Dear Senior Secretary Mejbahuddin:

In response to the request for financial assistance made on behalf of People's Republic of Bangladesh ("Recipient"), I am pleased to inform you that the International Development Association ("World Bank") proposes to extend to the Recipient an advance out of the World Bank's Project Preparation Facility in an amount not to exceed one million six hundred ninety thousand Dollars (\$1,690,000) ("Advance") on the terms and conditions set forth or referred to in this letter agreement ("Agreement"), which includes the attached Annex, to assist in financing the activities described in the Annex ("Activities"). The objective of the Activities is to facilitate the preparation of a proposed project designed to enhance the capacity of the Recipient to deliver reliable weather, water and climate information services and improve access to such services by priority sectors and communities ("Project"), for which the Recipient has requested the World Bank's financial assistance.

The Recipient represents, by confirming its agreement below, that: (a) it understands that the provision of the Advance does not constitute or imply any commitment on the part of IBRD or IDA to assist in financing the Project; and (b) it is authorized to enter into this Agreement and to carry out the Activities, repay the Advance and perform its other obligations under this Agreement, all in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement.

Please confirm the Recipient's agreement to the foregoing by having an authorized official of the Recipient sign and date the enclosed copy of this Agreement, and returning it to the World Bank. Upon receipt by the World Bank of this countersigned copy, this Agreement shall become effective as of the date of the countersignature.

Article I

Standard Conditions; Definitions

- 1.01. **Standard Conditions.** The Standard Conditions for Advances Made by the World Bank under its Project Preparation Facility dated July 31, 2010 ("Standard Conditions"), constitute an integral part of this Agreement.
- 1.02. **Definitions.** Unless the context requires otherwise, the capitalized terms used in this Agreement have the meanings ascribed to them in the Standard Conditions or in this Agreement as follows:
- (a) "BMD" means the Bangladesh Meteorological Department.
- (b) "BWDB" means the Bangladesh Water Development Board.
- (c) "Implementing Entities" means BMD and BWDB.
- (d) "Incremental Operating Costs" means the reasonable costs required for the day-to-day coordination, administration and supervision of Project activities, including leasing and/or routine repair and maintenance of vehicles, equipment, facilities and office premises, office supplies, utilities, consumables, communication expenses, translation, printing, photocopying and postal expenses, bank charges, advertising expenses, insurance, costs of clearing, forwarding, inspection, survey and transportation of goods, Project-related meeting expenses, Project-related travel, provided that such Operating Costs are paid to the eligible recipient through banking system (except for petty cash expenses up to BDT100,000 following Recipient's existing policy); but excluding fuel, salaries, per diem, allowances and honorarium of officials of the Recipient's civil service and/or other sitting allowances and honorarium of any other nature.
- (f) "Procurement Laws" means collectively, the Recipient's Procurement Act 2006 (Act No. 24 of 2006), Public Procurement Rules 2008 (as amended in August 2009) and Public Procurement Act (1st Amendment) 2009.
- "Training and Workshops" means the reasonable costs required for the participation of personnel involved in training activities, workshops and study tours under the Project which have been approved by the Association in writing on annual basis, including: (a) travel, hotel, and subsistence costs for training, workshop and study tour participants provided that such allowances are paid directly to the eligible recipient using the banking system; (b) costs associated with rental of training and workshop facilities, preparation and reproduction of training and workshop materials, costs of academic degree studies, and other costs directly related to training course, workshop or study tour preparation and implementation provided that such costs are paid directly to the eligible recipient using the banking system, but excluding salaries of consultants and sitting allowances and honorarium of any other nature.
- (h) "World Bank Safeguard Policies" means the World Bank's operational policies and procedures set forth in the World Bank's Operational Manual under OP/BPs 4.01, 4.04, 4.36, 4.09, 4.10, 4.11, 4.12, 4.37, and 7.50 as said manual is published under www.WorldBank.org/opmanual.

Article II Execution of the Activities

- 2.01. **Description of the Activities.** The Activities for which the Advance is provided consist of the following parts:
- (a) Provision of technical support to develop meteorogical services and system integration support and water resources and services integration support, including the carrying out of studies on any of those areas; and
- (b) (i) Provision of support to prepare Project documentation, including the carrying out of initial Project management activities and the hiring of procurement and financial management specialists and international technical and procurement experts for bid evaluation; (ii) Provision of training in Project-related areas; and (iii) Carrying out of field level data collection to finalize bidding documents.
- 2.02. Execution of the Activities Generally. The Recipient declares its commitment to the objectives of the Activities. To this end, the Recipient shall carry out the Activities through each of the Implementing Entities in accordance with the provisions of: (a) Article II of the Standard Conditions; (b) this Article II; (c) the "Guidelines on Preventing and Combating Fraud and Corruption in Projects Financed by IBRD Loans and IDA Credits and Grants", dated October 15, 2006 and revised in January 2011; and (d) the Procurement Plan.

