Description	The growth of Uzbekistan's economy has not led to commensurate job creation. Annually more than 600,000 graduates from colleges and academic lyceums are entering labor market, while the annual increase in jobs is only about 200,000 300,000. Very recent economic downturn was accompanied with significant flow of returning migrants (300,000 400,000) from 2015 to 2017, adding pressure to the labor market. Unemployment rate was reported at 9.3% in 2018, and even higher at 17.0% for people aged 16-25 years. The Skills Development for a Modern Economy Project. The proposed project will support the government to expand and upgrade reskilling service to the unemployee through selected PTCs, modernize skills development in selected TVETCs, and forge performance-based partnerships with the industries including private sector. The overarching priority is to improve employability and job outcomes for skilled trainees and graduates. The proposed project will be fully aligned with the Action Strategy for the Five Priority Areas (2017 2021), Strategy on Innovative Development (2019 2021), and the Education Sector Plan (2019 2023).	
Project Rationale and Linkage to Country/Regional Strategy	ADB will build on past collaborations in skills development sectors. ADB's value addition will be: (i) providing a boost of quality in skills development through competency-based training (CBT) in selected priority sectors; (ii) financing the upgradation of selected PTCs and TVETCs in civil work, modern equipment and training facilities benchmarked to international standards; (iii) laying down labor market monitoring and analysis for evidence-based planning for skills development; and (iv) enabling industrial partnership in the full value chain of skills development.
