Institutional strengthening and reform at the Ministry, Thromde and Dzongkhag levels to build capacity for future planning, design, implementation and monitoring of projects in the Country.

Consulting A firm has been engaged to undertake the necessary studies for this TA. The firm is composed of 6 international experts and 4 national expert (10 consultants). The consulting firm has been engaged following the quality- and costbased selection method, with a quality-cost ratio of 90:10 (due to the high complexity of the assignment and the impact of the expected outputs), using full technical proposal procedures. One additional international Project Management Specialist will be engaged individually to ensure project implementation is on track.
