Keeping in view the objective and scope of the SMR, this report addresses the issues related with social safeguards, with reference to the progress achieved and current status of reporting period. This report outlines monitoring implementation of social safeguard activities from January 2016 to June 2016 in accordance with the ADB Safeguard Policies.

Executing Agency	The Executing Agency (EA) for the Investment Program is the Uttarakhand government's Tourism Department. The EA has established the Program Management units (PMU) to execute, manage and monitor the implementation of the Investment Program, and provide overall policy directions. PMU has the mandate to closely supervise and monitor every component under the Investment Program.
Implementing Agency	The Implementing Agency is the Program Management Unit (PMU) of the ongoing Infrastructure Development Investment Programme for Tourism, Uttarakhand). For the execution of work, PIUs have been set up at Dehradun, Bhimtal and Kotdwar.
Monitoring Period Covered	January 2016 to June 2016

Detailed Cost Estimates and Financing Plan under tranche – 3 is estimated to cost US\$ 38.34 million provided by the ADB through Loan No. IND-3223. The investment program outputs will be;

Component 1: Enhanced quality of natural and cultural attractions.

Component 2: Greater participation by local communities in tourism-related economic and livelihood activities.

Component 3: Improved basic urban infrastructure and incidental services at tourist destinations and gateways.

Component 4: Improved connectivity to tourist attractions.

Component 5: Strengthened capacity of sector agencies and local communities for planning, development, management and marketing of tourist destinations and attractions and promoting private sector participation and small businesses.

Impact and Outcome: The expected impact of the Program is increased volume of domestic and international tourists to destinations within the state of Uttarakhand. The expected outcome of the Program is enhanced tourism environment in the state of Uttarakhand. The outputs of the Program are:

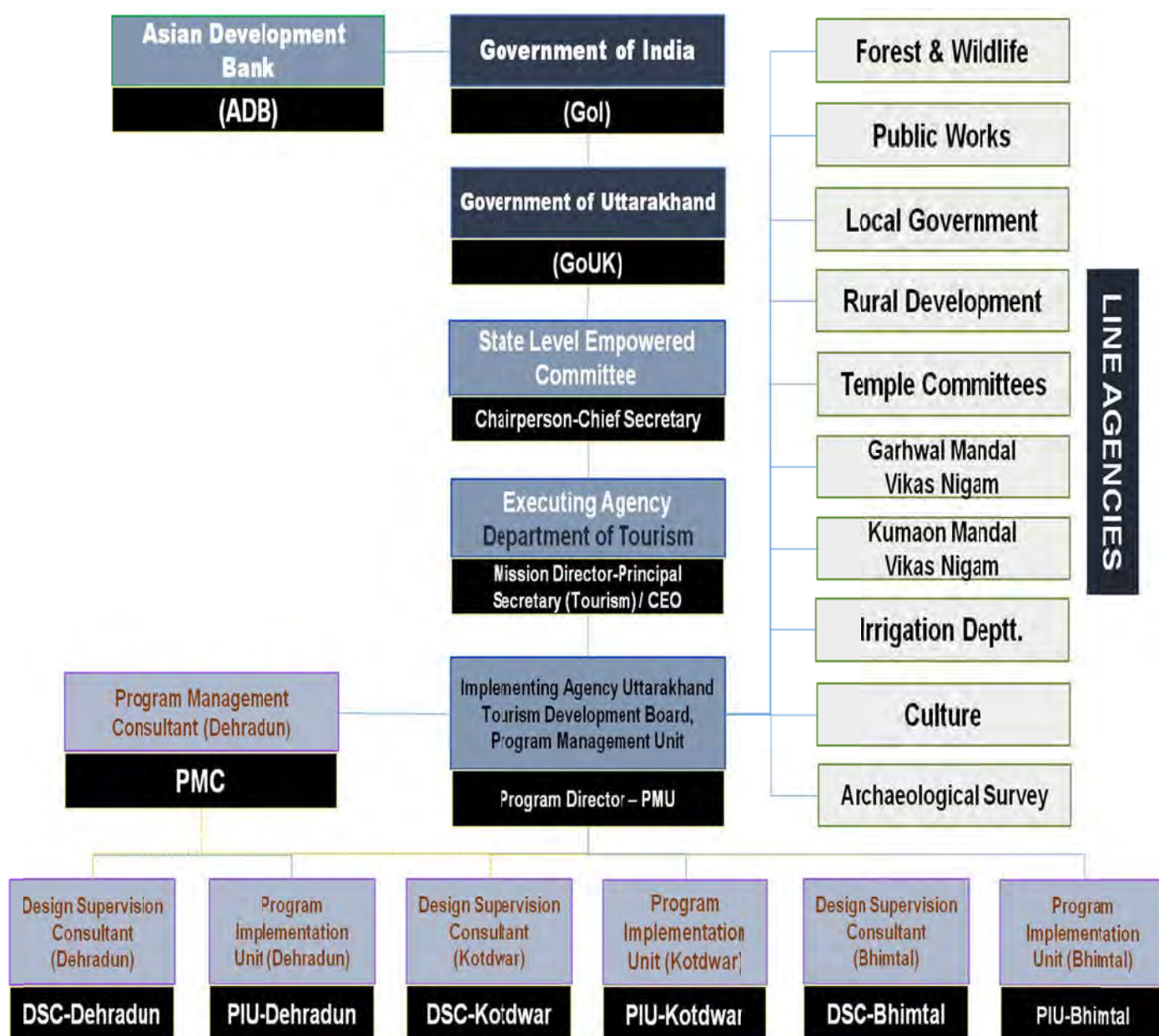
- Improved basic urban infrastructure and services at tourist destinations and attractions.
- Improved connectivity, enhanced quality of natural and cultural attractions, greater participation by local communities in tourism-related economic activities,
- Strengthened capacity of sector agencies and local communities for planning, development, management, and marketing of tourist destinations and attractions,

The Executing Agency (EA) for the Investment Program is Dept. of Tourism, Govt of Uttarakhand. The Loan Agreement and Project Agreement for the IDIPT, Uttarakhand is 2833-IND. Project Implementation Unit have been established in three towns respectively (Dehradun, Bhimtal and Kotdwar) for implementation of sub-projects. Design and Supervision Consultants (DSCs), has already been established in three towns for designing the

Infrastructure, managing the tendering of Contractors and supervising construction, and providing support to the PIUs.

