Summary of Environmental and Social Aspects

Environmental Aspects

The project is classified as category B and an initial environmental examination has been prepared. The ongoing project is currently operating with a revised version 5 of the initial environmental examination approved in October 2014. The contractor current environmental management plan (revision L) was accepted in December 2014. The main potential impacts include (i) disturbance from dust arising from loading, unloading, and transportation of construction materials; (ii) noise; (iii) erosion and sedimentation from exposed surfaces during construction that may affect the lagoon environment; (iv) risks from the use and disposal of hazardous materials such as used fuel and lubricants; and (v) increased risk of accidents from increased vehicle movements. Detailed mitigation measures have been incorporated in the project, as outlined in the environmental management plan. An international environmental specialist and national environment inspector are engaged during the construction phase to review compliance monitoring and assist reporting to the Ministry of Environment, Lands and Agriculture Department.

Involuntary Resettlement The project is classified as category B. No buildings are to be relocated and no economic crops affected. To the extent possible, the rehabilitated roads are designed for construction on the current road alignment. New bus bays and drainage easements will be outside of this area but people who may be affected will be consulted during the design to determine where best to locate these facilities to minimize resettlement. Any resettlement that may be required will be undertaken in accordance with the resettlement plan. Compensation for loss of land and assets, mainly for loss of fruit bearing trees, has been paid for 96% of affected persons 326 in total. An escrow account has been established for compensation of the remaining 13 affected persons as and when the pending court cases are resolved and when affected persons are traced.

Indigenous Peoples

The project is classified as category C. The people of South Tarawa are from a single ethnic group. There are no customary, cultural, economic, social, or political institutions that set South Tarawa apart from the rest of Kiribati society.
