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A. Summary of Proposed Changes

The proposed restructuring is to extend the closing date of Grant No. TF0A0198 by 6 months to June 30, 2017. This is the first extension of the project and is in response to a Government request letter dated November 1, 2016. The request was for a one year extension, but the closing date for the main trust fund in September 2017 precludes a one year extension. The closing date extension does not entail any change in the scope or nature of projects activities, change in implementation arrangements, or any other amendment to the Grant Agreement. There are no changes to the PDO nor to the Results Framework. The PDO is to improve governance of the education sector through the establishment of an accountability and quality assurance mechanism that will incentivize stakeholders in the system to improve learning in Jordan's public schools. The performance of the Borrower is moderately unsatisfactory due to low disbursements that are expected to increase in the first quarter of 2017. The Bank and the Recipient have agreed on actions that will be undertaken by the Recipient to complete the project. There are no outstanding audits for the grant.

B. Project Status

The project has achieved important results since the grant agreement was signed on June 23, 2015, including the legal establishment of the Education Quality and Accountability Unit, the development of accountability standards, the continuing process of developing robust and reliable assessment and reporting procedures, the implementation of a system for training assessors, training 56 assessors, the appointment of a Chief Assessor and Head of the Unit, progress on the administrative infrastructure of the Unit, the commencement of the English language training, and finally, the production of the first draft of the Education Quality and Accountability Manual covering all aspects of the key areas of functioning of the

Unit. The project objectives continue to be achievable. Despite progress on technical and capacity building components, the overall pace of disbursements has been slower than originally anticipated due to several factors: 1) the absence of a full-time head for the Unit between February and August 2016, and 2) lengthy internal procurement processes at the Ministry of Education, and 3) the absence of an experienced financial officer at the Development Coordination Unit (DCU). One major bottleneck concerning the new Unit's leadership has been cleared with the August 2016 appointment of a full-time head for the Unit. Other issues related to procurement processes and disbursements are being addressed through close implementation support. Commitments as of December 2016 were 53% and are expected to increase.

Project Progress by Component:

Component 1: Establishment of the Education Quality and Accountability Unit (EQAU)

The goal of this component is to support the establishment of the EQAU, including through the acquisition of goods such as office equipment and information technology hardware and software. Legislation establishing the EQAU was approved by the Cabinet in December 2015, ensuring the sustainability of the Unit's function as part of the Ministry's structure. The EQAU has been allocated adequate office space within the Ministry, and technological equipment, furniture, and vehicles necessary for its normal functioning are at various stages in the procurement process. The procurement process in general was delayed due to lengthy internal processes at the Ministry of Education that may have occurred due to unclear specifications or unnecessary retendering of bids. The Bank team has worked closely with the DCU on reviewing the procurement plan to ensure that future delays are avoided. The pace of the procurement of goods is expected to increase.

Component 2: Capacity Building for the EQAU

Central to the project strategy was the goal of building the capacity within the Unit to develop as a learning organization in its own right. There are indications that this strategy is beginning to bear fruit. The Unit can now recruit and train its own assessors to international standards without necessary recourse to external support. This should be recognized as a major achievement. The number of trained and appointed Assessors continues.

- Cohort 1 resulted in an initial appointment of 13 assessors.
- Cohort 2 resulted in another 13 assessors.
- Cohort 3 is presently in training and is expected to make around 30 successful appointments.

This pace result in approximately 56 Assessors trained and appointed to the Unit by the end of 2016, or 70 percent of the target of 80 assessors. The appointed assessors are already engaged in the process of school assessment and producing school reports. The first batch of school reports have been positively received by the Minister. The project is likely to exceed its target if the current pace of capacity building continues.

Component 3: Knowledge Exchange

The goal of the knowledge exchange is to allow the assessors to establish links with and learn from similar international bodies, with the expectation that this exposure and knowledge will be shared internally within the EQAU. The EQAU has made connections with SICI, the Standing International Conference of National and Regional Inspectorates of Education, and although membership in this organization is limited to inspectorates in Europe, the Jordanian delegation will attend two SICI workshops in March and May 2017. In addition, links have also been made with the Dubai School Inspection Bureau (DSIB), and a learning

exchange in Dubai is being planned for May 2017. Selected participants are expected to produce results stories and to share their experience with the wider team.

Component 4: Communications for Advocacy and Awareness

The goal of this component is to carry out a program of activities to build stakeholders' awareness of the EQAU and its goals through various communications approaches, including high-level meetings and workshops for Ministry of Education staff at the center and in the regional offices and for the general public. The EQAU has developed an operational plan for their communications strategy. Some elements of the plan have already been implemented, such as the production and distribution of an informational notice sent to all Field Directorates. Other activities, such as the development of a website, have been partially completed. Pending activities include convening regional meetings at the field directorate level, publishing school reports, and formally launching the EQAU.


Cohort 4 training to commence in January 2017. Final selection of assessors to be completed by March 2017.

Communications activities will take place through January - June 2017.