UTDB is the executing agency responsible for overall technical supervision and execution of all subprojects funded under the Program. The Implementing Agency is the Program Management Unit (PMU) of the ongoing Infrastructure Development Investment Programme for Tourism, Uttarakhand, which has been expanded and assigned as the PMU, to coordinate construction of subprojects and ensure consistency across the towns. Project Management Consultancy (PMC), based at Dehradun, supports the overall Investment Program by providing assistance to the Project Management Unit (PMU) at state-level. Three DSCs based at (Dehradun, Bhimtal and Kotdwar) providing support to the concerned PIUs for overall program implementation. Institutional diagram in this regard is shown in figure 1

Purpose of the Report:

1. The purpose of Biannual Social Monitoring Report is to analyze periodically over the total implementation period of the project to comply with the approved Involuntary Resettlement (IR) documents such as Resettlement Plan (RP), Due Diligence Report (DDR).
2. This report covers resettlement and social safeguard monitoring results to comply with the spirit of ADB policy to 'enhance stakeholders trust' in and ability to engage with ADB, and thereby increase the development impact (of projects) in which disclosure of safeguard monitoring is a prominent aspect. This report covers Social Monitoring, addressing all the issues related with social safeguards, with reference to the progress achieved and current status of reporting period.
3. This consolidated report outlines monitoring implementation of social safeguard activities between Jan 2016 to June 2016 in accordance with the ADB Safeguard Policies.

DSC DEHRADUN

In Tranche 3, 3 nos of sub-project has been decided by the SLEC for PIU, Dehradun, Physical works not started yet. Bids are already floated. Detailed project Report (DPR) of all the three sub-project has been made.

Subprojects Categorization under PIU, Dehradun

4. As per SIA in all the areas where works will be executed, It has been confirmed that there is no significant impact. IR Impact was envisaged for one sub-project (UK/IDIPT-III/DDN/01), while for package no (UK/IDIPT-III/DDN/03), DDR was made as per SPS, 2009. The minor impact was anticipated in one package (Development of Tourism Infrastructure in Kartikeya Swami Tranche-III) in terms of temporary loss of livelihood of on 7 shops, as the work will be in front of their shops, resulting to possibility of loss of access for 7 number of days. None of these small business structures are to be demolished. All are Titleholders and belong to General Category.

5. Further it is also confirmed that there are no Indigenous People (IP), no private land acquisition issues and most impacts are temporary in nature, where the livelihood of the people would get impacted (only during the construction period). Necessary compensation as per the agreed Resettlement Framework (RF) will be ensured for temporary losses.

Project Implementation Status

6. Under Tranche 3, 3 subprojects were identified for implementation. Contracts has been awarded for all the three packages. During current reporting period i.e. Jan 2016 to June 2016, **joint site visit of DSC/PIU/PMU was done with project contractor for package no UK/IDIPT-III/DDN/01** for reconfirmation of IR impact, while DDR for package no UK/IDIPT-III/DDN/02/RT was updated after incorporating all the Suggestion given by ADB. RP/DDR for

both the project were submitted to ADB got approved by ADB.(approval letter are attached in **Annexure 9 & 10**) Table- 2 followed by a brief description of current Implementation status of these subprojects.

Orientation program with Project Contractors and Mitigation action

7. Orientation program with Project Contractors was held on dated 4th march and 18th May,2016 after start of civil works in Durgadhar and Tungeshwar and Safeguard issues were deliberated in details. Contractor is suggested by Safeguard Team to avoid the impact on livelihood and maintain access to commercial as well as residential houses and establishment: (i) Proper advance information to be /circulated in the area. (ii) This work should be executed in planned/ phased manner so that temporary inconvenience is avoided. Contractor is advised not to close the road or divert the traffic and the work should be executed on convenient hours / non-peak hours after required consultations with the shop owners.



Scope of Land Acquisition and Resettlement:

8. In Tranche 3 projects of IDIPT Uttarakhand there is no case of permanent land acquisition in any subproject. New construction is proposed on vacant Government land where feasible. There are no significant resettlement issues in the ongoing sub-projects under Tranche III. The minor impact was anticipated in one package (Development of Tourism Infrastructure In Kartikeya Swami Circuit (Lot-1) (Tungeshwar & Durgadhar Temple) in terms of temporary loss of livelihood of on 7 shops, as the work will be in front of their shops, resulting to possibility of loss of access for 7 number of days. None of these small business structures are to be demolished. All are Titleholder and belong to General Category. Provisions for compensation of temporary livelihood losses have been included in this RP in case business interruptions prove to be unavoidable. Thus the impacts are categorized as temporary due to the likely loss of income limited during the construction period only. There are no indigenous people living in the subproject area having attachment to distinct habitation or territories within the subproject areas resulting in IP category "C".

9. Resettlement Plan (RP) was made for one package (Development of Tourism Infrastructure in Kartikeya Swami Circuit (Lot-1) (Tungeshwar & Durgadhar Temple) and also approved by ADB. **(Summary of RP is attached in annexure 1).**

10. It is confirmed that in all the subprojects, which are covered in this report, there are no Indigenous People (IP), no land acquisition issues, and impacts are temporary in nature. The livelihood of the people will get impacted only during the construction activity for which they will be compensated as per the ADB guidelines.

Validation and Reconfirmation of IR Impact.

11. The Resettlement Plan was prepared for the one package (Development of Tourism Infrastructure in Kartikeya Swami Tranche-III (Lot-1Durgadhar & Tungeshwar temples) Tranche-III) in which minor impact was anticipated in terms of temporary loss of livelihood of on 7 shops, as the work will be in front of their shops, resulting to possibility of loss of access for 7 number of days. None of these small business structures are to be demolished. All are Titleholder and belong to General Category. Provisions for compensation of temporary livelihood losses have been included in this RP in case business interruptions prove to be unavoidable.

12. Joint site visit was conducted with PMU/PIU/DSC and Project Contractor in the Tungeshwar Mandir Marg area near Chopta Market on dated 18th May, 2016 for minimize or avoid the impact of commercial establishment adjacent to both side of the road, which will be upgraded under the package (UK/IDIPT/III/DDN/01). During impact assessment, 7 nos of Affected Persons was identified earlier, who are running their petty shops adjacent to the road. During site assessment, project contractor informed that the road is very narrow and congested and it will be very difficult to provide access to these commercial shops and temporary inconveniences will be happen for 6 to 7 days during execution of work. **(Details are attached in Annexure).**

Status of RP Implementation:

13. During this time, in addition to the confirmation of alignment and possible IR impact on DPs identified in SIA(see annexure 2) , identification and verification process of APs, Preparation of identity cards and its distribution, micro plan(annexure 5) and format of notice (See annexure 11). was made by the NGO/ DSC after consultation with PIU. Details of R&R progress are depicted below as Table 5.

COMPENSATION AND INCOME RESTORATION

14. The IA will provide assistance to shop owners in accordance with the entitlements as per agreed framework prepared for this sector loan (see table 6). Adequate provisions have

been made in the RP to cover the losses caused as a result of the disruption of livelihood under the project.

15. As a Rule, affected person will be provided 30 days, and again 1 day, advance notice to ensure minimal disruption in their livelihood and assistance for lost income is provided to them). All 7 shops are commercial in nature. The subproject will seek to minimize resettlement impacts by carrying out civil works at night, in phased manner, and during holidays when shops are closed. Ensuring there is no income or access loss during subproject construction is the responsibility of contractors. Consistent with the initial environmental examination, contractors will ensure: leaving spaces for access between mounds of soil, providing walkways and metal sheets to maintain access across trenches for people and vehicles where required, increased workforces to finish work in areas with impacts on access, timing of works to reduce disruption during business hours, phased construction schedule and working one segment at a time and one side of the road at a time.



