Implementation Status Overview

Disbursements are at about 72.6% of the grant. The endowment fund has been capitalized n the amount of US\$ 12.8M. Project implementation is satisfactory. The CO (AF) National Protected Areas Trust Fund Project has been successfully processed and will be presented to the Board on July 21, 2011. Conservation mosaics (comprised of a National Park and the core area and a buffer zone) are implementing management conservation strategies around the Parks with the support of the local communities organized in local working groups. Project implementation has supported biodiversity and water conservation through land use management changes, the establishment of biodiversity corridors and water

supply distribution schemes in the buffer zones. Land use management schemes include the creation of Private Natural Reserves within farms located in the surrounding territories of the National Park and this has been done voluntarily. This aspect of the Project is exceptional.
