#### **DEFINITION OF TERMS**

Affected Persons (AP'S)

People (households) affected by project-related (or household) changes in use of land, water or other natural resources Compensation Money or payment in kind to which the people affected are entitled in order to replace the lost asset, resource or income.

Displaced persons.

In the context of involuntary resettlement, displaced persons are those who are physically displaced (relocation, loss of residential land, or loss of shelter) and/or economically displaced (loss of land, assets, access to assets, income sources, or means of livelihood) as a result of (i) involuntary acquisition of land, or (ii) involuntary restrictions on land use or on access to legally designated parks and protected areas.

Compensation

Payment in cash or in kind for an asset or a resource that is acquired or affected by a project at the time the asset needs to be replaced.

Cut-off Date

The completion date of the census of project-displaced persons is usually considered the cut-off date. 

#### 1 INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1- **GEPCO**

Gujranwala Electric Power Company Ltd. GEPCO is a Public Limited Utility Company, established in 1998 under Companies Ordinance 1984 and is responsible for distribution of Electric Power within its territorial jurisdiction and presently serving approximately 2.5 Million Customers (Domestic, Commercial, Agricultural, Industrial and others) in the six districts of Province Punjab (Gujranwala, Narowal, Gujrat, Hafizabad, Sialkot and Mandi-Bahawal-din).



## Project Management Unit (PMU)

1.2 To effectively plan, execute and monitor the Power Distribution Enhancement Investment Program (Tranche-3), a Project Management Unit (PMU) has been established under Chief Engineer (Development) comprising of four sections i.e. Planning, Scheduling & Coordination, Procurement, Finance, Environmental and Social Safeguard along with Project Director (GSC). Organogram of PMU/ Development Directorate is *placed at Annexure-A*.

## 2 **Project Overview**

2.1 GEPCO through GOP has under gone a loan, project and financing agreement with the Asian Development Bank under Power Distribution Enhancement Investment Project Tranche-III in order to strengthen its existing distribution, transmission infrastructure and institutional capacity. - 4.1 There is 01 Contractor M/s Sinosteel Equipment & Engg. Manufacturing Co. engaged by GEPCO to execute civil work activities at sub-project sites (*Photographs of civil works attached at Annexure-B*).
- 4.2 Construction activities and project progress during previous 6 months: The control house building works at Daska & Siranwali grid station have been completed and at other two project sites (Malikwal & Head Marala) is under progress. The structuring works in yard area has been completed and leveling, land filling& civil works of tranches and approach paths is under progress at four project sites (Daska, Head Marala, Siranwali and Malikwal).

- 4.3 The civil works of associated transmission line component has been started at 132kV feeding transmission lines for Siranwali, Daska and Head Marala grid stations.
  - The Foundation& Erection works of 132kV Kotli Loharan- Head Marala &132kV Kot Agha-Siranwali transmission line have been completed and Stringing works is in progress. Whereas the pile Foundation works of 132 kV feeding transmission line Daska have been started. The Foundation works of six no. of locations have been completed so far. The works order for tower foundation of Kuthiala Sheikhan\_Malikwal T/line is under progress.

# 5 Social Monitoring & Management

- 5.1 Clauses regarding Social safeguards have been provided to the procurement section to include in the bidding documents and EMMP & RP is the part of Bidding Document of STG Projects on turnkey basis.
- 5.2 04 No. Draft Land Acquisition and Resettlement Plans LARPs of Malikwal, Head Marala, Siranwali and Daska has been approved by ADB. PMU GEPCO to ensure that all 04 No. LARPs be updated/revised as per current & approved 132kV profile/route map T/line. (Details attached at Annex-C)
- 5.3 Proper implementation of the land acquisition plan and expropriation, including considerations concerning vulnerable groups among land-owners, farmers, and farm workers and minimization of adverse impacts due to the property acquisition and resettlement are mitigated according to the LARP.
- The land for all grid stations is in the possession of GEPCO. No involuntary resettlement is involved as land for Malikwal, Head Marala, Siranwali and Daska is already in GEPCO possession. No compensation is involved in conversion of all four sub-projects, as the land is already in GEPCO possession. However, the allied component 132kV feeding transmission lines for all the four sub-projects is under GEPCO own sources. Compensation for Foundation stage works have already been paid, while for the Erection works is under progress.

5.5 Approved draft LARPs (Land Acquisition and Resettlement Plans), Public Notice in Urdu and English, Complaints Register of Malikwal, H/Marala, Siranwali and Daska has been placed / disclosed at sub-project site. (Details attached at Annex-D). All the

required documents (LARPs, Public Notice and Complaint register) have been handed over to the project site in-charge at under construction grid stations. The project site/camps site/ grid station have been designated as grievance focal points. All the complaints/ grievances received being resolved on site in coordination with GEPCO GRC members.

