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Introduction

1. QESCO through GOP has undergone a Project Financing agreement with Asian Development Bank for:
 - Strengthening the capacity of Power Distribution and Transmission networks
 - To meet the increasing electricity demand in the selected areas more efficiently
 - To upgrade the existing power infrastructure.
2. To meet the above objectives QESCO has prepared the Land Acquisition and Resettlement Plans (LARPs) for Tranche-III sub projects. The LARPs have been prepared as per ADB's guidelines and ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS) 2009. The main objectives of social monitoring report for the particular period are implementation of LARP, to monitor the compliance of targets that are set in the LARPs and to consult with Project affected Persons (APs) to redress their issues raised during commencement of work.

Project Background

3. Quetta Electric Supply Company (QESCO) is a Public Limited Utility Company, established in 1998 under Companies Ordinance 1984 and is responsible for distribution of Electric Power within its territorial jurisdiction and presently serving approximately over 0.5 Million Customers (Domestic, Commercial, Agricultural, Industrial and others) in the thirty districts of Balochistan. Existing conditions of the QESCO power distribution and transmission system are inadequate to meet rapidly growing demand for electrical power. So the existing power infrastructure has to be improved and upgraded. The overall contribution of power infrastructure requires institutional arrangements, capacity building that support strategic management of the sector, planning and management of investments. To cope with this situation, QESCO through GOP has undergone a Project Financing agreement with Asian Development Bank. ADB has financed the Projects in Tranches (i.e. I, ii, iii & iv). The detail of Tranche-3 sub projects and ADB's financing is as under;
 - i) Construction of 132 KV double circuit transmission line with length of 267 Km form Loralai 220KV Grid station to Muslim Bagh-Khanozai & Psihin-Yaru-Quetta Industrial

Grid Stations. The T/L will pass from four (04) districts of Baluchistan i.e. Loralai, Killa Saifullah, Pishin and Quetta.

ii) Construction of 132 KV double circuit transmission line with the length of 209 Km from Khuzdar 220 KV Grid station to Surab & Kalat-Mangochar-Mastung Grid Stations. The T/L will pass from four (03) districts of Baluchistan i.e. Khuzdar, Kalat and Mastung.

