asia Pacific Vaccine Access Facility which will provide safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines in Mongolia. The project has strong pro-poor and socially inclusive features.
