

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## Implementation Status and Key Decisions

The project has made an excellent beginning. The Chief Minister inaugurated the project's Launch workshop on 17th June 2015 which was also joined by the Country Director, World Bank who complimented the state government's efforts on sanitation and expressed Bank's support to achieve 'Swachh Punjab by 2017'. As required by Department of Economic Affairs (DEA), Government of India (GoI) the Department of Water Supply and Sanitation (DWSS) has been working on awarding 30% of schemes - deadline is Aug 15 end but unlikely to be met. On creating an enabling environment for 'Toilet for every household and ODF', DWSS has generated huge demand by involving the Honorable Minister, Additional Chief Secretary, Head of the Department (HoD) and other district functionaries in spreading the message across every nook and corner of the state. It has started as a movement for triggering behavior change across the state. In addition, DWSS has come out with a notification on constitution of village water committees (GPWSC) and state water and sanitation mission (SWSM). DWSS also organized a workshop during the mission with Non- Governmental Organizations (NGOs) seeking their participation in project implementation. The office of the HoD has been created with some skeletal staff; and jurisdiction of engineers (villages) have been notified for improved service delivery.

On implementation progress, the mission noted that procurement has been initiated only for about 185 water schemes under Component 1a (augmentation of water supply) for about Rs150 Cr (about \$ 25 m). and Component 3.b.ii's Large Surface Water Supply schemes under Design Build Operate (DBO) contract in 121 villages in two districts for about Rs 300 Cr. Implementation is yet to start even after seven months after the first project's closure which will impact project disbursements; mission views this is a result of capacity constraints. Although project has plans for all the components, implementation will pick up only from January 2016 when most of the mid and field level functionaries are likely to be in place.