16. Provisions for compensation of temporary livelihood losses due to loss of access/disruption of livelihood have been included in this RP in case business interruptions prove to be unavoidable. Resettlement assistance to affected persons will be disbursed prior to commencement of civil works. During RP implementation, if the affected person desire, efforts will be made to provide employment to affected persons by facilitating their engagement through the civil works contractor. However, during consultations the affected persons expressed unwillingness for alternate income generation activities and employment in construction works.

Public participation and consultation

17. A series of meetings and consultations were held with the APs and other stakeholders on the project, entitlement options, impacts etc. were held on different stretches during RP preparation and implementation. NGO involve in community activities conducted series of consultation with villagers. **Details are attached in annexure 4.**

<p>Series of Consultation and meeting with APs was held by the Social Expert of DSC and issue discussed are related to R&R Implementation Activities, Opening of Bank A/c and Disbursement of Assistance. It communicated to PIU that 30 days notice would be provided to APs before Civil Works initiate (in that section) and disbursement would be completed prior to the start of Civil Work by Contractor.</p>	
<p>Meeting with Pradhan and villagers was held on 18th May, 2016 and explained them about the project components and Safeguard Policy of ADB. PIU also described the role and responsibility of villagers and need for establish village level committee for operation and maintenance of project assets and resolve the grievances at panchayat level.</p>	

Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM)

18. A Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) has been established following the Resettlement Frameworks (RF) of the project with the objective of receiving and facilitating the resolution of complaints & grievances by APs. The GRM is scaled to the risks and adverse impacts of the project. It should address APs concerns and complaints promptly, using an understandable and transparent process that is gender responsive, culturally appropriate, and readily accessible to all segments of the APs at no cost and without retribution.

19. For resolving the grievance, three tier structure was formed in the IDIPT, Dehradun.

- (I) **Village Grievance Committee:** The VGC will include members of Self Help Groups (SHGs), Line Agencies, representative of Gram Panchayat, Special invitee etc. A time frame of two weeks has been allotted to settle the matter.
- (II) **Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) at PIU-** In each PIU there are one GRC, which include Project Manager (PIU), District Tourist Officer, Department of Tourism Govt. Of Uttarakhand, Community/Social Development Officer of PIU,. The committee headed by Project Manager, PIU. The committee meets at least once in every month. Agenda of meeting shall be circulated to all the members and affected persons/aggrieved party along with venue, date and time; inform in writing at least 7 days in advance of meeting. The matter shall remain with GRC at PIU level for one month and if grievance is not resolved within this time period, the matter shall be referred to GRC at PMU.
- (III) **GRC within Environmental and Social Management Cell (ESMC) at PMU-** There is one GRC in PMU. The matters not resolved by the GRC at PIU level within one month shall come under GRC, PMU. It will include Community/Social Development Specialist, Safeguard Specialist Environment as members and Additional Program Director (APD) PMU as Chairman. The committee shall look

into the matters, which are referred to and not resolved by GRC, PIU. If the matter is not resolved by the GRC, PMU level within one month of time, the aggrieved person/party can bring the matter to the Executive Committee/State Level Empowered Committee (SLEC) of IDIPT.

Approach to GRC: Affected person/aggrieved party can approach to GRC for redress his/her grievances through any of the following modes:

(i) **Web based:** A separate corner will be developed at the program website so that public / community/ displaced person can register their complaint in the online column.

(ii) **Telecom based:** A toll free no. Will be issued by the PMU/ PIU so that general public can register their complaint through telephone / mobile phone to the PIU/PMU office

20. PIUs, Contractor and NGO have been entrusted with the responsibility to maintain a proper register of the grievance (if any) which will be endorsed by the all agencies involved in implementation. GRC registers are in place at the towns.

21. In this quarter, a minor grievance was lodged by one AP near Mandir Marg, Tunheshwar Temple. During recent visit on 18th May, 2016, along with PMU and PIU Safeguard team, written grievance was received by Mr. Bijay Singh Negi s/o Dasam Singh (who are operating their Stationary shop in the premises, which was vacant after the death of Jeet Singh Negi) for including their name in the list of Affected Persons. (see Annexure 6) The issues was also discussed in Village Grievance Committee and recommended by PMU level committee for inclusion of their name in the list of APs and accordingly provide assistance in case their livelihood would be impacted. (see Annexure 7)

22. Monitoring Results Up to the reporting period, no land acquisition and significant resettlement (structure losses, etc) issues were found for any of the Subproject. Up to this reporting period Physical works started only in Package no-(UK/IDIPT-III/DDN/01). The project areas have been visited by the safeguard team along with PMU/PIU, Contractor to identify/confirm the impacts in terms of resettlement and rehabilitation and other safeguard issues. Presently the works are going on in vacant premises of Temple Trust. As per discussion with project contractor, works will commence in the areas of APs after rainy season.

23. After confirmation of IR impact near Main Gate of Tungeshwar Temple, all the details (photos, ID proof, account details) has been taken from Affected Household. Format of notice has also developed after consultation with PMU/PIU/PMC.

Future Monitoring Action Plan:

- In tranche 3 sub-projects, Resettlement issues were identified only for one nos of sub-project and Due Diligence Reports were made for remaining sub-projects. In order to identify any social impact, due to the Project implementations, the Safeguard Consultant of DSC will visit the project sites
- Disbursement of compensation to all 7 nos of DP identified under package (UK/IDIPT-III/DDN/01).
- Consultation and meeting will be held with DPs as well as stakeholders (Temple Trust, Village Panchayat members).

Status of Labour at Site:

24. A Site visit was conducted to observe the site conditions, availability of labor, engagement of female workers and basic facilities (Lodging, drinking water, Sanitation etc) available for them in the site, health and safety management at site.

25. Total 28 laborers are engaged in construction activities. Among them 2 are Female workers. Some labors are working with safety. All the sites are Barricaded. Labor camp is also made by the contractor. Tanker is coming alternate day for drinking and other utility purpose. No Toilet was visible at site. Contractor is maintaining the attendance register.

26. Following instructions were given to the contractor.

- Separate toilet for men and women should be at site

- DSC Expert also motivated the Female workers to wear helmet and boot for self safety.
- Contractor is instructed to provide cooking gas/Cylinder to the laborers and avoid the use of wood for cooking.
- Sign boards should be at different locations with contact numbers for concerns/ complaints
- All the emergency number in hindi script should be available at site for emergency prevention
- All safety rules at work, and provision of adequate health and safety measures such as water, food, sanitation, personal protective equipment, workers insurance, and medical facilities.
- Accident and Grievances Register should be maintained at sites.
- Dust bins for the collection of refuse should be provided and also integrate solid waste collection and disposal system for whole site



Gender Issues in Tranche-3 Project:

27. The overall the objective of this Project to supports the state's plans for restructuring its tourism sector in a pro-poor manner with a view to increasing benefits to local communities and improving the management of its tourism destinations.

