2. Project Development Objective(s)

The project development objective is to improve the quality of life of vulnerable youth by increasing the provision of services to young people, by increasing the participation of youth in decision-making related to these services, and by empowering local NGOs/service providers and communities.

3. Project Description

The project development objective is to improve the quality of life of vulnerable youth by increasing the provision of services to young people, by increasing the participation of youth in decision-making related to these services, and by empowering local NGOs/service providers and communities.

The project has three components:

Component 1: Capacity-Building for Civil Society Partners serving Youth. Under this component, the Project will enhance the capacity of Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) and Community-Based Organizations

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(CBOs) to provide services to youth through workshops and other learning events and exchanges.

Component 2: Support for Youth Empowerment. This component will provide small sub-grants to CBOs and Service providers to empower youth and to improve the lives of vulnerable young people through civic participation, youth development, positive behavioral-change activities, improved social services and support to employability.

Component 3: Project Management, Monitoring and Evaluation and Knowledge Dissemination. This component covers project management, including (i) setting up project implementation arrangements, (ii) supporting continuous monitoring, (iii) participatory evaluations, (iv) knowledge sharing, and (v) a final evaluation report with lessons learned, best practices and guidance related to scaling-up this approach in Jordan. The Ministry of Youth will establish a project management unit (PMU) to implement, manage, and coordinate the project activities. The PMU will be responsible for identifying experienced civil society partners to assist in the implementation of activities under Component 1 and 2. The project will involve direct collaboration between the government, civil society and community members, including the poorest and most vulnerable.

4. Project location and Salient physical characteristics relevant to the safeguard analysis (if known)

The Project area covers East Amman and part of Ahgwar area. East Amman and the Ahgwar area, which cuts across several governorates, are amongst the poorest and least developed areas of Jordan, with significant infrastructure and service deficits. Communities in the Project area suffer from the highest poverty rates, while also being home to a large number of less educated and disadvantaged youth. No Safeguard analysis is required.
