PROJECT PREPARATORY TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

A. Justification

1. The PPTA will (i) support the government to set strategic directions and to design the investment project in a participatory manner, (ii) develop technical and financial partnership with development partners and selected institutes overseas, (iii) undertake thorough due diligence including development of appropriate implementation support, and (iv) ensure project readiness.

B. Major Outputs and Activities

- 2. The main outputs will include (i) an analysis of higher engineering sector; (ii) design of overall and specific policy and regulatory framework; (iii) appropriate strategic road mapping for developing WCHEEI in engineering; (iv) detailed project design with reflection of analysis, recommendations, and agreement with the stakeholders including overseas institutions; and (v) due diligence reports required by ADB.
- 3. The major outputs and activities are summarized in Table A3.1.

- 6. Consultants will be engaged by ADB in accordance with the *Guidelines on the Use of Consultants* (2013, as amended from time to time). All the consultants will be individually recruited. The outline terms of reference for the PPTA consultants are described in paras. 7–15.
- 7. **Higher engineering education specialists** (international, 7 person-months and national, 10 person-months, intermittent). The specialists will have more than 20 years of experience in developing HEE. Strong communications and team management skills are required. He or she will be an expert, with experience in administration and management of engineering education. He or she will work and collaborate closely with the individual consultants under the TA and will be responsible for ensuring effective coordination and delivery of TA consultant team deliverables.
- 8. **University governance specialists** (international, 2 person-months and national, 7 person-months, intermittent). The specialists will have more than 10 years of hands-on experience in administration of HEE. Their main task will include (i) design specific autonomous governance arrangements for the WCHEEI; (ii) development of strategic and sustainable financing plan of the WCHEEI (e.g., public financing, student tuition, student financial assistance, and research); and (iii) propose cost-recovery mechanism and recovery ratios in a phased manner (through tuition, revenues from research projects, etc.).
- 9. **Economics, finance, and costing specialists** (international, 2 person-months and national, 4 person-months). The specialists will have experience of economic and financial analysis of education sector projects as well as project costing. Experiences in ADB and World Bank projects are preferred. Their main task will include (i) conducting a detailed economic and financial analysis of the project, and (ii) preparing cost estimates of the project with detailed cost tables.
- 10. **Procurement specialist** (national, 2.5 person-months, intermittent). The consultant will have at least 15 years of experience in public procurement and projects funded by development partners. The consultant will conduct a procurement capacity assessment of the relevant agencies for a proposed project, and provide recommendations for improvements to current procurement practices. The consultant will also help develop a procurement plan to support potential investments in engineering and technical education.
- 11. **Fiduciary risk management specialist** (national, 2 person-months, intermittent). The consultant will have at least 10 years of experience in accounting, financial management, or project management. Preferably, he or she worked for a recognized professional accountancy or finance qualification such as Chartered Accountant, Certified Public Accountant, Chartered Financial Analyst, etc. Experience with ADB or World Bank's financial management assessment is required. The consultant will review and analyze the funds flow mechanism and financial management arrangements of identified agencies, and recommend areas for improvements.

- 12. **Social development and gender specialist** (national, 2 person-months). The consultant will have at least 10 years of experience in analyzing and assessing gender and social inclusion issues in Nepal. The tasks will include (i) conducting poverty, social, ethnic and gender impact assessments; and (ii) preparing poverty reduction and social strategy, indigenous peoples' plan, and gender action plan.
- 13. **Civil works/architecture specialist** (national, 3 person-months). The specialist will have at least 10 years in building design of education facilities particularly of campuses and universities. The specialist will (i) collect data and analyze the cost norms for civil works and prepare a realistic schedule and cost estimates for design, supervision, inspection, and maintenance of civil works to be planned under the proposed project; and (ii) work with procurement specialists and prepare procurement plan and bidding documents.
- 14. **Environment specialist** (national, 2 person-months). The consultant will have at least 10 years of relevant experience in environmental assessments and management plans. Experience with the environmental safeguard work of ADB or World Bank is required. The consultant will conduct environmental assessment and prepare due diligence documents in line with ADB's *Safeguard Policy Statement* (2009).
- 15. **Resettlement specialist** (national, 2 person-months). The consultant will have at least 10 years of relevant experience in resettlement in Nepal. Experience with the environmental safeguard work of ADB or World Bank is required. The consultant will screen the site identified for civil works, and prepare due diligence documents in line with ADB's *Safeguard Policy Statement* (2009).

E. Implementation Arrangements

- 16. The executing agency of the TA will be MOE. ADB will administer the TA and work closely with the executing agency. All consultants will be recruited individually. The government will provide (i) counterpart staff, and (ii) coordination support. All disbursements under the TA will be made in accordance with ADB's *Technical Assistance Disbursement Handbook* (2010, as amended from time to time). The equipment procured under the TA will be handed over to the government upon TA completion. Implementation period of the PPTA will be from 1 Jan 2016–30 Jun 2017 to ensure project readiness.
