1	Students benefiting from new or improved educational and training facilities	2,600 ^a (1,768 male and 832 female)	The number of beneficiaries has been estimated based on size of training facilities planned (including hostels, classrooms, labs in TTIs and schools), existing cohort of students and expected new enrollments by the end of the project.
2	Students educated and trained under improved quality assurance systems	1,450 ^b (986 male and 464 female)	The number of beneficiaries is based on implementation of new long-term courses (NC3 and ND2) in TTIs and through private training providers and in schools. These programs will be aligned to the Bhutan Vocational Qualification Framework. The TVET management information system will track the number of students enrolled, disaggregated for gender, across different training programs.
3	Teachers trained with quality or competency standards	Trainers (TTI and Schools) – 119 ^c (84 male and 35 female)	This will include training of trainers' program for the TTIs and junior instructors for the TVET program in schools.

NC3 = National Certificate level 3, ND2 = National Diploma level 2, TTI = technical training institute, TVET = technical and vocational education and training.

^a Enrolment capacity in TTI will almost double at the end of the project period, benefitting 2,200 students during the project period (32% female). About 400 students will benefit from the TVET program schools (32% female).

^b TTIs will enroll additional 250 candidates in new and advance level courses, 800 students will get trained in employment linked courses through the private sector training providers and 400 students will gain vocational qualifications from the TVET premier schools.

^c At least 60% of existing (59) and new trainers (36) at TTIs will receive training-of-trainers and industry attachment support under the project (30% females). All 24 junior instructors (30% female) in TVET premier schools will also be trained.
