

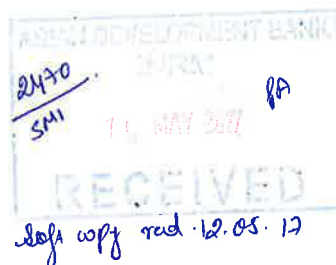

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I. Project Background and Description

- 1) The Infrastructure Development Investment Program for Tourism (IDIPT) envisages an environmentally and culturally sustainable and socially inclusive tourism development, in the project States of Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Tamil Nadu and **Uttarakhand**. The expected impact of the Project in the four states is sustainable and inclusive tourism development in priority State Tourism Sub-Circuits divided into marketable cluster destinations that exhibit enhanced protection and management of key natural and cultural heritage tourism sites, improved market connectivity, enhanced destination and site environment and tourist support infrastructure, and enhanced capacities for sustainable destination and site development with extensive participation of the private sector and local communities.
- 2) The Infrastructure Development Investment Program for Tourism (IDIPT) targets enhanced economic growth and provision of livelihood opportunities for local communities through tourism infrastructure development with a focus on preservation and development of natural and cultural heritage and incidental services. The Program supports the state of Uttarakhand to develop the tourism sector as a key driver for economic growth.
- 3) The expected impact of the Program is increased volume of domestic and international tourists to destinations within the state of Uttarakhand. The expected outcome of the Program is enhanced tourism environment in the state of Uttarakhand. The outputs of the Program are:
 - Improved basic urban infrastructure and services at tourist destinations and attractions.
 - Improved connectivity, enhanced quality of natural and cultural attractions, greater participation by local communities in tourism-related economic activities,
 - Strengthened capacity of sector agencies and local communities for planning, development, management, and marketing of tourist destinations and attractions,
- 4) The Investment Program targets enhanced economic growth and provision of livelihood opportunities for local communities through tourism infrastructure development with a focus on preservation & development of natural & cultural heritage and incidental services. There is strong interest among the domestic & international markets in CBT (Community Based Tourism) experiences and flow of CBT already exists, which could be enhanced with modest interventions, resulting in substantial additional economic activities. CBT development will, therefore, create significant flow of benefits to primary and secondary beneficiaries, which can contribute to significant poverty reduction, a more sustainable environment, and enhanced protection of the value of tourist attractions. Local community participation in the tourism value chain may include CBT activities, such as establishment of Bed & Breakfast (B&BF), as well as direct or indirect participation in the broader tourism value chain, such as employment in a hotel outside the village, production & sale of food and handicrafts to tourism enterprises.
- 5) The objective and scope of IDIPT would help the Government of Uttarakhand to achieve its targets of enhancing the performance of the tourism sector in an environmentally & culturally sustainable and socially inclusive manner. This would be reflected in: (i) an increase in the number and length of stays of tourists, (ii) more widely distributed income and benefits from tourism and (iii) enhanced management of natural and cultural heritage sites of tourism importance.

II. Implementation Arrangements:

- 6) Uttarakhand Tourism Development Board (UTDB) is the executing agency responsible for overall technical supervision and execution of all subprojects funded under the Program. The Implementing Agency is the Program Management Unit (PMU) of the ongoing Infrastructure Development Investment Programme for Tourism, Uttarakhand, which has been expanded and assigned as the PMU, to coordinate construction of subprojects and ensure consistency across the towns.

