## ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- The Republic of Tajikistan (the Recipient) is implementing the Strengthening Resilience of the Agriculture Sector in Tajikistan (the Project) through the Ministry of Agriculture (MOA) with the involvement of the Ministry of Finance and supported by the State Institution Agriculture Entrepreneurship Development Project Management Unit under the Ministry of Agriculture of the Republic of Tajikistan (AED PMU), as set out in the Financing Agreement. The International Development Association (the Association) has agreed to provide financing for the Project, including Additional Financing, as set out in the referred agreement.
- 2. The Recipient shall ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) and this Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP), in a manner acceptable to the Association. The ESCP is part of the Financing Agreement. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the referred agreement.
- 3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the Recipient shall carry out or cause to be carried out, including, as applicable, the timeframes of the actions and measures, institutional, staffing, training, monitoring, and reporting arrangements, grievance management, and the environmental and social (E&S) instruments to be prepared or updated, consulted, adopted, disclosed, and implemented in accordance with the ESSs. Once adopted, said E&S instruments may be revised from time to time with prior written agreement with the Association.
- 4. As agreed by the Association and the Recipient, this ESCP will be revised from time to time if necessary, during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, the Recipient through the Ministry of Agriculture and the Association agree to update the ESCP to reflect these changes through an exchange of letters signed between the Association and the Recipient's Minister of Agriculture. The Recipient shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
