Thanks for sharing the internal SMR for Tranche 2 for January-June 2016 submitted by LESCO. We endorse the acceptance and uploading of this SMR to the ADB website for disclosure. Please let us know when this has been disclosed so we can reflect in our monitoring matrix. While we endorse this SMR, we would like to offer the following comments and recommendations:

- The SMR noted that DPs affected by the stringing activities for the Doula Chuchak gs and
 transmission line have complained to the E&S Cell why compensation has not been disbursed to the
 150 DPs when stringing activities are already being conducted. At the same time, the long process for
 assessing and approving compensation payment was mentioned as affecting the timely disbursement
 of payments. LESCO needs to be reminded to facilitate the disbursement of payment in order to
 comply with the LARP provisions and ADB policy requirement and avoid DPs' complaints from
 escalating.
- 2. While the SMR noted that DPs complain about the compensation for the stringing activities, it was mentioned that no complaints were received and recorded in the grievance register. These are conflicting information. The DP complaints on the compensation should have been recorded in the register indicating who raised the complaint, when the complaint was received, what actions are being taken, what advice was given to the DP and the status of resolution. By not registering these complaints, DPs can claim that their concerns were not entertained or no explanation was given to them by the project. That would render their complaint eligible under the ADB accountability mechanism which will put the project in greater risk.
- It is noted that LESCO is now monitoring the restoration of temporarily used plots. This action is appreciated and should be continued. It is further suggested that the names of DPs met during these monitoring activities should also be recorded in the SMRs.

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
1. Introduction

1.1 LESCO is a public limited company responsible for distribution of electricity within its territorial jurisdiction comprising of five districts; Lahore, Kasur, Okara, Sheikhu Pura and Nankana of Punjab Province. LESCO was established in 1998 under Companies Ordinance, 1984 as a result of restructuring of the Power Wing of WAPDA after the enforcement of National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) Regulation of Generation, Transmission and Distribution of Electric Power Act (XL of 1997). LESCO is presently serving approximately three Million customers (Domestic, Commercial, Agricultural, Industrial and others).

Project Management Unit (PMU)

1.2 LESCO Environment and Social Cell had been established in 2007 and this cell is currently part of Project Management Unit PMU established in 2009 and headed by Chief Engineer Development. PMU comprises of four sections i.e. Planning, Scheduling & Coordination, Procurement, Finance, M.C&C, Environment & Social Safeguard and GSC department.

2. Project overview

2.1 LESCO through GOP has under gone a loan, project and financing agreement with the Asian Development Bank under Power Distribution Enhancement Investment Project Tranche - II in order to strengthen its existing distribution, transmission infrastructure and institutional capacity. The detail regarding project is summarized below:

3. Scope of Work

Sub projects to be financed by Asian Development Bank in Tranche - II included following scope of work:

Construction of New Grid Stations = 05

Augmentation of Power Transformers = 12

4. Social Management

- 4.1 02 Nos. Land Acquisition and Resettlement Plans LARPs (approved by ADB) for 132 kV Grid Stations Doula Chuchak and Central Park & 03 Nos. Due Diligence Reports (approved by ADB) for 132 kV Grid Stations DHA Rahber, Jubilee Town and Press Club Housing Society have been prepared by M/s BPI and CEO LESCO approved the same on 10 - 07 - 2010.
- 4.2 Land Acquisition and Resettlement Plans (LARPs) have been translated into Urdu and uploaded on LESCO's website (www.lesco.gov.pk) on 15-11-2010 after approval of ADB.
- 4.3 Clauses regarding Social safeguards have been provided to the procurement section to include in the bidding documents and EMMP & RP is the part of Bidding Document of STG Projects on turnkey basis.
- 4.4 An orientation workshop on Environment and Social Issues has been conducted on December 24'2011. Training Session on Environment & Social issues shall be conducted in next quarter subject to approval by LESCO.
- 4.5 Land Acquisition and Resettlement Plans LARPs have been updated keeping in view the inflation rate according to current market rates as desired by ADB for Doula Chuchak and Central Park Grid station & Transmission Line. Updated LARPs have been submitted to ADB for approval on 29-04-2014. ADB reviewed and approved on 13-10-2014. Revised/Updated LARPs have been uploaded on LESCO website.
- 4.6 LARPs were prepared on approved route plan and still there is no change in route plans so there is no remarkable/major change in the baseline data as provided in original LARPs.
- 4.7 Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) has been re-notified in order to redress grievances of affected persons/stakeholders and notification is placed as Annexure A.

5. Social Monitoring

5.1 132 kV Grid Station Doula Chuchak and Feeding Transmission Line

Physical Works

132 kV Doula Chuchak Grid Station and its Feeding Transmission Line has been completed and the grid station has been energized in April'2016.