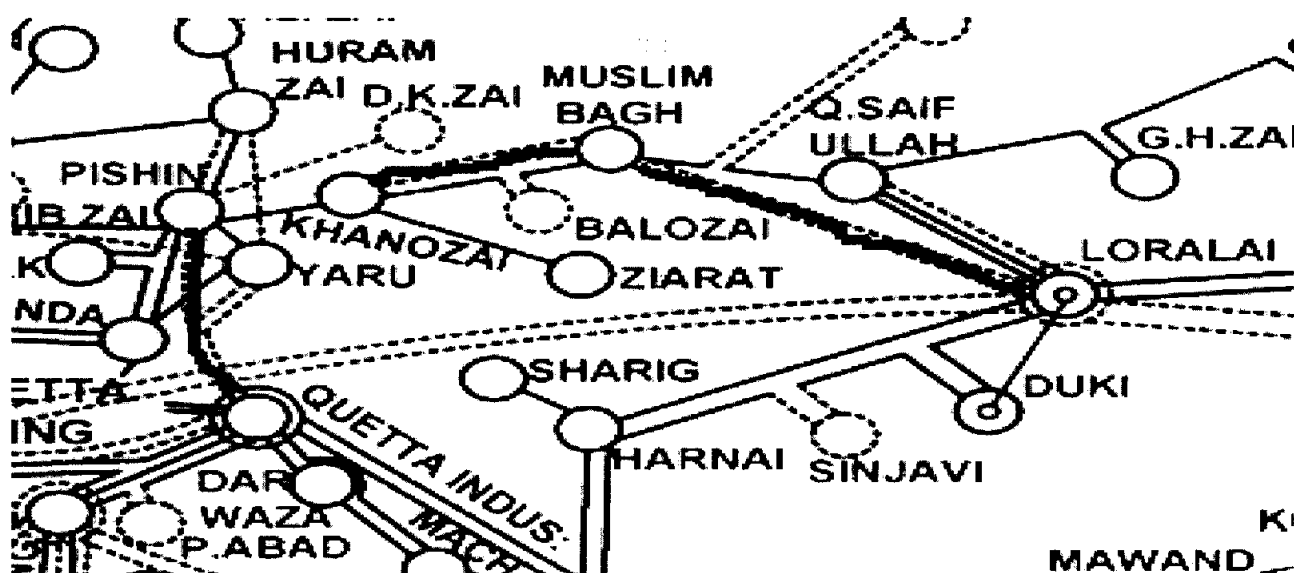

This Project is to help increase the efficiency, reliability, and quality of electricity Power in terms of the overall technical and commercial losses reduction, continuous availability and the improved voltage profile of electricity.

4. The LARPS have been prepared for the construction of two (02) transmission lines. The prepared LARPs have been approved by Asian Development Bank (ADB) and concerned authority. LARPs of both sub projects are translated in Urdu and have been uploaded at QESCO's website within due course of time. LARPs have also been forwarded to the concerned quarters for disclosure at Project sites vide letter No. PMU/QESCO/CE/(Dev)/Tranche-3/12156-64 dated 26-11-2012 (**Annex-A**). The LARPs are incorporated in bidding documents. The E&S team visits the project sites regularly. The last visit was conducted on 7 & 8 of Dec 2016 for Social & environmental monitoring.

Project Impacts and status of Compensation

5. Construction of transmission lines under Tranche-3 Project may affect on crops/fruit trees at very minimum level. The affected crops and trees reported so far are; Wheat, Tomatoes, Onions, Chillies, Almond, Apple, Apricot, Plump etc. The construction work is distributed in different sections.
6. In Loralai to Quetta industrial transmission line the construction work in Loralai- Muslim Bagh section is completed and rout is finalized, in this section 44 APs are compensated for loss of their fruit trees and crops. In Muslim Bagh- Khanozai section rout is finalized and 17 APs have been compensated for the loss of their crops and fruit trees. In Pishin - Quetta section of transmission line the 10-12 Km of rout is still to be finalized & approved by the month Feb, 2016 and 09 APs have been compensated for the loss of their crops and fruit trees so far. Over all in Loralai to Quetta industrial transmission line the 70 APs have been compensated so far.



7. In Khuzdar to Mustung transmission line the rout is finalized in Khuzdar – Surab section and 23 APs have been compensated for the loss of their crops and trees. In Kalat – Mangocher section the rout is finalized and 29 APs have been compensated for the loss of their crops and fruit trees. In Mastung – Mangocher section the rout is finalized and 70 APs have been compensated for loss of crops and fruit trees. Over all in Khuzdar to Mastung

transmission line the route is finalized & approved in Nov, 2016 and 122 APs have been compensated so far. The Cheques of compensation are distributed among APs in presence of representative of concerned Deputy Commissioner of the concerned Districts.