28. The projects supported by the ADB also require project-specific Gender Action Plan (GAP) which mirrors each project component with targets for women's participation and access to project benefits and gender design features with time-bound actions, monitoring indicators and budget allocation.

29. Awareness on Gender and social issues is being carried out and regularly instructions are issued to the Contractors for any gaps if any on Gender aspects. Follow up to the instructions are being carried out with several site inspections and interaction with Contractor's representatives.

Institutional Arrangements:

The Dept. of Tourism is the executing agency responsible for overall technical supervision and execution of all subprojects funded under the Program. The Implementing Agency is the Program Management Unit (PMU) of the ongoing Infrastructure Development Investment Programme for Tourism, Uttarakhand), which has been expanded and assigned as the PMU, to coordinate construction of subprojects and ensure consistency across the towns. The PMU is assisted by the Project Management Consultant (PMC) who manages the Program and assures technical quality of the design and construction.

For the execution of work, PIUs have been set up at Kotdwar. The PIU is headed by a Project Manager and the social safeguards issues are under the purview of Community Development Officer (CDO) posted at each PIU. The PIU Head will report to PMU. The CDO at PIU will report to PIU Head and seek guidance with regard to resettlement plan implementation from CSDS at PMU and will be main link between the RP implementation agency, DPs and PMU. The Design and Supervision Consultants (DSC), who are designing the Infrastructure, managing the tendering of Contractors and supervising construction, support the PIUs. The Safeguard Specialists of the DSC together with the Community/Social Development Officer of PIUs provide guidance for the implementation of Resettlement Plans.

8. Grievance Redress mechanism:

GRC has been established. A grievance of the public and, particularly, the DPs is first brought to the notice to the implementing NGO and Safeguard Expert of DSC, which will be forwarded to the PIU. Grievances not redressed by the PIU will be referred to the PMU level, who will, based on review of the grievances, address them in consultation with the Community/Social Development Specialist of the PMU. Should the grievance remain unresolved, the Project Director, will refer the issue to the State level empowered committee, which will act as Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) for the Facility. The GRC will resolve the issue within one month from the date of registration of any case in the GRC. A detailed verification survey was conducted for the implementation of RP for 35 APs between October and December 2015 and February 2016. The verification survey considered the final alignment of ROW as per drawing and work schedule of contractor and identified 15 DPs. Based on 15 DPs a Micro Plan has been prepared. The same has been approved by PMU on the basis of further verification made by a Joint team of PIU, PMU, PMC and DSC representative. The Micro Plan was approved by PMU for preparation and distribution of ID-cum Entitlement cards and followed collection of requisite document for preparation of cheques for assistance and followed by disbursement and clearance of stretch for handing over to contractor for civil construction. The signed ID-cum entitlement card [signed by three parties (AP, PIU, PMU)] has been handed over to AP. The disbursement of compensation was done through cheque by CDO PMU with the assistance from Sh. Amit Bhardwaj, CDO and In charge Project Manager/PIU Kotdwar and Sh. Arup Khan, Social Safe Guard Specialist, /DSC Kotdwar, Sh. Keshab Chandra, Support /DSC Kotdwar on 19/03/2016. The cheque for assistance was distributed to 14 APs. During the period between April and June 2016, a set of 12 people submitted their grievances and requested to consider them as APs and pay the compensation to them also. Joint site verification has been done by Sh. Amit Bhardwaj, CDO and In charge Project Manager/PIU Kotdwar and Sh. Arup Khan, Social Safe Guard Specialist, /DSC Kotdwar, Sh. Mutalib, Support Engineer /DSC Kotdwar on 16/06/2016 after completion of RP and engineering drawing based verification. 10. RP Implementation and Clearance of encumbrance free Stretch

As per ADB policy the encumbrance free stretch needs to be handed over to the contractor after disbursement of compensation. It can be seen from previous section that compensation was disbursed to all eligible APs. After disbursement of compensation a detailed consultation was conducted with the APs and an undertaking has been taken from the APs regarding vacating the stretch in order to avoid dispute in future and to continue the

smooth civil construction. The undertakings signed by the APs are presented in **annexure 5**. The signature sheet of attendance of consultation is presented in **annexure 6** and photographs of encumbrance free stretch is presented in **annexure 7**.

11. Freezing of verification process certification by APs

As per annexure 6 of approved RPs, there were 37 APs. The verification process identified 15 eligible APs for which compensation disbursement has been completed, the rest of the APs are recommended to be excluded, the reason being either non-traceable or falling outside the project ROW as per four consecutive verification surveys conducted during the period between Oct 2015 and February 2016 by PIU, PMU, PMC, DSC and contractors representative. A consultation with 13 APs who has received assistance were carried out on 19/3/2016 and certification was obtained from them with a statement that "This to certify that the following Kiosks/ squatters with the following are not available in the location for the following reasons. Hence from the point of view of freezing the identification, verification, and preparation of micro plan they may be treated as cancelled/ Not Available. We also certify that if they turned up in any future date and made any claim of assistance they will collect the certificate from us". In case in future date any APs as per the list of RP or any other situation like design modification, final staking of ROW of the contractor etc. ,the situation will be dealt as per Clause number 10 of the entitlement matrix on case by case basis. Signed/certified Freezing document is placed in **annexure 8**.

12. Other Safeguards Compliance Monitoring:

For the subproject of tranche 3, UK/IDIPT- III/KOT/01, Creation of Pedestrian Route for Pilgrims and Tourists in Haridwar, the contractors provided the facilities provided to the labour. The crèches facilities, drinking water, toilet etc. are also provided by the contractor for the children of the women labourer who are staying in the labour camp. On labour camp potable drinking water, sanitation facilities are provided by the contractor. In the context of equal wages the women labourers are receiving equal wages as men which is Rs.280 for unskilled and Rs.450 for semi-skilled. The total strengthen of women labour is satisfactory. As sample, the photographs of the labour register indicating the deployment of women labourer is presented in **annexure 9** in addition to the table below:

Sub Project (vi) Restoration and Adaptive Reuse of Pithoragarh Fort Phase II

During July, 2015 to December, 2015, the Due Diligence Report (DDR) was prepared for one project "Restoration and adaptive reuse of Pithoragarh phase II Under tranche- III (Package No. UK/IDIPT-III/BHT/01)" and submitted to the concerned authorities.

