Impacts, if any, are expected to be localized and small. As project effectiveness coincided with the Ebola outbreak, most activities were put on hold and are only now resuming. As such, the ESMF prepared for the parent project has been updated and is being implemented.

Since there were no significant changes in the project activities that warrant new potential environmental or social impacts, the original (and restructured) project environmental category (B) will remain the same, no new policies are triggered, and the current project's Environmental and Social Management Framework (ESMF) prepared remains valid and has been updated during preparation for the AF. In addition, the original REDiSL is not expected to impact any change in social status quo as land acquisition is not expected under any of the components supported by the project. On the contrary, the project is expected to have a positive social impact and this also applies to this AF which explicitly aims at minimizing the impact of the EVD outbreak on schoolage children.

The key stakeholders for this AF are school-age children and their teachers and as mentioned above the activities financed under this AF explicitly aim at minimizing the impact of the EVD outbreak on the latter and are therefore expected to have a very positive social impact. An Environmental and Social Management Framework (ESMF) was prepared for the original REDiSL and remains valid. It has been updated during preparation for the AF and will be disclosed upon approval by the regional adviser.

Consultative meetings were held to solicit stakeholders' perception of the original REDiSL project and sub-components and their environmental and social ramifications. Consultative meetings were organized with the Environment Protection Agency Sierra Leone (EPASL) to assess their capacity and track record in implementing and independently monitoring environmental and social impacts and compliance. The preliminary ESMF was presented at a one-day stakeholder consultation/briefing and any pertinent suggestions and recommendations made during this consultation have been considered in the final report.
