ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- 1. The Islamic Republic of Mauritania (the **Recipient**) implements the Decentralization and Productive Intermediate Cities Support Project (the **Project**), with the involvement of the following Ministries/agencies/units: Ministry in charge of Economy and Industry, Ministry in charge of Urban Planning, Ministry in charge of Decentralization, Ministry in charge of Environment, Ministry of Oil, Energy and Mines; the Ministry of Environment and Sustainable Development; SOMELEC and the Beneficiary Municipalities, as set out in two Financing Agreements entered into with the International Development Association (the **Association**), respectively on April 10, 2020 for the provision of the original financing of the Project, and to be entered into for the provision of an additional financing for the scaling up of the Project. This ESCP supersedes previous versions of the ESCP for the Project and shall apply both to the original and the additional financing for Project referred to above.
- 2. The Recipient shall ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) and this Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP), in a manner acceptable to the Association. The ESCP is a part of the Financing Agreements. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the referred agreement(s).
- 3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the Recipient shall carry out or cause to be carried out, including, as applicable, the timeframes of the actions and measures, institutional, staffing, training, monitoring and reporting arrangements, and grievance management. The ESCP also sets out the environmental and social (E&S) instruments that have or shall be adopted and implemented under the Project, all of which have been consulted and disclosed or shall be subject to prior consultation and disclosure, as the case may be, consistent with the ESS, and in form and substance, and in a manner acceptable to the Association. Once adopted, said E&S instruments may be revised from time to time with prior written agreement by the Association.
- 4. As agreed by the Association and the Recipient, this ESCP will be revised from time to time if necessary, during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, Recipient through the Project Coordination Unit (PCU) and the Association agree to update the ESCP to reflect these changes through an exchange of letters signed between the Association and the Recipient through the Ministry in charge of Economy and Industry. The Recipient shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