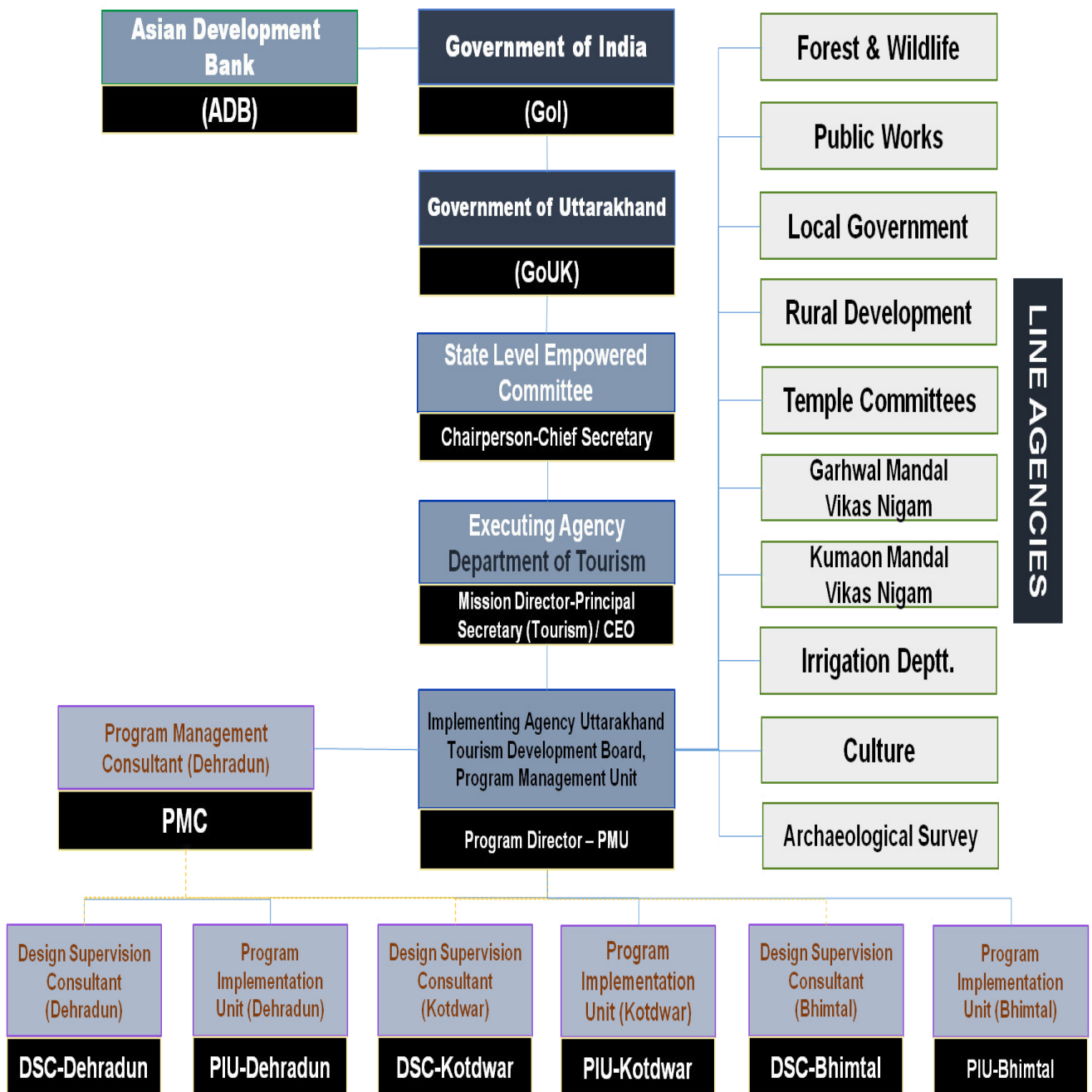


Figure 1: Project Management Chart

- 7) The PMU headed by Project Director is assisted by experienced engineering and finance officers, is responsible for project execution, implementation and management cum supervision of subprojects. Project Implementation Units (PIU) have been established in three towns respectively (Dehradun, Bhimtal and Kotdwar) for implementation of sub-projects. Project Management Consultancy (PMC), based at Dehradun, supports the overall Investment Program by providing assistance to the PMU at state-level. Besides, three Design and Supervision Consultants (DSC) based at (Dehradun, Bhimtal and Kotdwar) are providing support to the concerned PIUs for overall program implementation. Institutional diagram in this regard is provided in figure 1
- 8) To take care of all responsibilities and compliance of social safeguards (including involuntary resettlement and indigenous people), Community Development cum Safeguard Expert (CDS) has been placed at PMU and three Community Development Officers (CDO) at PIU. They are supported by Social Experts of PMC & DSCs. Following is the status of staff and consultants for social safeguards: -

III. Social Safeguard Categorization:

- 9) The project over all is categorised as “B” for involuntary resettlement and “C” for Indigenous Peoples as per the ADB’s Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS) 2009 applies to the project.

