### 2. Project Objectives

To support: (i) the transformation of the public service so that it is affordable, efficient and accountable for the use of public resources; and (ii) improvement in the policy and regulatory environment for sustainable growth and service delivery.

### 3. Project Description

UPSPEP comprises two components. The first one supports the implementation of the government's public service reform program (PSRP) through a sector-wide approach program (SWAp). The second component fosters performance enhancement initiatives on a demand-driven basis supported by a performance enhancement fund (PEF). Key areas to be supported by the latter would include but not be limited to procurement, financial sector and statistics.

# 4. Project Location and salient physical characteristics relevant to the safeguard analysis

The Project will be implemented by the Ministry of Public Service. Under Component 1 sub component 4, the Government will construct through the use of a construction firm a National Records and Archives Centre. The site for this National Records and Archives

Centre has been identified and a site specific Environmental Impact Assessment(EIA) has been prepared and disclosed both to Government and the World Bank. The World Bank through ASPEN and the Government through the national environmental management authority(NEMA) have approved the site specific EIA. This will be implemented by the construction firm under the supervision of NEMA and the World Bank. In addition a total of 7 house holds at the site will have to be re-located. To support this process an abbreviated Resettlement Action Plan has been prepared and submitted to the Government and the World Bank for comments. This will be reviewed, approved and disclosed in the country and at the Info shop. Recommendations there in will be implemented prior to commencement of construction.

Identify and describe any potential large scale, significant and/or irreversible impacts: The construction of a National Records and Archives Centre will lead to minor road diversions, noise and dust polution and this is be mitigated by measures described in the site specific EIA which has been specifically prepared by Government and reviewed and approved by the World Bank's Safeguard Unit and Government's National Environmental Managament Authority. This has been disclosed in the country and at the World Bank's Infoshop in Washington.

4. Describe measures taken by the borrower to address safeguard policy issues. Provide an assessment of borrower capacity to plan and implement the measures described. To support the construction of a National Record and Archives centre under the project the Government has through the Ministry of Public Service developed the site specific Environmental Impact Assesment(EIA)with very clear recomendations on how exactly to mitigate these impacts. The site specific EIA has been reviewed, commented on and approved by the Bank and the Borrower and disclosed in country and at the Bank's Info shop.

Some seven households will be affected by the development activity, the Bank's safeguard policy on Involuntary Ressettlement OP 4.12 has been triggered and as such an Abbreviated Ressettlement Action Plan has been prepared by the Borrower, and submitted to the Bank and Government. This will be reviewed and approved by the Bank and will be disclosed both in the infoshop and the Government.

The borrower has taken thew initiative to further disseminate the EIA to all regulatory agencies in the City of Kampala where construction is to take Place to ensure appreciation and monitoring of mitigation factors proposed. In addition the EIA notice of availability of the EIA has been placed in the key news papers and location of access highlighted.

5. Identify the key stakeholders and describe the mechanisms for consultation and disclosure on safeguard policies, with an emphasis on potentially affected people. Key stakehoders include Ministry of Public Service and the members of the seven households.

The affected families under the 7 households have been consulted prior to the preparation of the RAP and duly informed of proposed activities as well as the measures to be taken to minimize the potential negative impacts. A joint Mission by the Bank's project team and the Borrower carried out the consultation in accordance with the policy requirements. A provision has been made within the abbreviated RAP to allow for the affected 7 households to seek redress to the Uganda law where grievances arise. Other key stakeholders include the Government of Uganda, which through the NEMA has approved the site specific EIA and the abbreviated RAP.
