# Implementation Status and Key Decisions

The project is still at initial stage where the two Project Management Units (PMUs) - one each for Department of Agriculture (DoA) and Department of Livestock and Fisheries (DoLF) - are completing project start-up activities.

The Bank team is closely monitoring progress through formal missions and extended technical support. Progress against activities listed in the last ISR is as following:

- 1. Appointment of Project Directors by both Departments is completed. However, both PDs are also holding additional responsibilities in their respective departments.
- 2. Appointment of Project Coordinator (PC) is completed. The PC is appointed by the Planning and Development Department with additional charge for this project combined with responsibilities for two other IDA financed projects (Sindh WSIP and Sindh Barrages Improvement). The Project Coordination Unit (PCU) for SAGP is established within the existing Project Coordination and Management Unit (PCMU) already operational for WSIP and Barrages projects. Additional staff for SAGP PCU is being hired.
- 3. Hiring of Procurement and FM staff by both Departments is completed.
- 4. Hiring of project implementation and TA consultants by DoA is at advanced stage with technical and financial proposals evaluation being completed. Hiring of project implementation and TA consultants by DoLF is underway with RFP issued to shortlisted firms.

In addition to the above progress, following activities are either completed or about to complete:

- 1. Two district level Project Implementation Units (PIUs) are established by the DoLF.
- 2. Hiring of Internal Audit firm is at advanced stages and the evaluation report of shortlisted firms is cleared by the Bank.
- 3. EOI is issued for hiring of Social Assessment Consultants.
- 4. TORs finalized for M&E consultants and cleared by the Bank for issuance of EOI.
- 5. Project launch events have been held by each department at district level with farmers and growers associations participating in these events. However, despite the above progress, the initial delays in appointing Project Directors, communicating authorized signatories, and maintaining consistent progress in completing procurement process has resulted in time delays. The Bank task team increased its input during the past 7 months. Interim missions were held in December 2014 and April 2015 while a full implementation support mission was carried out in February 2015. The task team together with the Operations Advisor also held meetings with the senior officials of Government of Sindh and met with the Chief Secretary, the Additional Chief Secretary, the Minister for Agriculture and the Minister for Livestock and Fisheries to highlight the key issues requiring Government attention. In addition, extended technical support was made available to the PMUs and PCU to increase the rate of completing various tasks and maintain close monitoring of implementation progress.