Land Status and Involuntary Resettlement

No land acquisition and involuntary resettlement involved as land was property of LESCO since fifteen years. During site visits no one complained or raised objection on LESCO for construction of grid station on the land owned by LESCO. However, LARP was prepared as this subproject involved construction of Feeding Transmission Line passing from four villages and caused damage to crops.

Crop Compensation Status

Crop Compensation is paid in three stages i.e. Foundation, Erection and Stringing. Compensation for foundation and erection stage has been paid to all affected persons except a few APs who were neither available during disbursement of compensation cheques on sites/GSC office and nor have contacted for compensation payment till so far. Announcement has been made on sites and GSC staff has visited the available addresses of APs to inform regarding cheques. Crop Compensation is paid on actual basis and has been disbursed through committee formulated by PD GSC.

During site visits all affected persons complained that LESCO has not yet started disbursement of compensation for stringing works though the stringing has been completed and Grid Station has been energized. Detail regarding compensation payment is tabulated below:

Restoration of Site

Feeding T/Line passed through agriculture land and has been restored and affected persons have started cultivation on land and no affected person complained regarding non restoration of land or any facility other than land. Photographs taken during site visits are placed in Annexure A.

5.2 132 kV Grid Station Central Park and Feeding Transmission Line

Physical Works

Civil works for Grid Station are near to completion and construction of feeding transmission line has not been started yet.

Land Status and Involuntary Resettlement

No land acquisition and involuntary resettlement involved as land was provided by Central Park Housing Society to LESCO free of cost. During site visits no one complained or raised objection on LESCO for construction of grid station on the land owned by LESCO. However, LARP was prepared as this subproject involved construction of Feeding Transmission Line passing from agricultural land and will cause damage to crops.

Crop Compensation Status

Neither construction nor crop compensation activity has been started yet for feeding transmission line of Central Park grid station.

Restoration of site

Status will be given after commencement of feeding T/Line construction.

5.3 132 kV Grid Station Jubilee Town and Feeding Transmission Line

Physical Works

Grid Station and feeding Transmission line completed and energized.

Land Status and Involuntary Resettlement

No land acquisition and involuntary resettlement involved as land was provided free of cost by housing society to LESCO. During site visits no one complained or raised objection on LESCO for construction of grid station. Due Diligence Report (DDR) was prepared and approved by ADB and LESCO. Construction of feeding T/Line does not involve damage to crops or any other private or public assets.

5.4 132 kV Grid Station Press Club and Feeding Transmission Line

Physical Works

Civil works for grid station are near to completion.

Land Status and Involuntary Resettlement

No land acquisition and involuntary resettlement involved as land was provided free of cost by housing society to LESCO. During site visits no one complained or raised objection on LESCO for construction of grid station. Due Diligence Report (DDR) was prepared and approved by ADB and LESCO. Construction of feeding T/Line does not involve damage to crops or any other private or public assets.

5.5 132 kV Grid Station DHA Rahber and Feeding Transmission Line

Physical Works

Civil works and electrical installations has been completed.

Land Status and Involuntary Resettlement

No land acquisition and involuntary resettlement involved as land was provided free of cost by housing society to LESCO. During site visits no one complained or raised objection on LESCO for construction of grid station. Due Diligence Report (DDR) was prepared and approved by ADB and LESCO, Construction of feeding T/Line does not involve damage to crops or any other private or public assets.

- 5.6 Augmentation works shall be carried out within existing grid stations and no land acquisition or involuntary resettlement is involved.
- 5.7 GSC staff has been apprised regarding social aspects of the subprojects and on site briefing to the contractor has also be given for effective implementation of LARPs during site visits.

5.8 Mitigation Measures

- 5.8.1 Social Complaint Register (SCR) has been placed at all project sites in order to register the grievances and complaints of the stakeholders. No complaint has been registered so far by any affected person in SCR, however, during site visits of E&S team regarding monitoring of crop compensation payment and consultation sessions, Affected persons (APs) of Doula Chuchak grid station demanded for fast and timely disbursement of crop compensation amount and E&S Cell has regularly apprised the concerned GC Division Officers/Officials to expedite the process of compensation payment in order to redress the concerns of APs. Compensation assessment and disbursement procedure is too lengthy and remained main reason for late compensation payment. E&S cell PMU LESCO is regularly asking GSC staff to expedite the process of compensation payment.
- 5.8.2 The land has been restored to its original condition by the contractor and Affected Persons generally showed their satisfaction on restoration work during site visits of E&S team.
- 5.8.3 Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) has been re-notified for Tranche II in order to comply with the Grievance Redressal Mechanism (GRM) described in LARPS. The organogram of GRC is given below:

The concerns regarding compensation payment have been resolved timely with the consultation of APs and no such complaints have been registered which needs GRM procedure to be followed for mitigation measures till so far.
