Citizen engagement thus includes working with ADBs DMCs to include citizens participation throughout the project cycle to assess priorities for interventions, improve design and implementation, contribute to monitoring and evaluation, and identify early stage concerns. By actively engaging individuals and working with communities, ADB can make projects and programs more relevant, enhance overall effectiveness, generate cost efficiencies, and increases project sustainability.
