## Japan Fund for Poverty Reduction

Grant no. 9175-PHI: Emergency Assistance and Early Recovery for Poor Municipalities Affected by Typhoon Yolanda

The grant aims at mitigating the adverse social and economic impacts on the poor resulting from Typhoon Yolanda in selected municipalities in the Eastern Visayas. It will help restore LGU infrastructure and provide:

- access to emergency employment and livelihood support;
  - basic emergency employment and livelihood support;
  - emergency maternal and child health care
  - improved resilience to future disasters

## KALAHI-CIDDS National Community-Driven Development Project

Loan no. 310-PHI: KALAHI-CIDSS National Community-Driven Development Project — community driven development

to restore basic social services and for recovery and rehabilitation activities in more than 500 municipalities across 39 provinces affected by the typhoon.

Rehabilitation and recovery efforts will emphasize “building back better” and disaster-resilient community infrastructure.