IV. Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM)

- 10) A Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) has been established following the Resettlement Frameworks (RF) of the project with the objective of receiving and facilitating the resolution of complaints & grievances by affected persons (AP). The GRM is scaled to the risks and adverse impacts of the project. It should address APs concerns and complaints promptly, using an understandable and transparent process that is gender responsive, culturally appropriate, and readily accessible to all segments of the APs at no cost and without retribution. For resolution of the grievances, three tier structure was formed in the IDIPT, Dehradun.

- (I) **Village Grievance Committee (VGC):** The VGC will include members of Self Help Groups (SHGs), Line Agencies, representative of Gram Panchayat, Special invitee etc. A time frame of two weeks has been allotted to settle the matter.

-
- (II) **Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) at PIU:** In each PIU there are one GRC, which include Project Manager (PIU), District Tourist Officer, Department of Tourism Govt. Of Uttarakhand, Community/Social Development Officer of PIU. The committee headed by Project Manager, PIU. The committee meets at least once in every month. Agenda of meeting shall be circulated to all the members and affected persons/aggrieved party along with venue, date and time; inform in writing at least 7 days in advance of meeting. The matter shall remain with GRC at PIU level for one month and if grievance is not resolved within this timeperiod, the matter shall be referred to GRC at PMU.
- (III) **GRC within Environmental and Social Management Cell (ESMC) at PMU:** There are one GRC in PMU. The matters not resolved by the GRC at PIU level within one month shall come under GRC, PMU. It will include Community/Social Development Specialist, Safeguard Specialist Environment as members and Additional Program Director (APD) PMU as Chairman. The committee shall look into the matters, which are referred to and not resolved by GRC, PIU. If the matter is not resolved by the GRC, PMU level within one month of time, the aggrieved person/party can bring the matter to the Executive Committee/State Level Empowered Committee (SLEC) of IDIPT.

Approach to GRC: Affected person/aggrieved party can approach to GRC for redress his/her grievances through any of the following modes:

- (i) **Web based:** A separate corner will be developed at the program website so that public / community/ displaced person can register their complaint in the online column.
- (ii) **Telecom based:** A toll free no. Will be issued by the PMU/ PIU so that public can register their complaint through telephone / mobile phone to the PIU/PMU office

11) PIUs, Contractor and NGO have been entrusted with the responsibility to maintain a proper register of the grievance (if any) which will be endorsed by the all agencies involved in implementation. GRC registers are in place at the towns.

12) Following Grievance Redress Committee at PMU, Dehradun level has been constituted for the registration of Grievance complaints/ suggestion /Comments/question /Feedback at of the general public on the IDIPT – UK Projects (ADB Loan No: 2833/3223 (IND) and further reviewing/recommending appropriate action on the same to the Competent authority.

13) Following Grievance Redress Committee at PIU (Dehradun Bhimtal, Kotdwar) level has been constituted for the registration of Grievance complaints/ suggestion /Comments/question /Feedback of the general public on the IDIPT – UK Projects(ADB Loan No: 2833/3223 (IND) and further reviewing/recommending appropriate actions on the same to the Competent authority.

V. Purpose of the Report

- 14) The purpose of Semi-annual Social Monitoring Report is to analyze periodically over the total implementation period of the project to comply with the approved safeguard documents.
- 15) This report covers resettlement and social safeguard monitoring results to comply with the spirit of ADB policy to 'enhance stakeholders' trust 'in and ability to engage with ADB, and thereby increase the development impact (of projects) in which disclosure of safeguard monitoring is a prominent aspect. This report covers Social Monitoring, addressing all the issues related with social safeguards, with reference to the progress achieved and current status of reporting period.
- 16) This consolidated report outlines monitoring implementation of social safeguard activities during July, 2016 to Dec, 2016 in accordance with the ADB Safeguard Policies.

VI. Status of Social Safeguards PIU wise

A. PIU DEHRADUN

17) Under Tranche -3, three sub-projects which were finalized and are under different stages of implementation. Involuntary Resettlement (IR) documents such as RP, and Due Diligence Report (DDR) have been prepared following ADB's SPS, 2009 and approved by ADB. Details of sub-projects are shown below in Table 1.

