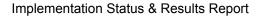


Implementation Status and Key Decisions

Project performance after four months of implementation is satisfactory. The implementing agency (Ministry of Family, Communitarian, Cooperative, and Associative Economy - MEFCCA) is coordinating with the Ministry of Finance to set up the necessary systems for financial management and budget execution; the first disbursement to project accounts was completed. The core technical team for project implementation is being selected as planned; initial field operations would start in late-July and speed up project implementation with local beneficiaries. The first group of Innovation Development Plans would be prepared and approved during the second semester of 2015. Project Committees at different levels are being appointed and Cooperation Agreements with key sector institutions (INTA, INPESCA, IPSA, MAG) that will support project implementation are being prepared for signing. The baseline study is being contracted and would start field work in July; the final report is expected for November.