The DDR was prepared in consultation with the stakeholders through organizing various meetings and individual interviews. Consultations were held with the officials of the District Administration, Pithoragarh, Nagar Palika Parishad, Department of Tourism, public representatives, hotel owners, tourists etc also, on project orientation, issues pertaining to land acquisition problems and addressing the current gaps in provision of basic services and improvement of tourist infrastructure. Public consultations with the primary and secondary stakeholders were also conducted to understand the local issues and public views regarding the possible impact. The issues were like, awareness and extent of the project development components, benefits of project for the tourist as well as community, labourers availability in the project area or requirement of outside labourers, involvement, local disturbances due to project construction work, necessity of tree felling etc. at project site, water logging and drainage problem if any, drinking water problem, forest and sensitive area nearby the project site etc. During subproject preparation, consultations were held with the official representatives of the line agencies, apart from the communities nearby project area.

As per the Due Diligence Report in respect of the said sub project, it is concluded that the proposed infrastructure improvements would not change substantially the present land use. There would be no issues of land acquisition and resettlement related to the subproject. All developmental works would be done on vacant government land for which the concerned stakeholders have already issued the NOC. Due to project intervention, there would be no loss of income to any person or any asset, either privately owned or publicly owned. However, in case of any claim or complaint during the construction period, an effective and efficient Grievance Redress Mechanism would be formed which would enhance the provision of timely and sensible hearings and facilitate solutions. This information has been disseminated during public consultations with stakeholders including local masses of the project area.

There are no indigenous people present at the site, therefore there would be no impact on Indigenous people (IP). All the proposed construction activities would be done on the Government land. This is categorized as "C" for Indigenous Peoples. No Indigenous People Plan (IPP) would be needed under this sub-project.

Similarly, this sub project would not have any adverse impact on women except some positive potential employment scope. However, as a part of social due diligence, focused group discussions were carried out among the women groups in the surrounding areas of the project site to create awareness among the upcoming development activities and their livelihood opportunities that are likely to come up.

It is to conclude that based on the consultations and site visits, there is no physical or economic, temporary or permanent, IR impact of the said sub project. No person or community is being adversely affected due to this sub-project. No land or asset acquisition is necessitated in this sub-project. So, people and communities would not be physically or economically displaced due to the sub-project interventions. No CPR will also be affected. Poor, indigenous and other ethnic groups are not being adversely impacted.

The agreement has been signed with the contractor M/s Cox Infratech Pvt Ltd (JV) and contractor has been mobilized.

Site Visit Outcome

Field visits were undertaken to all the project sites under construction at Bhimtal and Pithoragarh. Based on the visits to the working sites and discussions held with the different stakeholders including PIU representatives, contractors, local masses and labourers, following points emerged:

This sub project has been awarded on 04-06-2016 to M/s COX INFRATECH PRIVATE LIMITED in JV with CONAECH ASSOCIATES SB-106 Gulmohar Tower, Chiranjeev Tower, Ghaziabaad (U. P.). The agency has already mobilized the man power and initiated the construction activities in the field. Based on the field visits and discussions with the different stakeholders by Social and Environment Safeguards Experts, following points emerged:

- At the time of field visit nobody from the agency side was available at the site. However, the contractor has removed the roof structure of some of the quarters in proposed tehsil/staff quarters premise and this material is under locked in one of the quarters.
- It was informed that the construction activities in full swing will start after the rainy season is over.
- Removal of the waste material from the premises is an important issue as contractor has not been assigned a suitable place for its dumping. It was informed that as per the instructions of the local administration, contractor has been asked to dump the waste material in the fort premises.
- Regarding shifting of shops at parking site, discussions were held with the shopkeepers and it was mutually decided for the construction work of the shops which are to be allotted to them by the Nagar Palika is currently under progress and they will be shifting to that place at earliest. They are expecting the allotment of new shop to them shortly. The site of constructing these shops was also visited and found that the foundation of pillars is under progress. It is heartening to mention that people cooperating and ready for shifting their shops to the new place.

Good practices in RP implementation is presented below:

- All data were collected through 100% Census /surveys so that everyone affected is covered.
- Detailed entitlement matrix established to compensate for all kinds of losses.
- Provision made in the RF for Livelihood assistance to all non-titleholders also.
- For resolving Grievances, three tier structures were formed in the IDIPT, Dehradun. The GRC at village, PIU PMU level has been well established to resolve the Grievances.
- People in general cooperate as they understand that after execution of this project, tourist inflow will increase. The visitors will spend more time to see the natural beauty of this site, use the facilities and pay for them, which will help in improving economy of this area. It will also be a good income source for Uttarakhand Tourism.
- Consultation and informal discussion with stakeholders and general public is going on in regular basis by the PIU and DSCs in their respective areas.
- All the Institutional Arrangement has been well established for compliance of ADB safeguard policy.

Lessons learnt

- Dissemination of information and transparency in monetary disbursement is essential.
- Employment generation by making mandatory for contractors to employ local labourers for construction works (unskilled works mainly) wherever applicable.

- Frequency of GRC meetings should be more and one review Meeting should be organized every month.
- Safeguard trainings and workshops to be conducted at PMU level for interaction and discussion among all stakeholders of IDIPT including PIUs and contractors and NGO representatives.
- Site visits to sort out issues if any which needs attention.

Annexure 1: Summary of Resettlement Plan (UK/IDIPT-III/DDN/01)

1. The Infrastructure Development Investment Program for Tourism under Multitranché Financing Facility (the Facility) will develop and improve basic urban infrastructure and services in the four participating states viz. Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Uttarakhand and Tamil Nadu—to support the tourism sector as a key driver for economic growth. It will focus on: (i) strengthening connectivity to and among key tourist destinations; (ii) improving basic urban infrastructure and services, such as water supply, road and public transport, solid waste management and environmental improvement, at existing and emerging tourist destinations to ensure urban amenities and safety for the visitors, and protect nature and culture-based attractions. Physical infrastructure investments will be accompanied by: (iii) capacity building programs for concerned sector agencies and local communities for better management of the tourist destinations and for more active participation in the tourism-related economic activities, respectively.
2. Dept of Tourism, Govt of Uttarakhand has decided to provide the facilities for the tourist as well as local through upgrading the existing premises of the three temple and its nearby areas, which has enormous potential for rural tourism as the region has rich cultural and historical background. During initial assessment, it was observed that lack of tourism infrastructure were found on the way to Kartikeya Swami circuit, such as: midway facilities, toilet facilities, parking, signage, tourist reception centre and tourist interpretation centre. Two more temples Durga Dhari and Tungeshwar Mahadev found suitable at the same route, were also taken into consideration. These temples have significant importance as tourists stay and visit the surroundings during the journey of Kedarnath and Badrinath.
3. **Present Status of Temple and its surroundings:** The temple complex has a dilapidated approach road, lack of parking space, inappropriate waste disposal system and inadequate and rundown other visitor/ tourist facilities and services. The existing visitor facilities like toilets and drinking fountains are underutilized due to improper functioning. There is lack of designed parking lots. There is lack of directional and informational signage.. The approach road towards the temple complex is in a dilapidated condition. There is lack of visitor information system.
4. **Location of Temple:** The sub project area falls under Rudraprayag District. The Durga Dhari temple is on the banks of the Alaknanda River in the Garhwal Region of Uttarakhand state, located in Kalyasaur along the Srinagar -Badrinath Highway. It is about 15 km from Srinagar, Uttarakhand, 20 kms from Rudraprayag District. Tungeshwar temple is 7 km from Durga Dhar and situated in the village, Phalasi, It is located 48 KM towards South from District headquarters Chamoli Gopeshwar and 167 KM from State capital Dehradun. Kartikeya Swami temple located near Kanak Chauri village on Rudraprayag – Pokhari route and around 40kms from Rudraprayag.
5. **Project Benefits:** Government of Uttarakhand has applied for ADB loan for development of adequate infrastructure facilities within the Temple premises and its surroundings, to increase the influx of tourists as well as locals for contributing to overall economy of the state. The subproject is expected to increase the tourist, generates employment opportunities for young people and for people interested in surrounding villages. As tourism increases, there will be more opportunities for develop of retail, restaurant and entertainment options, transport services, and it generate more income. It provides opportunities for the residents of nearby villages to interact with other people, lifestyles and cultures. Overall, Improving basic infrastructure and services will definitely attracts provides a rich experience for tourists, economic benefits to the local people and support to the reserve.