(i) Scope of Land Acquisition and Resettlement

18) In Tranche 3 projects of IDIPT Uttarakhand, there is no case of permanent land acquisition in any subproject. New construction is proposed on vacant Government land where feasible. There are no significant resettlement issues in the ongoing sub-projects under Tranche III. The minor impact was anticipated in one package (Development of Tourism Infrastructure In Kartikeya Swami Circuit (Lot-1) (Tungeshwar & Durgadhar Temple) in terms of temporary loss of livelihood on 7 shops, as the work will be in front of their shops, resulting to possibility of loss of access for 7 number of days. None of these small business structures are to be demolished. All affected persons are titleholder and belong to General Category. Provisions for compensation of temporary livelihood losses have been included in this RP in case business interruptions prove to be unavoidable. The impacts are categorized as temporary due to the loss of income limited during the construction period only. There are no indigenous people living in the subproject area having attachment to distinct habitation or territories within the subproject areas resulting in IP

category “C”. All the DPs identified are in General Category. No CPRs has been identified during SIA.

19) It is confirmed that in all the subprojects, which are covered in this report, there are no Indigenous People (IP), no land acquisition issues, and impacts are temporary in nature. The livelihood of the people will get impacted only during the construction activity for which they will be compensated as per the ADB guidelines.

(ii) Status of RP Implementation

20) Joint site visit of PMU/PIU/DSC and Project Contractor in the Tungeshwar Mandir Marg area near Chopta Market (Project Impacted Areas) was held on dated 18th May, 2016 and contractor have confirmed the IR impact on 7 roadside Vendors. Physical works not yet started. Identification and verification process of APs, preparation of identity cards and its distribution, micro plan activities have already been done and reported in the last SMR.(January -June 2016)

(iii) Summary of Consultation

21) Public consultation with primary and secondary stakeholders has been conducted in the sub-project areas to understand the local issues and public views including possible impact of the project. The issues like, handing over the site and its operation and maintenance was the main concerned. Consultations with community members of Hanol sub project and Tiger fall sub project has been done. The purpose of the consultations was to discuss about the suitable model of operation and maintenance of aforesaid project. During the consultations, local village members, representatives of local administration, NGO, DSC and PIU team members were present.

B. PIU BHIMTAL

22) Under PIU Bhimtal, total eight sub-projects were finalized initially under tranche 3. The sub-projects are under different stages of implementation. None of the sub-project have any temporary or permanent resettlement impact and are categorized as 'C' for IR and IP Details of sub-project areas in the table below:

(i) Grievance Redressal Mechanism

23) No grievance was reported under all the five sub projects during the period from the labourers/ villagers/other stakeholders' side. However, all the contractors were found maintaining the Grievance Registers at their respective construction sites.

(ii) Public Consultation at site

24) Several meetings and consultations were held with the labourers, representatives of the contractor at project site and local community during project implementation. After consultation with local peoples, stakeholders following things has been found:

-
- All the environmental and social safeguards monitoring reports were prepared after having extensive consultations with the stakeholders including PIU, contractor, labourers and the District Administrations under Tranche III.
 - The grievances redressal committees were already constituted at PIU and PMU levels for Redressal of the complaints and Grievances of the public.
 - Local labourers were given priority during the construction activities, thus, creating livelihood opportunities for the local areas in the project area.
 - Training Programmes regarding capacity building of the concerned persons including labourers etc were organized regularly by the social and environmental Safeguards experts during their visits to the project sites.

25) It is concluded that all the stakeholders were satisfied with the quality of the activities and process adopted for completion of different activities under the sub project. All concerns were of the opinion that they will resolve the issues if any, after having joint meetings at respective places in the interest of work of quality.

C. PIU KOTDWAR

26) PIU Kotdwar is responsible for implementation of 2 nos of package under tranche 3. Another package namely UK/IDIPT-III/KOT/03 Development of Rural Tourism Infrastructure in Pauri and Tehri District, Uttarakhand is presently under evaluation.

(i) Project Impact and Implementation of RP

27) Under Tranche 3 sub-project-, no land acquisition and no permanent impact including any impact on the IPs were entailed. **Under tranche 3 one subproject, (UK/IDIPT- III/KOT/01)-** Creation of Pedestrian Route for Pilgrims and Tourists in Haridwar, the RP was approved in January 2015. For this package the verification survey and preparation of Micro-Plan is completed during the reporting period. The disbursement of compensation had been given to verified APs. The Id-cum entitlement cards were also distributed to eligible APs. The details regarding implementation along with the documentary evidence have been included in the SMR for reporting period January June 2016.

