About this position:

The objective of this Technical Cooperation (TC) is to support the Government of Jamaica and the broader Caribbean region to develop and launch a first-of-its-kind Fiscal Research Center (FRC) at The University of the West Indies (UWI). This TC will finance three types of activities: (i) a partnership between the IDB's Vice Presidency for Countries, the Caribbean Country Department and relevant IDBG Divisions to design, produce and disseminate policy-oriented research jointly with UWI researchers (including relevant data), possibly including collaboration with other experts from around the world; (ii) development of curricula for students and practitioners in economic and public finance policy and practice; and (iii) development and delivery of focused courses and related outputs that will help to build capacity for public servants from across the region.

The Caribbean Country Department (CCB) seeks a consultant to support this initiative via: [(i) the design and production of high-quality research / (ii) editing and/or typesetting, graphic design work, and production of specific publications / (iii) development and delivery of courses in related areas / (iv) targeted technical assistance, in collaboration with experts from UWI, the IDB, and other affiliated researchers.]

1. Background and Justification

- 1.1. Since gaining independence beginning in the 1960s, Caribbean countries have been among the world's most vulnerable and prone to economic and financial crises. IDB-led¹ and other research has shown that a key contributing factor to the region's economic vulnerabilities has been persistently high levels of public debt, which have contributed to underinvestment in public and social infrastructure, high borrowing costs, the crowding out of private investment, high and unpredictable taxes, and both economic and exchange rate volatility. Against this backdrop, few issues are more important for the region's future than ensuring that policymakers are in a position to design and execute prudent and well-informed policies for fiscal and economic management. This will require the development of demand-driven, policy-oriented research and diagnostics to help the region's authorities optimize fiscal policies and institutions; the design and delivery of training for existing and incoming public servants in cutting-edge tools and methodologies for policy formulation and execution; and focused training and capacity building, where appropriate.
- 1.2. The IDB has long been the region's main development partner, and through this TC, the IDB will partner with the Caribbean region's main university system and the Government of Jamaica to identify economic and fiscal policy and institutional issues with the potential to drive faster and more inclusive growth across the region. This client-focused, demand-driven initiative aims to support governments in the formulation, management and execution of economic policies—including public outlays for traditional, social, natural and digital infrastructure and services—, to improve economic stability and performance, as well as fiscal and debt sustainability. These objectives are crucial to setting the stage for faster, sustainable and more inclusive growth.

2. Objectives

2.1. The objective of this Technical Cooperation (TC) is to support the Government of Jamaica to develop and launch a first-of-its-kind Fiscal Research Center (FRC) within The University of the West Indies (UWI).

3. Scope of Services

3.1. The consulting firm shall collaborate with staff and affiliates of the FRC and the IDB in the design, production and dissemination of high-quality research projects and publications.

The consulting firm is also expected to collaborate with staff and affiliates of the FRC and the IDB to design and deliver courses in related areas to students, practitioners and government officials, as well as to design and deliver focused technical assistance and capacity building activities, on topics and areas identified by the FRC.

4. Main Activities

- 4.1. The consulting firm will carry out the activities described hereunder and any other activities necessary to accomplish the stated objectives of the consultancy. Main tasks/activities are described below.
- (a) In collaboration with IDB and UWI-FRC staff, leverage the IFSD's strong academic and practical experience in related areas to help: (i) establish and operationalize the UWI-FRC;
 (ii) identify, design, and produce high-quality, demand-driven research on economic and fiscal management topics; (iii) design courses in related areas, as well as contributing to the delivery of said courses; and, (iv) contribute to capacity building in related areas, as set forth by the FRC and TC Team Leader, based on guidance from stakeholders.
- (b) Contribute to the public dissemination of, and engagement regarding said research, courses, or capacity building (and related products), including via contributions to press releases, blogs, podcasts, social media inputs and postings, as well as participation in seminars or other public or media facing events.
- (c) Perform tasks per request of the Team Leader.

5. Expected Outcome and Deliverables

- 5.1. The consulting firm will be required to submit/deliver the following based on the decisions taken after consultation with the IDB and UWI/FRC Teams, including as set out by the FRC Steering Committee. The following shall be delivered:
- **Product 1:** Contributions to the design and delivery of a strategic five-year plan for the FRC, including a research and training output plan, building on IFSD's experience developing and managing a similar agency within a university.
- **Product 2:** Contributions to research projects, jointly with the UWI-FRC team, as defined by the FRC Steering Committee. It is expected that there will be several outputs per calendar year.
- **Product 3:** Contributions to the design and delivery of courses on economic and fiscal management topics, to be developed and delivered jointly with the UWI-FRC team, as defined by the FRC Steering Committee. It is expected that there will be several such courses delivered in each calendar year.



6. Project Schedule and Milestones

6.1. The schedule will be defined by the firm in agreement with the IDB project team.

7. Reporting Requirements

- 7.1. Each deliverable must be submitted to the Bank in an electronic file (in Word and PDF) for review and dissemination to UWI FRC stakeholders, as applicable. Reports should include the cover, main document and all annexes. Zip files will not be accepted as final reports, due to Records Management Section regulations.
- 7.2. Deliverables that involve teaching or in person modalities will be supervised by the IDB TC team members.

8. Acceptance Criteria

8.1. The reports submitted by the consultant firm shall be accepted by the IDB and must comply with the reporting on the progress and outcomes of the activities of the consultancy.

9. Supervision and Reporting

9.1. The consulting firm shall report to Henry Mooney (hmooney@iadb.org), Economics Senior Advisor, Caribbean Country Department (CCB/CCB).

10. Schedule of Payments

10.1. Payments will be processed as follows:

- \$12,000 upon delivery and approval of Product 1.
- \$4,000 per completed research output (paper, book chapter, etc.) with IFSD contributions.
- \$15,000 per course designed and delivered by IFSD (including in collaboration with UWI FRC and other contributors).