6. **Scope and objective of the RP:** The overall objective of the study is to assess the adverse impacts of the project on property and life of people and also prepare a time bound resettlement action plan to assist the project affected persons (PAPs) in getting their entitlements (compensation - for affected land, structure and other properties and assets and R&R assistances) to enable them in improving or at least restoring their living standards and income earning capacity.
7. **Minimization of Resettlement Impacts:** With considering sub-project criteria" sub-project with significant resettlement impact will not be financed by the Investment Program"works was finalized after the meeting with Local body,Panchayat, Temple Trust members,availability of land of govt/Panchayat/Temple Trust. After the finalization of Scope,design was made in such a way that IR impact will be minimal.Maximum number of works(Sitting arrangement,Drinking Water, Sanitation,SWM etc) will be carried out within the campus of temple premises.During upgradation and railing works of the pathway connectivity to the temple, provision has been made in the DPR that improvements will be carried out within the existing width of the pathway and ,widening works will be done only in those stretch,where available vacant land of Panchayat/Temple are available
8. Transect walk conducted in all the areas where works to be executed.and it was shown that no adverse impact of the project will be anticipated. Works will be executed within temple premises, and available vacant land of Temple Trust and Panchayat.Design was make in such a way that will not result in any impacts to structures (both residential and commercial structures), and common properties too. Some temporary livelihood disturbances may be occur to the shopowners as work will be executed infront of their shops and resulting loss of access for couple of days. The details of impacts is described in Chapter "Scope of Land Acquisition and Resettlement".
9. **Project Impact Zone:** Impact was identified only 50 mtr stretches of the total 1.5 km pathway from Main entrance to Tungeshawar temple.. All the shops are commercial in nature and situated infront of the entrance gate.
10. The Resettlement Plan (RP) has been prepared to address the involuntary resettlement impacts occurring due to the Development of Tourism Infrastructure Facilities at Kartikeya Swami circuit, Uttarakhand under Tranche 3. The subproject covers the following scope of works:
11. **Kartikeya Swami:** (i) The development of the 3km pathway to the main shrine using natural stone paving,and provision of railings at places, viewing decks and rest sheds on the route.(ii) Improvement in the temple complex, including repair works for the roofs and existing Dharamsala. Seating arrangement and stone benches within the temple complex.(iii) Signage at strategic places –both informative and directional, Toilet facilities (iv) Landscaping of the entrance areas, (v) Restoration of Temple premises(vi) Development of Camping site(vii) Construction of retailing wall and breast wall along with pathway(viii) Construction of entrance gate(ix) Development of Solar lighting and Fire Fighting work(x) Development of Pathway covering shelter. (xi) Capacity building for temple committee members for O&M activities.
12. **Durgadhari Temple precinct:** (i) Upgradation of infrastructure in the settlements around the approach area of the temple, including drinking water facilities and sanitation(ii) Parking facility and vehicular approach along with adjoining retaining walls, Solid waste management(iii) Pathway development with railings & protection wall wherever necessary and signage and seating and lighting Temple entrance arch(iv) Improvement of the temple complex in terms of restructuring of the newly added temporary structures and overall landscaping to facilitate better movement and space for gathering of pilgrims and tourists (v) Lodging facilities with rooms and dormitories and toilet block at the rear side of the temple

complex and a langar hall, Area confinement with edge wall, viewing decks etc, , Restoration of Temple premises. (vi) Construction of C.C road (main road to Temple,400 mtr length with drain. (vii) Development of Solar lighting and Fire Fighting work. (viii)Capacity building for temple committee members for O&M activities.

13. Tungeshwar temple precinct: (i) Entrance area development with appropriate signage (ii) Development of the 1.5km long pathway to the main temple,with railing increase in width and edge protection wherever required(iii) Seating arrangements , viewing decks and toilet facilities, Signage works along the pathway and Temple premises (iv) Improvement in the temple precinct, Lodging facilities and langar hall (v) Improvement in the drinking water facility for the approach areas. (vi)Construction of entrance gate.(vii) Development of Solar lighting and Fire Fighting work. (vii) Capacity building for temple committee members for O&M activities.
14. Summary of Resettlement Impact: The project will not acquire land under the Indian (The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013,(LARRA, 2013). All the works will be undertaken in vacant land owned by government (Temple Trust and Village Panchayat). All necessary no-objection certificates (NOCs) has been obtained from Panchayat and Temple Trust for Infrastructure development works in Durgadhar and Tungeshwar Precinct. Land records verified by Revenue Inspector are also attached in RP.
15. Based on detailed design and Detailed Project Report ,which was began in the month of Oct,2014 and Completed in the first week of Dec,2014,census and socio-economic survey1 conducted to the DPs,which was identified during transect walk in the month August,14 . As per final design and DPR, civil works will not result in any permanent impact to common properties, residences and commercial structures. However, during development of the 1.5km long pathway with railing from main entrance to main temple (Tungeshwar), temporary livelihood impact may be on 8 commercial activities , as the work will be carried out in front of their shops, resulting to possibility of blockage of access for 7 days during construction. The existing width of this particular street is around 3 to 5 mtr. As far as temporary livelihood impacts are concerned, will be caused due to blockage of access during works execution. It was predicted that due to blockage of access, customer ratio will be definitely decreased and income of Shopkeepers will be affected during execution of works. The shops are adjacent to the pathway. Efforts will be made during execution time to minimize the impact by scheduling civil works at night and phases. None of these small business structures are to be demolished. Provisions are made in the DPR that the work of railing incensement and edge protection will be made wherever available land is available. During conducting census and socio-economic survey,, it was noticed that one nos of DP(S.No-2 of draft RP) has expired in the month of Sept,14 and their shop has been closed. .Consultation was made with his family members and they are not interested to continue the same occupation . Presently this structure is not being used for any activity and no one is operating from the premises now. Even though this has been included in the final count in the RP for confirmation.
16. One additional DP has identified as per detailed design, as their occupation may be disrupted during construction/Upgrdation of main entrance gate of Tungeshwar Temple. Out of 8 DP,3 nos of DP have their own structure, which is being used by them for commercial purposes, while 4 DPs are paying rent to the owners for using their structure for commercial activities and paying monthly rent (Rs.500-700/month). Provisions for compensation of temporary livelihood losses have been included in the RP in case business interruptions prove to be unavoidable. No NTH were identified in project areas. During consultation, it was informed by the villagers that during the festival of Shivratri, Janamastmi, Sawan Maas, Maagh Maas,and Navratri, masses comes and stay few days and that time few vendor/hawkers comes nearby temple areas for selling fruits/cosmetic/worship goods etc.