2.03. Institutional and Other Arrangements.

- (a) The Recipient shall establish and thereafter maintain throughout the carrying out of the Activities, a coordination unit within BWDB with mandate, terms of reference and resources satisfactory to the World Bank, which shall be: (i) headed by a full-time coordinator with terms of reference, qualifications and experience satisfactory to the World Bank; (ii) composed of relevant technical experts and specialists, all with terms of reference, qualifications and experience satisfactory to the World Bank; and (iii) responsible for, *inter alia*, overseeing the overall coordination, implementation and management of the Activities.
- (b) The Recipient shall establish and thereafter maintain throughout the carrying out of the Activities in each of the Implementing Entities, an implementation unit, with mandate, terms of reference and resources satisfactory to the World Bank, which shall be: (i) headed by a full-time director with terms of reference, qualifications and experience satisfactory to the World Bank; (ii) composed of relevant technical experts and specialists, all with terms of reference, qualifications and experience satisfactory to the World Bank; and (iii) responsible for, *inter alia*, carrying out the procurement, financial management, environment, social, monitoring and reporting activities of its respective Activities.
- (c) The Recipient shall ensure or cause to be ensured that the terms of reference for any consultants' services in respect of any activity financed under the Advance shall be satisfactory to the World Bank following its review thereof and, to that end, such terms of reference shall duly incorporate all the applicable World Bank Safeguards Policies, as applied to the advice conveyed through such technical assistance.
- 2.04. *Monitoring, Reporting and Evaluation of the Activities.* The Recipient shall monitor and evaluate the progress of the Activities through each of the Implementing Entities in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.08 of the Standard Conditions.
- 2.05. *Financial Management.* (a) The Recipient shall ensure that a financial management system is maintained in each of the Implementing Entities in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.09 of the Standard Conditions.

- (b) The Recipient shall ensure that interim un-audited financial reports for the Activities are prepared by each of the Implementing Entities and furnished to the World Bank in a consolidated manner not later than forty-five (45) days after the end of each six (6) month, covering the six (6) months, in form and substance satisfactory to the World Bank.
- (c) The Recipient shall cause each of the Implementing Entities to have its Financial Statements audited in accordance with the provisions of Sections 2.09 (b) of the Standard Conditions. Each audit of the Financial Statements shall cover the period of one (1) fiscal year of the Recipient, commencing with the fiscal year in which the first withdrawal under the Advance was made. The audited Financial Statements for such period shall be furnished to the World Bank not later than six (6) months after the end of such period.

2.06. Procurement

- (a) <u>General</u>. All goods, non-consulting services and consultants' services required for the Activities and to be financed out of the proceeds of the Advance shall be procured in accordance with the requirements set forth or referred to in:
- (i) Section I of the "Guidelines: Procurement of Goods, Works and Non-consulting Services under IBRD Loans and IDA Credits and Grants by World Bank Borrowers" dated January 2011 and revised July 2014 ("Procurement Guidelines"), in the case of goods and non-consulting services;
- (ii) Sections I and IV of the "Guidelines: Selection and Employment of Consultants under IBRD Loans and IDA Credits and Grants by World Bank Borrowers" dated January 2011 and revised July 2014 ("Consultant Guidelines") in the case of consultants' services; and
- (iii) the provisions of this Section, as the same shall be elaborated in the procurement plan prepared and updated from time to time by the Recipient for the Activities in accordance with paragraph 1.18 of the Procurement Guidelines and paragraph 1.25 of the Consultant Guidelines ("Procurement Plan").
- (b) <u>Definitions</u>. The capitalized terms used in the following paragraphs of this Section to describe particular procurement methods or methods of review by the World Bank of particular contracts, refer to the corresponding method described in Sections II and III of the Procurement Guidelines, or Sections II, III, IV and V of the Consultant Guidelines, as the case may be.

(c) Particular Methods of Procurement of Goods and Non-consulting Services

- (i) <u>International Competitive Bidding.</u> Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (c)(ii) below, goods and non-consulting services shall be procured under contracts awarded on the basis of International Competitive Bidding.
- (ii) Other Methods of Procurement of Goods and Non-consulting Services. The following methods, other than International Competitive Bidding, may be used for procurement of goods and non-consulting services for those contracts specified in the Procurement Plan:
 - (1) National Competitive Bidding, following the procedures of the Procurement Laws, using bidding documents acceptable to the World Bank and subject to the following provisions:
 - (A) post bidding negotiations shall not be allowed with the lowest evaluated or any other bidder;

- (B) bids should be submitted and opened in public in one location immediately after the deadline for submission;
- (C) lottery in award of contracts shall not be allowed;
- (D) bidders' qualification/experience requirement shall be mandatory;
- (E) bids shall not be invited on the basis of percentage above or below the estimated cost and contract award shall be based on the lowest evaluated bid price of compliant bid from eligible and qualified bidder; and
- (F) single stage two (2) envelope procurement system shall not be allowed.
- (2) Shopping, following the request for quotation method of the Procurement Laws; and
- (3) Direct Contracting.

