Description	The impact of the TA will be an integrated urban planning and management system adopted by the relevant departments in the project cities. City planning and management departments consistently consider environmental issues, such as climate change mitigation and adaptation measures in planning construction and management of urban infrastructure. The outcome of the TA will be enhanced city management's capacity in integrated planning and management of urban infrastructure.		
Project Rationale and Linkage to Country/Regional Strategy	The TA is an innovative sector work emerging from the demand expressed by the Government and is aligned with the urban sector assessment, strategy, road map and Interim Country Partnership Strategy (CPS) of Indonesia. The objective of the TA is in line with second National Medium-Term Development Plan 2010-2014 and its four-track strategy for pro-poor, pro-job, pro-growth and pro-environment development. Urbanization is an emerging theme for the National Medium-Term Development Plan 2015-2019. The Government has requested ADB to address this emerging theme and contribute towards the implementation of integrated urban development plans. In addition, the TA will contribute to the implementation of the National Urban Development Policy and Strategy (Kebijakan dan Strategi Pembangunan Perkotaan Nasional - KSPPN) which has been formulated by the Ministry of National Development Planning/BAPPENAS. The KSPPN is a strategic reference for urban development in Indonesia from 2015 until 2050 with the long-term vision of urban development: "Realizing Sustainable and Competitive Cities for the People Welfare based on Physical Conditions, Economic Potentials, and Local Cultures." This vision will be achieved through three (3) objectives, namely: i) Realization of the National Urban System (Sistem Perkotaan Nasional - SPN), ii) Fullfilment of Urban Services Standards (Standar Pelayanan Perkotaan - SPP) and Realization the Sustainable Cities comprise of Green City, Livable City, Smart, and Competitive City, and iii) Improvement of Good Governance and Institutional Government Capacity. The TA will be aligned with the Government's Green City Development Program administered by the Ministry of Public Works (MPW)

**During Project Design** 

During Project Implementation ADB will administer the TA, through the Southeast Asia Urban Development and Water Division (SEUW) with the National Development Planning Agency - BAPPENAS, through Directorate of Urban and Rural Affairs, as the executing agency. The EA, in particular will coordinate, monitor and evaluate the TA implementation in Indonesia. The TA will be implemented from October 2013 to June 2016. The TA will collaborate with the Indonesian Strategic Coordination Team for National Urban Development through the EA and the Directorate General of Spatial Planning of the Ministry of Public Works (MPW). SEUW will work in close coordination with ADB's Resident Mission in Indonesia and cooperation with the national government organizations, local governments, nongovernment organizations, and other international organizations in Indonesia. City working groups will be established in local government organizations, and community-based organizations. Detailed implementation arrangements will be agreed upon with the stakeholders during the inception phase of the TA, and may differ from city to city.

#### **Business Opportunities**

Consulting Services ADB will recruit a full time individual consultant for 24 months to assist BAPPENAS and ADB in overall project management and a consulting firm to provide the requested interim consulting services for outputs 1, 2 and 3, requiring about 24 international and 18 national persons-months. Key expertise will include a regional planner and urban development specialist, environmental engineer and climate resilience specialist, social development specialist and economics and financial management specialist.

ADB will engage the consulting firm using the quality- and cost-based selection with 90:10 weightage for technical and financial expertise. This ratio is proposed due to the importance of specific technical skills required in delivering the task, comprising the integration of urban planning, environment management, climate resilience, and institutional capacity development. Consultants will be selected in accordance with ADB's Guidelines on the Use of Consultants (2013, as amended from time to time). Proceeds of the TA will be disbursed in accordance with the Technical Assistance Disbursement Handbook (2010, as amended from time to time).