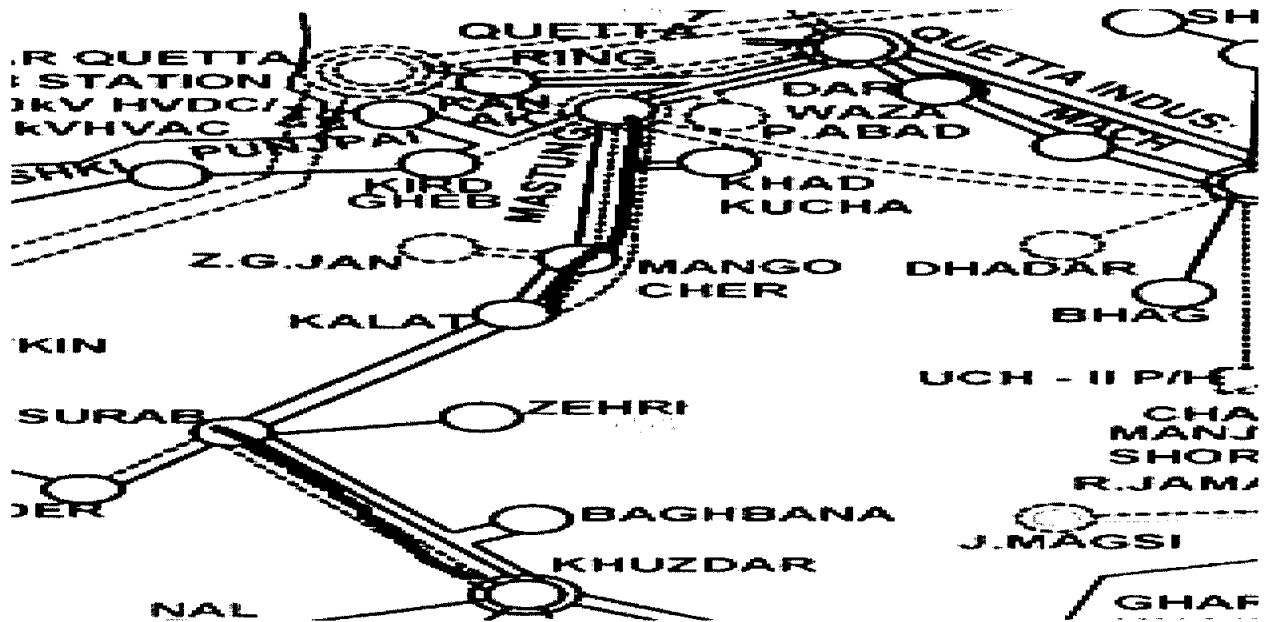

8. Up to date 192 APs have been compensated for their loss of crops/fruit trees in both transmission lines. Contractor and GSC staff of QESCO is instructed to provide the record of remaining APs to accelerate the process of compensation.

Status of Implementation

9. To effectively execute and monitor the project loan No 2972 Power Distribution Enhancement Investment Program (Tranche III), a Project Management Unit (PMU) has been established under Chief Engineer (Development) comprising of four sections i.e. Planning Scheduling & Coordination, Procurement, Project Finance and Environment & Social Safeguard along with Project Director (GSC). Environmental and Social officers have been appointed within effective date but Deputy Manager (E&S) yet to be appointed. However, the post of Deputy Manager (E&S) has been upgraded as Manager (E&S) vide letter No.CEO/QESCO/D.G (HR&Admn)/43951-75 dated 20-08-2014 (**Annex-B**). Manager from Civil Engineering was working as a Manager (Environment & Social Safeguard) and has been retired in Dec 2015. Up to date organization chart for project organization and Environmental & Social Management team is attached as (**Annex-C**).

10. As a result of monitoring it was observed that civil has been started in both transmission lines. The contractor and GSC staff is strictly forbid to start the civil work where compensation is involved / until the affected person is fully compensated for the loss of their crops and trees. At initial stage, the relationship between contractors, owners and lenders is found good. No dispute reported during the said period of time. No land has been acquired permanently for the sub projects of T-III. Most of proposed route for transmission lines is hilly, barren and uncultivated. No physical or economic displacement is involved in T-III sub projects. However, trees/crop compensation is involved at small scale.

Issues affecting payments/LARP implementation:

11. Shortage of GSC staff (Patwari /Qanoongo etc) may affect the LARP implementation schedule. A part from this the Law and Order situation in Balochistan specially project site areas is also worst and affecting the project activities.

Conclusions

12. During the monitoring for said period it is observed that complete route survey for Loralai to Quetta Industrial transmission line has not been finalized and approved. It is expected to be complete by the month of Feb, 2017. With meaningful consultation it is also observed that people of Project areas are happy with construction of transmission lines. It has also been observed that there was partial compliance for employment of the local labors. No land has been acquired for said project. The proposed transmission lines pass through the barren and hilly areas. At very small scale the transmission lines may affect the crops/fruit trees as a result of tower foundation/erection and stringing. 192 cases of crops/fruit trees compensation have been received, processed and compensated so far. A committee has also been constituted to distribute the compensation Cheques among DPs.

Recommendation

- Environment & Social safeguard section should be fully equipped with their basic monitoring tools (independent vehicle, GPS, supporting staff etc) for smooth and timely monitoring. Only digital camera has been provided to E&S staff so far.
- Patwari / Qanoongo should be appointed in QESCO GSC Directorate for proper evaluation of Land record. However, a letter from QESCO HR department has been sent to Revenue department of GoB for appointment of Qanoongo and Patwari on deputation/transfer posting basis.
- There should be on site orientation / capacity building of GSC and E&S staff for implementation of LAR activities more efficiently.