(ii) Grievance Redressal Mechanism

28) No grievance was reported under all the five sub projects during the period from the labourers/ villagers/other stakeholders' side. However, all the contractors were found maintaining the Grievance Registers at their respective construction sites.

(iii) Public Consultation at site

Several meetings and consultations were held with the laborers, representatives of the contractor at project site and local community during project implementation.

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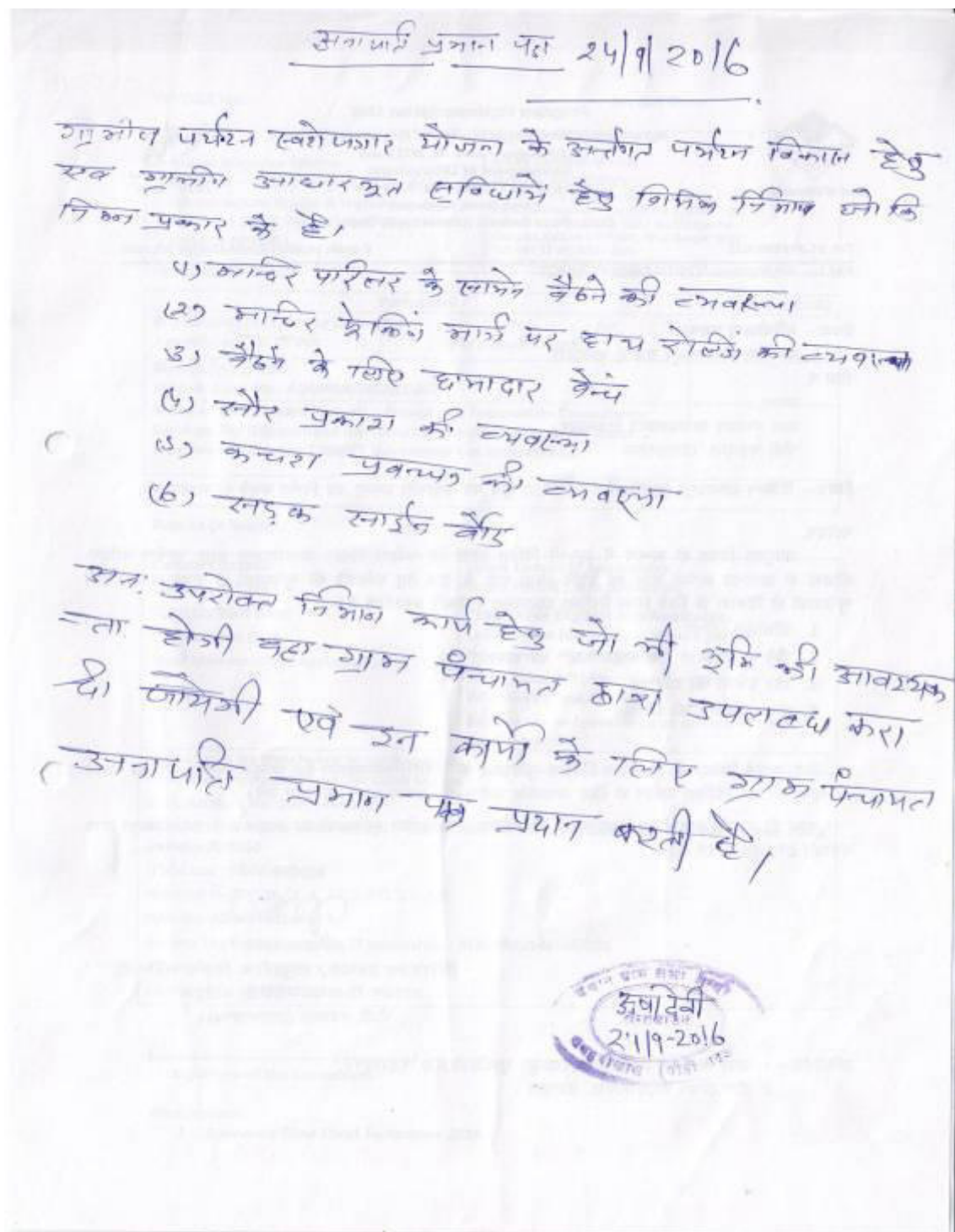