During transect walk, no Non-titleholders were identified with project areas. If the work will be executed during festival season in the locality, where vendor/hawkers comes and impact will be anticipated, all those will be considered as a DPs and RP will be revised. Thus the impacts are categorized as temporary due to the likely loss of access/disruption of livelihood limited during the construction period only. 17. **Categorization:** This subproject has been categorized as “B” for Involuntary Resettlement (IR) impact as per the ADB’s Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009. This resettlement plan (RP) is based on final design and DPR and has been prepared following the updated Resettlement Framework(RF).
18. **Public Consultations:** Consultations were carried out during preparation and updating of RP and will continue throughout the subproject cycle. The social team carried out preliminary consultations, through focus group discussions (FGDs) and meetings with the displaced persons (DPs) as well as the general public. FGDs were conducted with the DPs wherein policy related issues, i.e., Project impacts and compensation provision, assistance Grievances Redress Mechanism etc. were discussed.
19. **Policy Framework and Entitlements:** The policy framework and entitlements for the program are based on national laws: The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, (LARRA, 2013), and ADB’s Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009; and RF.
20. **Compensation and Income Restoration:** The implementing agency will provide compensation in accordance with the entitlement matrix of the updated RF. As a policy , displaced persons are provided 30 days advance notice and again 1 day ,advance notice to ensure minimal disruption of livelihood and compensation for lost income is provided if necessary. Compensation will be completed prior to start of civil works.
21. **Disclosure:** Goals and objectives of the project have been disclosed with the displaced persons and other stakeholders through focus group discussions and leaflet(prepared in hindi script) during census survey on dated 13.12.2014. Draft RP has already been disclosed in the Project and ADB web site and the final RP will also be disclosed in the project and ADB websites.
22. **Grievance Redress Mechanism:** Grievance of the public and particularly the DPs will be addressed through the project’s GRM. The subproject grievance will be first brought to the notice of the site engineer and focal person of the Temple Trust or Municipal Committee, which will be forwarded to the PIU. Grievances not redressed by the PIU will referred to the PMU level, who will, based on review of the grievance, address them in consultation with the PMU Community/Social Development Specialist. If the grievance remain unresolved, the Program Director, will refer the issue to the state level empowered committee (SLEC), which will act as grievance redress committee (GRC). The GRC will resolve the issue within one month from the date of registration of any case in the GRC.
23. **Executing and implementing agencies :**The executing agency is the Department of Tourism, Government of Uttarakhand and the implementing agency is the Uttarakhand Tourism Development Board (UTDB). Project Management Unit (PMU) is set up at Dehradun to coordinate the overall execution. Project Management Consultant (PMC) at Dehradun provides assistance to PMU in execution. Project Implementation Unit (PIUs) are set up in Dehradun, Bhimtal, and Kotdwar being supported by respective Design Supervision Consultant (DSC) teams. The social safeguards issues are under the purview of Community Development Officer (CDO) posted at PIU and seek guidance with regard to RP implementation from PMU Community/Social Development Specialist. The

Community/Social Development Specialists of DSC will assist PIU CDOs in RP implementation.

- 24. RP Implementation and Monitoring:** All compensation is to be paid prior to start of civil works. RP implementation will be closely monitored by PIU with an effective basis for assessing resettlement progress and identifying potential difficulties and problems. PIU, with assistance from DSC, will prepare Bi-annually progress report in terms of physical and financial indicators. In addition, the monitoring process will also look into: the communication and reactions of DPs; use of grievance procedures; information dissemination to DPs on benefits; and options and implementation time table, livelihood and living standard of DPs in pre and post-project situations. Report prepared by PIU will be compiled by the PMU on a bi-annual basis for its due submissions to ADB.

21. Resettlement Budget: The resettlement cost for the subproject in Kartikeya swami circuit is estimated at INR14876 (US\$247), which will be met from counterpart (government) funds.