Action Plan

13. Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) has been constituted to resolve the issues, if will arise during the construction activities. Complaint register is placed at QESCO E&S cell for any complaint receives from APs regarding project activities.

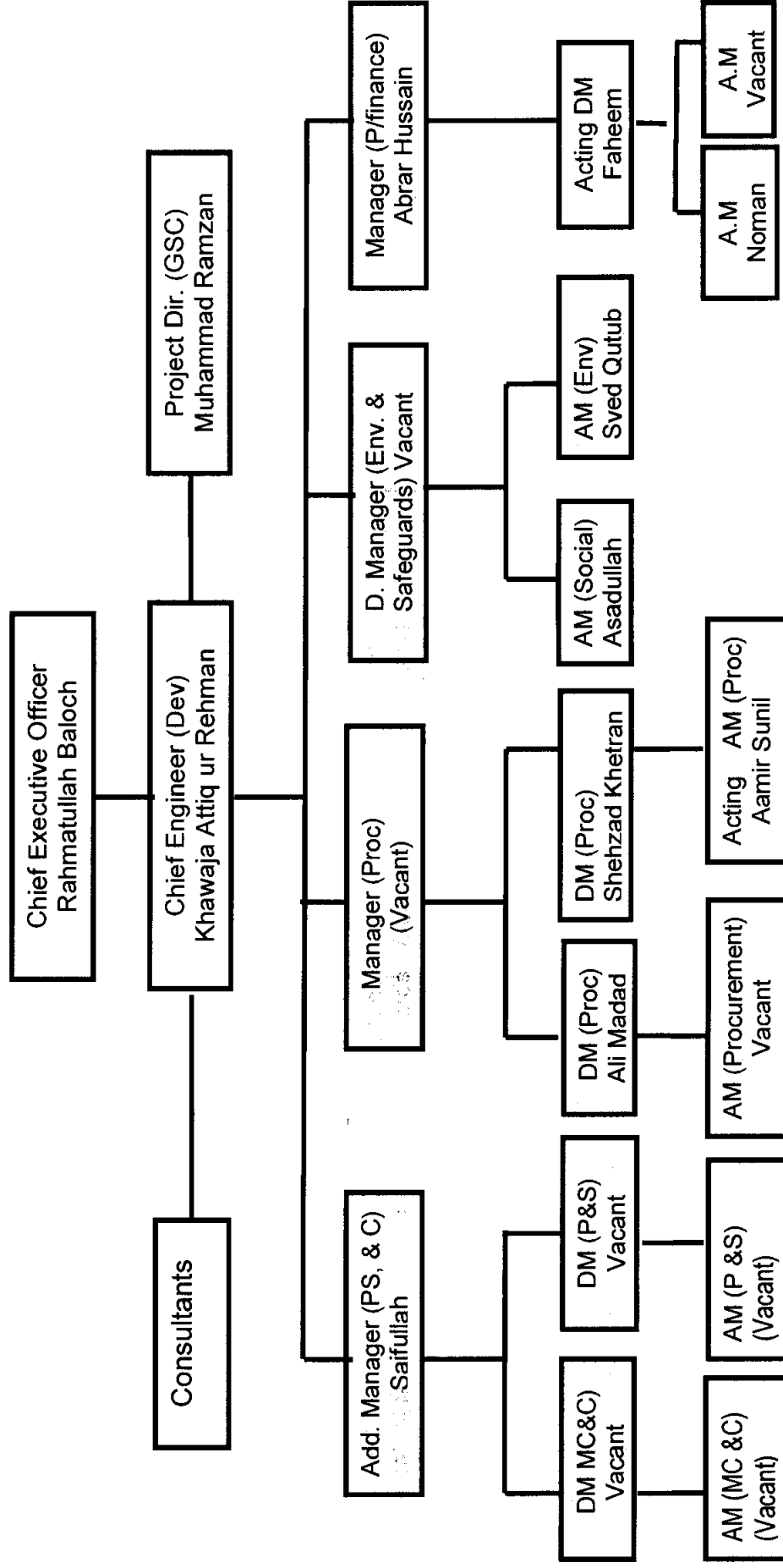

5. After careful review/Examination of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), the Environmental Protection Agency Balochistan, Quetta has decided to accord its Environmental Approval / No Objection Certificate in favour of M/s QESCO subject to the following terms and conditions as laid down in Section 17 & 18 of IEE & EIA Regulation, 2000, subject to the Following conditions.
 - 5.1. Mitigation measure and Environmental Management Plan (EMP) included in the EIA report will be strictly implemented.
 - 5.2. As per legal requirements, specifications, either in lump sum or percentage of the project cost, should be made with regard to Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), before commencement of the construction work, to help in the social uplift of the project area people and community development. Such specification must be shared with Environmental Protection Agency, Balochistan before start of the project.
 - 5.3. Technique should be adopted to minimize noise pollution, oil spill and Environmental problems during the extension and Augmentation of Power Lines.
 - 5.4. Losses incurred by, and damages done to, the local community, in whatever form, must be financially compensated before commencement of the construction work.
 - 5.5. The details and information of the compensation being paid to the project affectees and complete list of the affectees must be shared with EPA which may at any time verify it.
 - 5.6. All precautionary measures should be strictly be adhered to minimize an negative impacts in the area.