(d) Particular Methods of Procurement of Consultants' Services

- (i) Except as otherwise provided in item (ii) below, consultants' services shall be procured under contracts awarded on the basis of Quality- and Cost-based Selection.
- (ii) The following methods may be used for the procurement of consultants' services for those assignments which are specified in the Procurement Plan: (A) Quality-based Selection; (B) Selection under a Fixed Budget; (C) Least Cost Selection; (D) Selection based on Consultants' Qualifications; (E) Single-source Selection of consulting firms; (F) Selection of Individual Consultants; and (G) Single-source procedures for the Selection of Individual Consultants.
- (e) <u>Review by the World Bank of Procurement Decisions</u>. The Procurement Plan shall set forth those contracts which shall be subject to the World Bank's Prior Review. All other contracts shall be subject to Post Review by the World Bank.

Article III Withdrawal of the Advance

3.01. Eligible Expenditures. The Recipient may withdraw the proceeds of the Advance in accordance with the provisions of: (a) Article III of the Standard Conditions; (b) this Section; and (c) such additional instructions as the World Bank may specify by notice to the Recipient (including the "World Bank Disbursement Guidelines for Projects" dated May 2006, as revised from time to time by the World Bank and as made applicable to this Agreement pursuant to such instructions), to finance Eligible Expenditures as set forth in the following table. The table specifies each category of Eligible Expenditures that may be financed out of the proceeds of the Advance ("Category"), the amount of the Advance allocated to each Category, and the percentage of expenditures to be financed for Eligible Expenditures in each Category:

- 3.02. Withdrawal Conditions. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 3.01 of this Agreement, no withdrawal shall be made for payments made prior to the date of countersignature of this Agreement by the Recipient.
- 3.03. Refinancing Date. The Refinancing Date is October 31, 2016.

Article IV Terms of the Advance

- 4.01. **Service Charge**. The Recipient shall pay a service charge on the Withdrawn Advance Balance at the rate of three-fourths of one percent (3/4 of 1%) per annum. The service charge shall accrue from the respective dates on which amounts of the Advance are withdrawn and shall be paid in arrears in accordance with the provisions of Section 4.02 of this Agreement. Service charges shall be computed on the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months.
- 4.02. **Repayment.** The Withdrawn Advance Balance shall be repaid by the Recipient to the World Bank (together with any service charges accrued thereon) in accordance with the provisions of Article IV of the Standard Conditions and the following provisions:
- (a) Refinancing under the Refinancing Agreement: If, on or before the Refinancing Date, a Refinancing Agreement has been executed by all of its parties, then the full amount of the Withdrawn Advance Balance shall be repaid to the World Bank (together with any service charges accrued on the Advance to the date of repayment) as soon as the Refinancing Agreement becomes effective, by means of a withdrawal by the World Bank of an amount of the Refinancing Proceeds equivalent to the Withdrawn Advance Balance plus such service charges, in accordance with the provisions of the Refinancing Agreement.
- (b) Repayment in the absence of a Refinancing Agreement: If, on or before the Refinancing Date, no Refinancing Agreement has been executed by all of its parties, or if, by such date or at any time thereafter, it has been so executed but terminates without becoming effective, then:

- (i) if the amount of the Withdrawn Advance Balance does not exceed \$50,000, it shall be repaid by the Recipient to the World Bank (together with service charges accrued on the Withdrawn Advance Balance to the date of repayment) on such date as the World Bank shall specify in a notice to the Recipient, which shall in no event be earlier than 60 days following the date of dispatch of such notice; and
- (ii) if the amount of the Withdrawn Advance Balance exceeds \$50,000, it (together with service charges accrued on the Withdrawn Advance Balance to the Notice Date) (the "Aggregate Balance") shall be paid by the Recipient to the World Bank in ten approximately equal semiannual installments, in the amounts and on the dates ("Payment Dates") which the World Bank shall specify in a notice to the Recipient. In no event shall the first Payment Date be set earlier than 60 days following the date ("Notice Date") of dispatch of such notice. The Recipient shall pay a service charge on the Aggregate Balance at the rate of three-fourths of one percent (3/4 of 1%) per annum, payable in arrears on each Payment Date. The service charge shall be computed on the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months.

Article V Recipient's Representative; Addresses

- 5.01. Recipient's Representative. The Recipient's Representative referred to in Section 9.02 of the Standard Conditions is the Senior Secretary/Secretary, or the Additional Secretary, or any Joint Secretary, or Deputy Secretary, or Senior Assistant Secretary, or Assistant Secretary, or Joint Chief, or Deputy Chief, or Senior Assistant Chief, or Assistant Chief of the Economic Relations Division of the Recipient's Ministry of Finance.
