Implementation Status Overview

Overall, the project has partially achieved good results moving towards improving the competitiveness of the agricultural sector. In particular, the performance of the Competitive Grant Scheme should be mentioned, bringing tangible benefits on the ground. Almost 600 competitive grants are implemented under the project, allowing companies to improve their competitiveness in the following aspects: development of agricultural marketing infrastructure (slaughter houses, storage facilities, etc.), modernization of private laboratories, image

enhancement of agricultural products (development of new design for packaging, rebranding, etc.), applied agricultural research (testing of new varieties, breeds, etc.), extension and technology introduction. Other notable achievements include: (i) strengthening of the country's extension system through supporting setting up of a network of extension and training centers, and (ii) contribution to the regulatory framework for food safety and quality improvement management systems through development of technical regulations for selected key commodities (meat and milk products, fruits and vegetables, grains, and others), which were subsequently adopted by government resolutions. However, the project has also

experienced some problems, in particular, the inability to complete the design of the National Reference Laboratory before the World Bank Loan closing date, and some shortcomings

in the laboratory equipment supplied under the project have been identified (including underutilization of the equipment and delays in staff training).