 - 5.7. The proponent M/S QESCO should conduct regular environmental monitoring on monthly basis through a third party consultant and that should be shared with EPA.
 - 5.8. All necessary measures should be taken to ensure that the debris of earthwork and stone work does not impede the smooth flow of drainage, canals, streams, rivers or any other water way whatever the case may be.

- 5.9. Compliance of National Environmental Quality Standards (NEQS) should be strictly adhered to.
- 5.10. The proponent, as per laws, should ensure that two trees are planted in case one tree is cut.
- 5.11. The proponent of the project shall resolve all disputes (if any) related to land prior to start of the line transmission.
- 5.12. EPA Balochistan, in order to ensure implementation of environmental laws and conditions of environmental approval (NOC) agreed with the proponent, may at any time visit project area to ascertain whether compliance of the conditional NOC is in place before, during and after construction of the work. Furthermore, the proponent shall make all necessary arrangements for the visiting team of EPA.
- 5.13. Development plan should be in place for the benefit of the people of the project area under intimation to EPA, Balochistan.
- 5.14. This approval does not absolve the proponent from obtaining any other approval that may be required under any law.
- 5.15. Noise level should be controlled to minimum possible level in order to avoid disturbance to the local people
- 5.16. Local community should be given much priority in the project jobs.
- 5.17. The proponent shall be liable for compliance of Sections 13, 14, 17, and 18 of the "PEPA Review of IEE and EIA Regulations 2000" which direct for conditions for approval, confirmation of compliance, entry, inspection and monitoring.
- 5.18. This approval shall be treated as null and void, if the conditions are not complied with



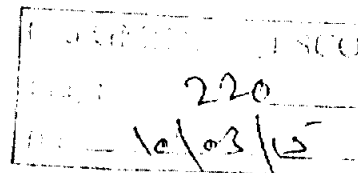

- Grievance Redress activities.

