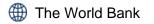

Implementation Status Overview

SEQAP implementation continues to be moderately satisfactory in its fifth year. About US\$90 million has been disbursed out of a total of \$133 million, which means that SEQAP is close to being in line with its ordinal disbursement projections. However, a significant share of the disbursed amount (roughly \$30 million) is funding that has been advanced to provinces and districts and has not yet been spent. Provinces and districts continue to experience delays in spending and in reporting on expenditures. It is, therefore, unlikely that the IDA credit will be fully disbursed before the December 31, 2015 closing date. A one year extension is likely to be requested in order to allow for full disbursement and for full

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accounting of 'on-budget' funding which has been transferred to provinces and districts.

Despite a complex implementation approach which has resulted in delays, physical implementation is moderately satisfactory in the project's fifth year. Project funding has, to date, built and brought into use 1,695 classrooms, 1,087 toilet facilities and 154 multi-functional rooms, against end of project targets of 1,875 classrooms, 1218 toilet facilities, and 193 multi-purpose rooms. The amount of school grants funding for the 1,628 SEQAP schools (about 11% of all primary schools in Vietnam) has nearly doubled over the past year in order to permit schools to increase funding for lunches (a key element of full day schooling), engage and pay higher salaries to language teaching assistants and invest more funding in school libraries and materials. Teachers and school managers are also being trained at the district and school levels in line with training plans, although information on the actual number of trainees and quality of training remains lacking.

While physical implementation is proceeding in terms of project outputs (schools built, teachers trained, etc) and the project development objective remains valid, the Ministry of Education and Training (MoET) continues to have difficulty monitoring the impact of SEQAP interventions and reporting effectively and in a timely manner on the progress of full day schooling reforms. The reporting of administrative data and the use of that data to monitor progress and inform policy decisions continues to be weak. At the same time, analytical work and surveys being carried out under project funding -- aimed at tracking SEQAP progress and impact -- are generally, with some exceptions, of low quality and in little demand by decision makers in the ministry. This does not mean SEQAP is failing to meet its objective of expanding full day schooling; but it does mean that MoET cannot, to date, effectively monitor the impact of its full day schooling reform. SEQAP has not yet been successful as a vehicle for building the ministry's capacity for monitoring and evaluation, which is a prerequisite for monitoring the progress of full day schooling reforms.

We will focus on three priorities for SEQAP in its final two years of implementation: (1) building the MoET's capacity to undertake and consume policy analysis and M&E information (including standardized student assessment), (2) learning lessons from the SEQAP experience to be applied to the next phase of the full day schooling reform (2016-2020), and (3) completing physical implementation, including making sure the project is fully disbursed. Bright spots going forward include some evidence that MoET's own management information system (EQMS) is improving, some indication that MoET is developing sustainable capacity to assess student learning outcomes, and a new willingness to target the school grants funding on those who need it most, such as disadvantaged or minority populations.

A proposal for a minor restructuring and amendment of the Financing Agreement has been submitted by MoET to the State Bank of Vietnam (SBV). The major element of the restructuring is the adoption of a revised Results Matrix which will allow MoET to effectively monitor the achievement of the project's original objectives. The restructuring also includes a reallocation of project funding across expenditure categories which serves to focus project activities on the project's core activities (school construction, teacher training, school grants and policy analysis). Once SBV approves the restructuring, we will proceed with the restructuring request within the Bank and then with an amendment to the Financing Agreement.

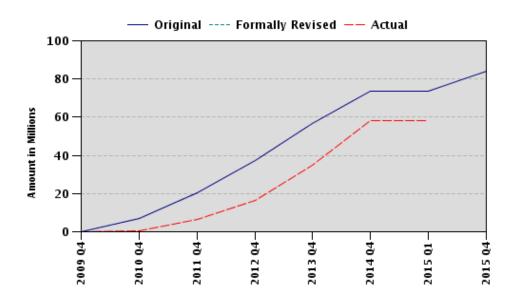

Key Decisions Regarding Implementation

The following decisions were made at the Joint Review Mission in May 2014.

- MOET will follow up with the State Bank of Vietnam on approval of the proposed amendment to the financing agreement (project restructuring) which has been outstanding for approximately 8 months (physical implementation has not so far been delayed).

- A slightly revised results matrix was approved at the 8th Joint Review Mission and will be confirmed when the amendment (project restructuring) is signed.

- The Bank has agree to allow some share of currently unallocated funding to be allocated to additional civil works in 2014-2015 providing MoET commits to target this funding on disadvantaged populations.