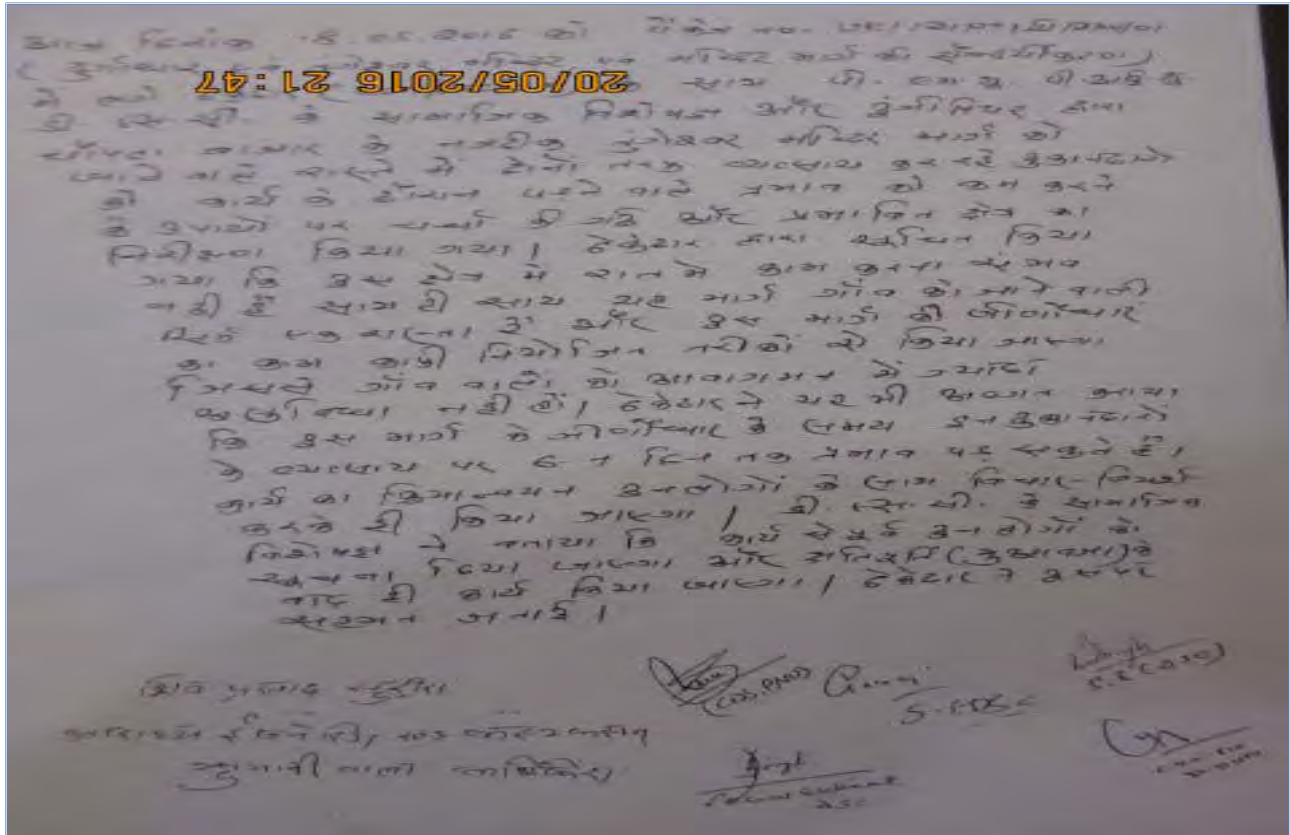

1. बैठक में कान्ट्रेक्टर M/s ग्लोबल एक्वा ट्रीटमेंट टेक्नोलाजी प्रा०लि० ने अवगत कराया कि झील में एयरेशन सुचारु रूप से हो रहा है। सभी डिस्क कार्य कर रही हैं। नियमित विद्युत आपूर्ति हेतु तीन कम्प्रेशर कक्षों में जेनेरेटर स्थापित किये जा चुके हैं।
2. कान्ट्रेक्टर ने अवगत कराया कि लैब स्थापित करने हेतु उपकरण खरीदने की प्रक्रिया जारी है और लैब शीघ्र स्थापित कर दी जायेगी। साइनेज लगाने का कार्य 15 दिन के भीतर पूर्ण कर लिया जायेगा।
3. मा० सचिव, उत्तराखण्ड पर्यटन की और से जारी पत्र (Ref. No. 3372/2-10/ADB/IDIPT/172/2015-16 dated 28-01-2016) पर चर्चा के दौरान सह-परियोजना अधिकारी डा० आशुतोष मिश्रा ने बताया कि बायोमैनिपुलेशन कार्य हेतु पन्तनगर विश्वविद्यालय से कुशल स्टाफ निर्धारित अवधि पर आता रहता है। लैब स्थापित होने तक पन्तनगर लैब से कार्य कराया जा रहा है, जिसकी त्रैमासिक रिपोर्ट पी.एम.यू. को प्रेषित की जाती है। उन्होंने कहा कि झील में जलीय गुणवत्ता में निरन्तर सुधार हो रहा है।

4. बायोमैनिफ़ोलेशन पर चर्चा के दौरान विशेषज्ञों की राय थी कि झील में महाशीर प्रजाति की मछलियों को वरीयता दी जाये। Common Carp को नियंत्रित किया जाय तथा पर्यावरण की दृष्टि से उपयोगी स्थानीय प्रजातियों को भी वरीयता दी जाये। विशेषज्ञों ने बताया कि उपयुक्त प्रजातियों का प्रथम संचय मार्च-अप्रैल माह 2016 में किया जाय।
5. उन्होंने सुझाव दिया कि झील में Nitrate, Phosphate तथा Silicate के डाटा को Recheck किये जाने की आवश्यकता है।
6. अन्य मुद्दों पर चर्चा के दौरान कान्फ़्रेक्टर द्वारा एयरेशन कार्य के रख-रखाव (Maintenance) जो के 10 मई 2015 से किया जा रहा है, उसके बिलों का शीघ्र भुगतान करने का आग्रह किया गया। इस पर पी.आई.यू. द्वारा डी.एस.सी., भीमताल को आवश्यक दस्तावेजों के साथ उक्त बिलों को प्रस्तुत करने हेतु कहा गया।
7. बैठक में तय किया गया कि अगली बैठक दो दिन की रखी जाये, जिसमें एयरेशन एवं जलीय गुणवत्ता का 24 घंटे की अवधि के दौरान आंकलन किया जाय।
8. बैठक के बाद कमेटी द्वारा झील में चल रहे एयरेशन एवं बायोमैनिफ़ोलेशन कार्यों का निरीक्षण किया गया तथा कार्य प्रगति को संतोष जनक पाया।

- 4) During discussion on biomanipulation specialist suggested to give the importance to the fishes of mahseer species. They also suggested to control the common karp and to give the importance to the local usefull species.
- 5) They suggested to recheck the data of nitrate, phosphate and silicate.
- 6) During discussion on the other issues the maintenance of the aeration work which will be starting from 10th May 2015, and are instructed to pay the bills soon. PIU said that DSC, Bhimtal have to submit the important documents along with the bills to PIU.
- 7) It was decided in the meeting the next meeting should be kept for 2 days. In which aeration and water quality will be estimated in the time period of 24 hours.
- 8) After the meeting the committee inspected the aeration and manipulation work which is going on the Lake. And the work is found satisfactory.



Uttarakhand set for rural tourism transformation

DEHRADUN: Rural tourism in Uttarakhand is set for a major transformation. The Asian Development Bank (ADB) will develop infrastructure in as many as 70 villages to promote rural tourism in hill areas of the state, officials said.

Baseline surveys for inclusion of villages under the ADB plan is over, and a report on selected villages will be presented to the state government soon. Villages under the project were selected based on their location, topographical beauty and ethnic and cultural richness, they said.

These villages will be provided all support for developing infrastructure to attract tourists for enjoying home stays and ethnic feel of hill areas, said officials of the Infrastructure Development Investment Program for Tourism (IDIPT) division of the ADB program implementation unit (PIU) in the state.

IDIPT officials said the project is expected to complete in next two years.

The ADB is a multilateral finance institution that promotes economic and social progress in the Asia-Pacific region.

According to state tourism department officials, there is a huge demand for rural tourism from across the country and outside, and Uttarakhand has large scope with its attractive rural sites.

The ADB project will include constructions of roads, ensuring regular and clean drinking water supply, managing sanitation, proper waste disposal and a host of other civic amenities.

"The main purpose is to set the stage ready for tourists in the selected villages. Apart from infrastructural facilities, the project will also support refurbishing of homes of villagers who will offer home stays. The report and list of selected villages has almost been finalised. It will be presented to the department anytime," said Seema Sharma, communication officer, IDIPT.

Sharma said the baseline surveys were conducted by NGOs empanelled with the IDIPT with points of references and parameters set by the ADB.

A list of 100 villages was provided to the NGOs, out of which 70 were selected, she added.