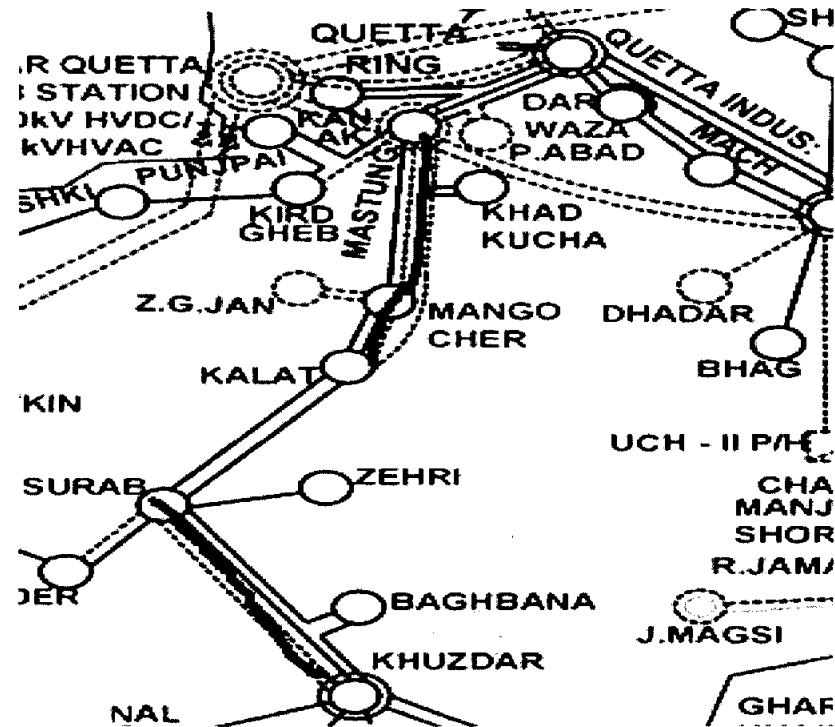

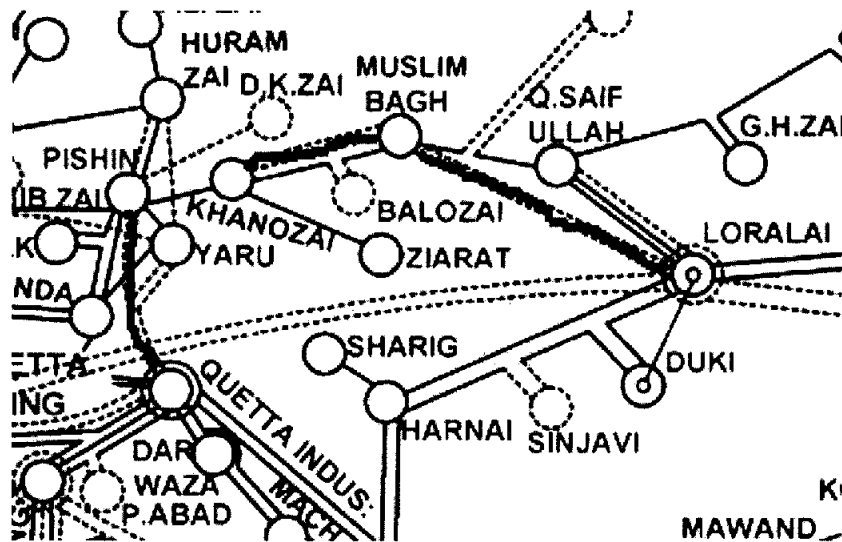

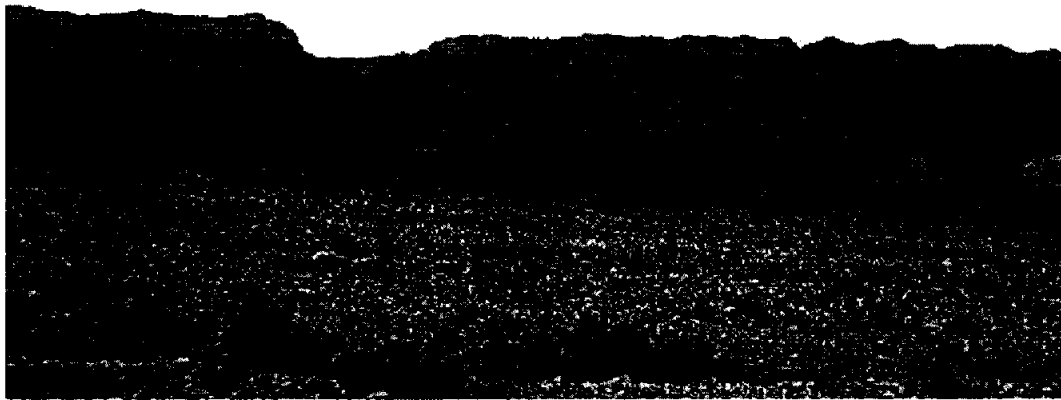
