Description	Sri Lanka is currently being devastated by a third wave of COVID-19. Since the first local case w was able to curtail the first wave well, with only 3,380 cases and 13 deaths as of end-Septembe ongoing third wave since April 2021, the number of confirmed cases increased exponentially, at cases, and the number of active cases in hospitals increased exponentially from 2,500 patients 2021. Deaths due to COVID-19 also increased at an unprecedented rate from 588 on 7 April 2021.
