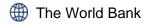

Implementation Status Overview

As reported in the last Implementation Status Report, the project has basically met most of its outcome indicators. Basic education drop-out rates remain very low, transition rates between basic and secondary education have exceeded 90%, and secondary gross enrollment rates reached 70%. Another important achievement is the students' increase in performance at the 2009 PISA, the third country with the largest gains since 2000.



Since the last supervision mission in May 2011, the Government has complied with all but one of the agreements reached with the Development Partners: (i) a team of engineers/ architects was put in place to carry out in situ supervision of the schools and has already submitted two detailed supervision reports; (ii) a full time environmental specialist was hired as was (iii) an international procurement specialist; (iv) the environmental annex of the Operational Manual was amended; and (v) an action plan for the MIS was submitted. Additionally, contracts were signed for carrying out civil works in seven different schools. At the same time, the World Bank agreed with the Government that it could delay hiring an international financial management specialist given that the selection process didn't yield a good candidate and the Project could be closing in a few months. The one agreement pending is the submission of a school supervision report by MoES's environmental team, which MoES informed is being finalized.

On the less positive side, implementation progress has not yet reflected into higher disbursements. This is basically a factor of how the project was designed (with only two disbursements per year), whereby disbursements generally occur in May and November. A disbursement is expected to take place at that time but the latest Government projection is that it will be around EUR600,000, far less than originally estimated.

A full-fledged implementation support mission with the participation of all Development Partners (Council of Europe Development Bank, European Investment Bank, and World Bank) will visit Albania in October to assess progress on the ground and hold discussions about the necessary steps to ensure the successful completion of the Project. At the time, the team will also collect the latest project indicators and update the Results' Framework.
