ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

1. The Central African Republic (the **Recipient**) will implement the CAR COVID-19 Preparedness & Response Project (the **Project**), with the involvement of the Ministry of Health and Population. The International Development Association (the **Association**) has agreed to provide financing for the Project.
2. The Recipient will implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (**ESSs**). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (**ESCP**) sets out material measures and actions, any specific documents or plans, as well as the timing for each of these.
3. The Recipient is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of specific measures and actions is conducted by the Ministry referenced in 1. above.
4. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP will be monitored and reported to the Association by the Recipient as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the Association will monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
5. As agreed by the Association and the Recipient, this ESCP may be revised from time to time during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, the Recipient will agree to the changes with the Association and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Association and the Recipient. The Recipient will promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
6. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, the Recipient shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts.

1.1	ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE: The Ministry of Health and Population will manage the ESHS arrangements for the Project through the National Technical Committee (CTN) retained as the Project Implementation Unit (PIU) as it is already implementing the WB-financed Health System Support and Strengthening (SENI) project (P164953) and the Regional Disease Surveillance and System Enhancement project IV (REDISSE4). The PIU shall recruit and maintain qualified staff and resources to support management of ESHS risks and impacts of the Project. Staff to be recruited include an environmental specialist and a social specialist. The social specialist should have a background in stakeholder and community engagement, as well as in gender-related programming and/or prevention of and response to sexual exploitation and abuse (SEA) and sexual harassment (SH). The project will also utilize the services of an existing SEA/SH specialist, who was hired by the CTN to support the current SENI project and will be able to oversee implementation of SEA/SH risk mitigation measures.
