ADB's investments will focus on energy efficiency and renewable energy projects, as well as expansion of energy access. The policy states that support for renewable energy projects will be prioritized and broadened with an objective to create a framework that makes investing in renewable energy oromercially viable. The project is consistent with ADB's long-term strategic framework, 2008—2020 (Strategy 2202), which defined infrastructure and environment as two of the five core operational areas. On infrastructure, the project will embody the strategy, which sets forth that ADB will (b) help expand the supply of energy (ii) promote energy energy through supply-side and demand-side measures; (iii) support clean energy; and (iv) facilitate the removal of policy, institutional, regulatory, technological, and legal constraints on promoting efficient energy use. With respect to the environment, the project is in line with the strategy's focus on climate change and complementary actions. ADB's country partnership strategy (CPS) for the PCR is absent on the development, (iii) good governance and capacity development, and (iv) gender equity.