Pak. Rs. 509,165.00/- have been disbursed/ compensated within 37 No.of AHs till 30<sup>th</sup> December, 2016 for all the allied transmission lines of tranche #3. Table 5.2 shows the detail of LARP implementation cost against each sub-projects and the actual disbursed amount against the no. of affectees of Tr. #3 Sub-Projects.

5.7 Environment and Social training/ workshop conducted at different sites (Siranwali, Head Marala, Daska and Malikwal) grid stations and transmission lines. The capacity building of contractor/ labors/ workers on social issues; workers health, communicable disease, grievance redressal procedure, Compensation process

according to civil works activities, social norms & values of the area, hiring of local CNIC holder labor to avoid child labor, safety issues, use of PPEs, availability of properly equipped first aid boxes, site aesthetic value (segregation of waste materials, water sprinkling, oil leakages and spillages etc.) being carried out twice a year at each project site for smooth working. (detail provided at *Annexure-E*)

- 5.8 Permission/consent from the formers (APs) were taken for civil works activities.
- 5.9 Contractor/workers were instructed to take into the account of local norms & values and hiring of local labor to increase the employment opportunities of the area and avoidance of child labor at project site by keeping the CNIC record of all workers/labor.
- Public Consultation were conducted at different location of allied transmission line component, in which people were informed about the Crops/trees/building damages and their compensation payment and process and finally they were paid compensation for the Foundation stage works. (detail provided at *Annexure-F*)
- 5.11 Verification of kharaba (compensation) payments carried out through random sampling by verifying the actual affectees' name, CNIC, damaged crop/ tree.
- 5.12 GSC staff and on site briefing to the contractor has also be given for effective implementation of LARPs during site visits. The GSC staff which involves in the construction of grid station and transmission line activities has been apprised regarding social aspects of the subprojects. A monthly progress review meeting is carried out in the office of C. E. Dev. (PMU) GEPCO. In which the GSC staff briefed about the LARP implementation and the compensation status. The concerned GSC staff for LARP implementation is as under:
  - Project Director (GSC)
  - XEN Transmission Line Construction
  - SDO Transmission Line Construction
  - Assistant Land Acquisition Officer (ALAO)
  - Qanoongo/ Patwari GEPCO
  - Transmission line Surveyor
- 5.13 GSC (T&G) Division is making assessment payment to the affected persons of feeding transmission line of Malikwal, Head Marala, Siranwali and Daska. Compensation will be paid on actual basis to each affected persons in three stages (construction of foundation and Erection of tower and stringing of conductor).


- Assessment for payments for the feeding lines of Siranwali and Head Marala for Erection Stringing works was carried out in the month of November and December 2016. Whereas, the compensation for Foundation stage works has already been disbursed. After that a noting initiated by the GSC division having affectee's data (Name, CNIC, document of ownership and amount to be paid) for further verification/ audit and approval for disbursement of amount to affectees. Compensation cheques will be disbursed through committee formulated by P.D GSC.
- Internal monitoring of the projects carried out by Environmental and Social Safeguard (E&SS) section PMU, GEPCO on fortnightly basis during the execution phase for the smooth working at projects sites.
- 5.16 Environment and Social training/ workshop conducted at different sites (Siranwali, Head Marala, Daska and Malikwal) grid stations and transmission lines considering the following points; (date & location of workshop snaps)
  - Proper office for sitting arrangements, computer, racks to keep office record.
  - Environmental & social safeguard record (environmental, social reports, Urdu notice etc)
  - Accidents/ incident log book/ register.
  - Copy of Land Acquisition and Resettlement Plan (LARP)
  - Social complaint register
  - Provision of PPEs (helmets, safety shoes, masks, overall)
  - First aid training with first aid box facility (with all medicines)
  - Firefighting drill record and fire cylinders (01 DCP, 01 carbon dioxide)
  - Scrap yard (for collection, segregation of waste)
  - Proper housekeeping (use of tool box kit) no slip, trip & fall hazard.
  - Provision of soil investigation, laboratory test records of air, noise & water at work site.
  - Water sprinkling activity record.
  - Provision of earth leakage circuit breakers (ELCB) and No expose wiring
  - Safety policy in Urdu/ English.
  - Notice in Urdu to affectees in local language.
  - MSDS (material safety data sheets) of used chemicals, oil etc.
  - Observe oil leakage/ spillage from concrete mixing machines.
  - Marking of Smoking & Assembly areas.
  - Provision of attendance, weekly rest & leave record

- Proper drainage for accumulated water in rainy season to avoid waterborne diseases and insects.






